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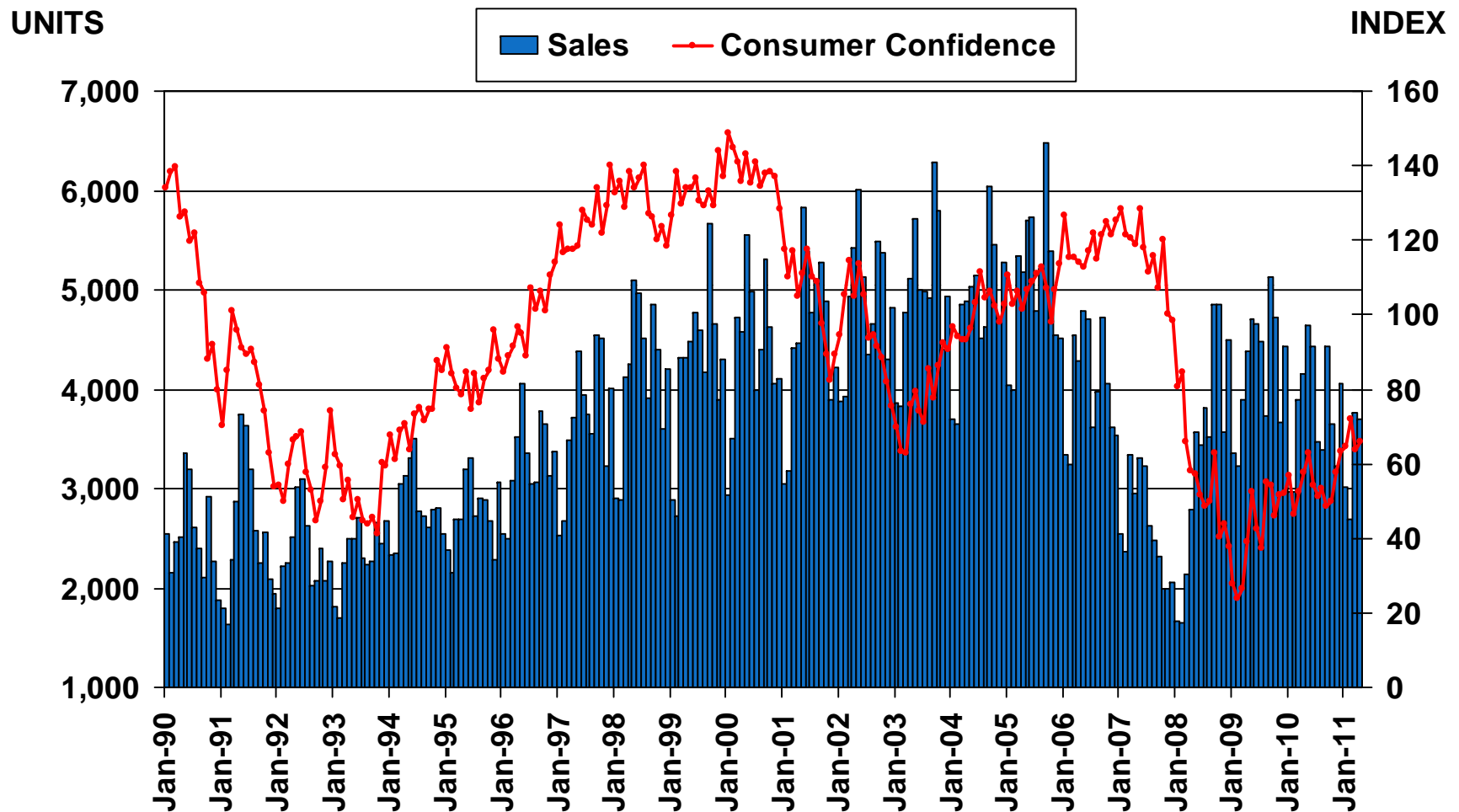

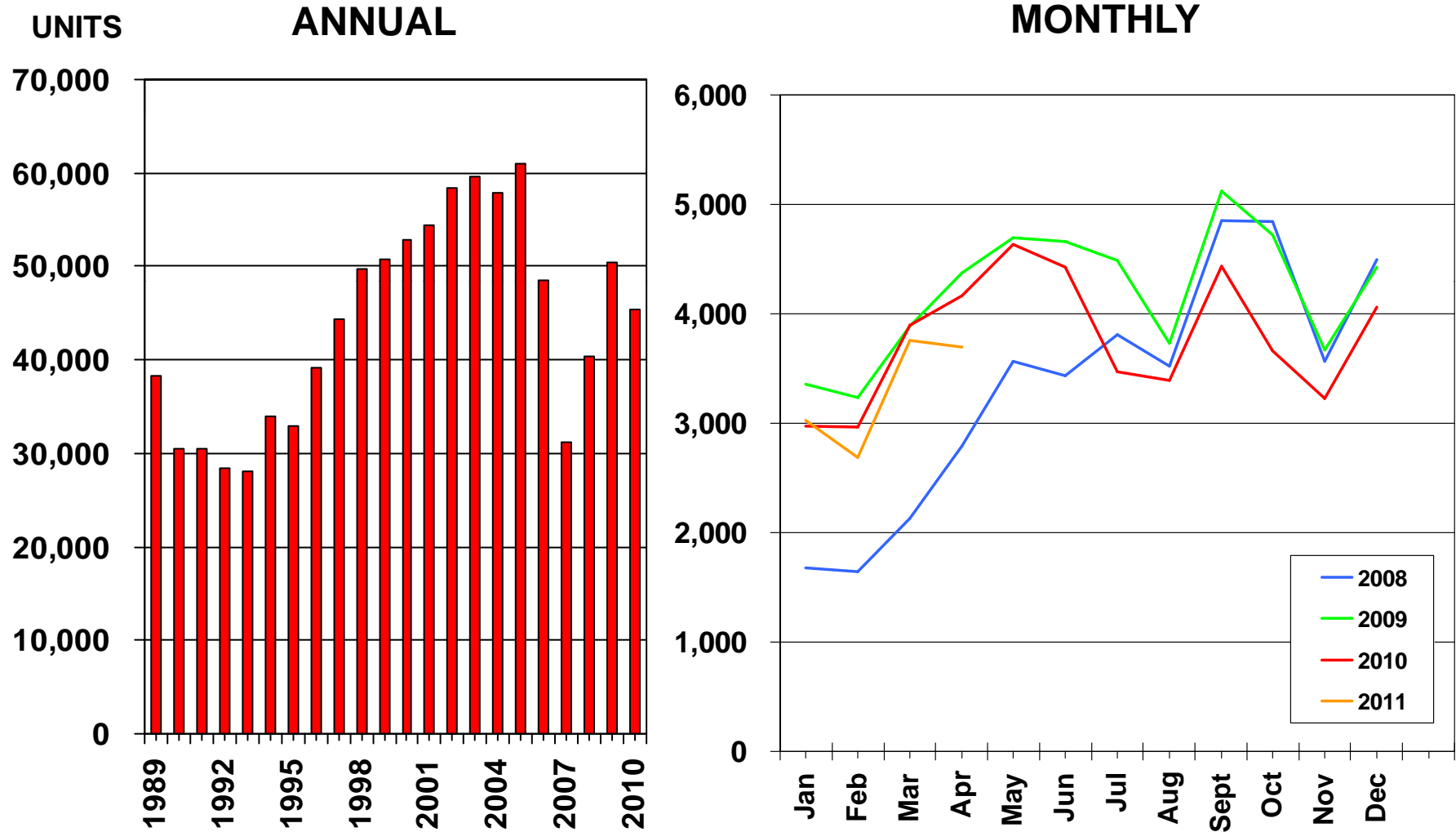
Los Angeles County, April 2011 Sales: 3,698 Units, Down 6.0% YTD, Down 11.1% YTY

# Sales of Existing Detached Homes

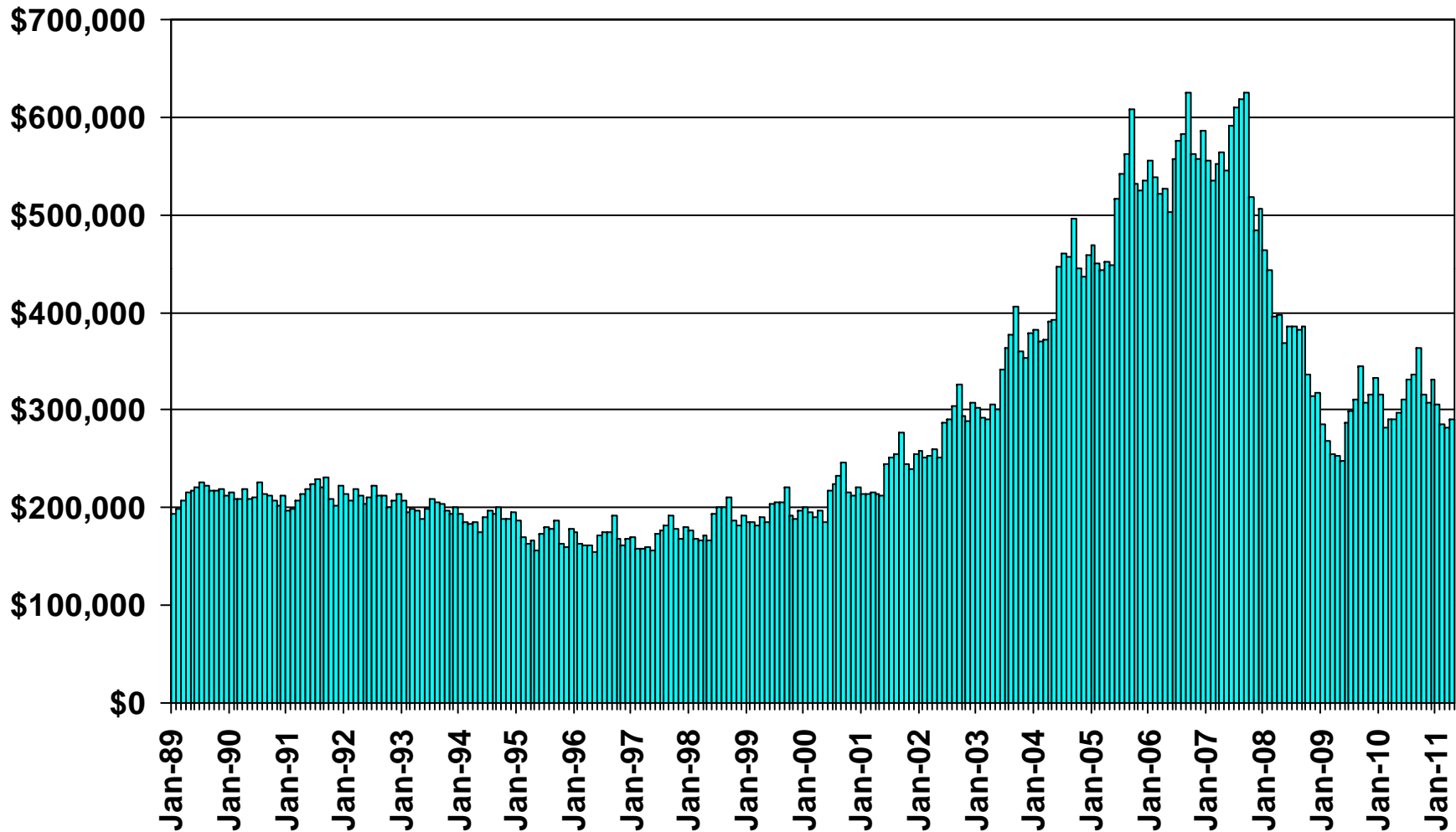
Los Angeles County, 2010: 45,328 Units, Down 10.0% YTY

# Median Price of Existing Detached Homes

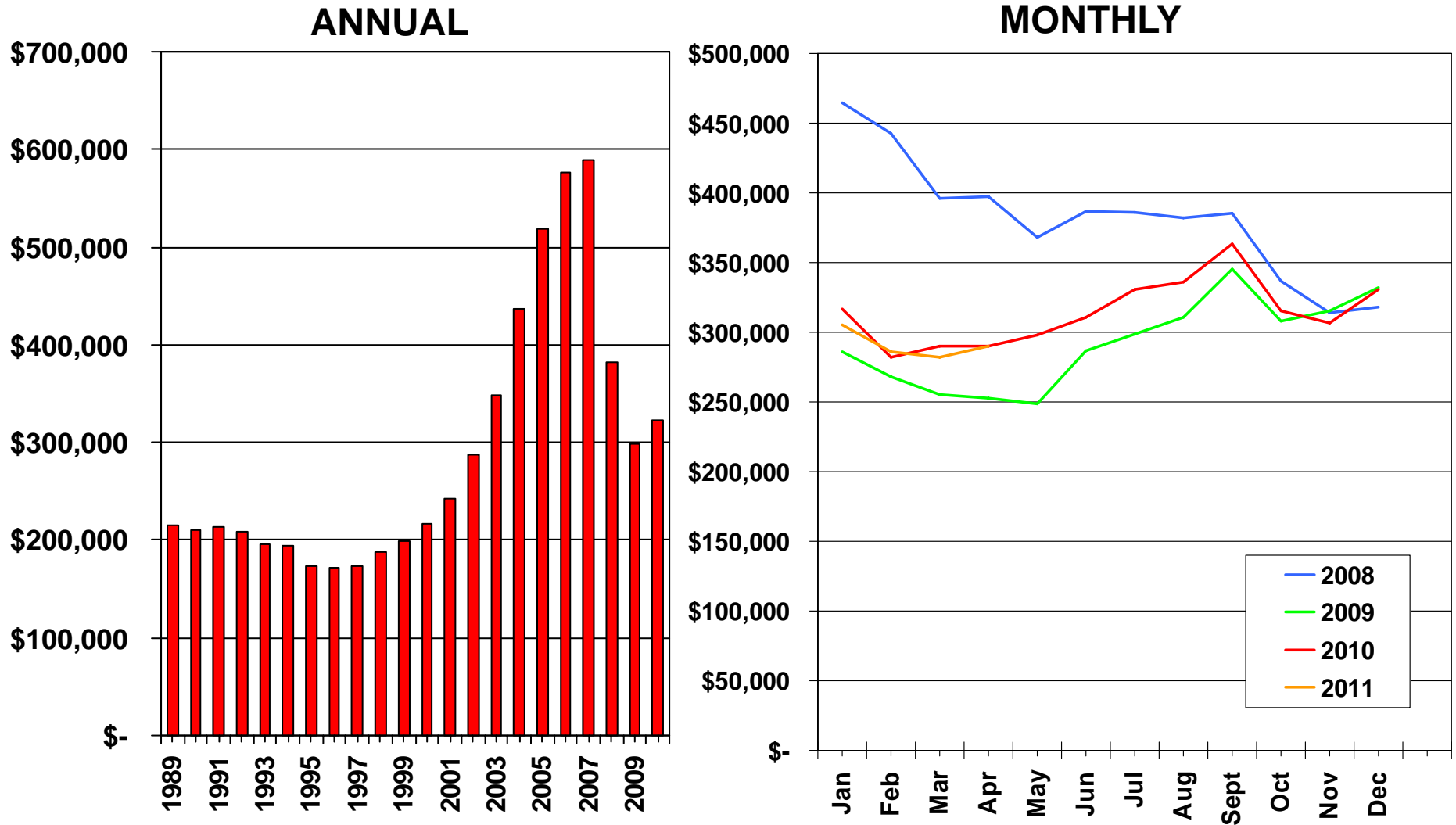
Los Angeles County, April 2011: \$290,120, Up 0.1% YTY

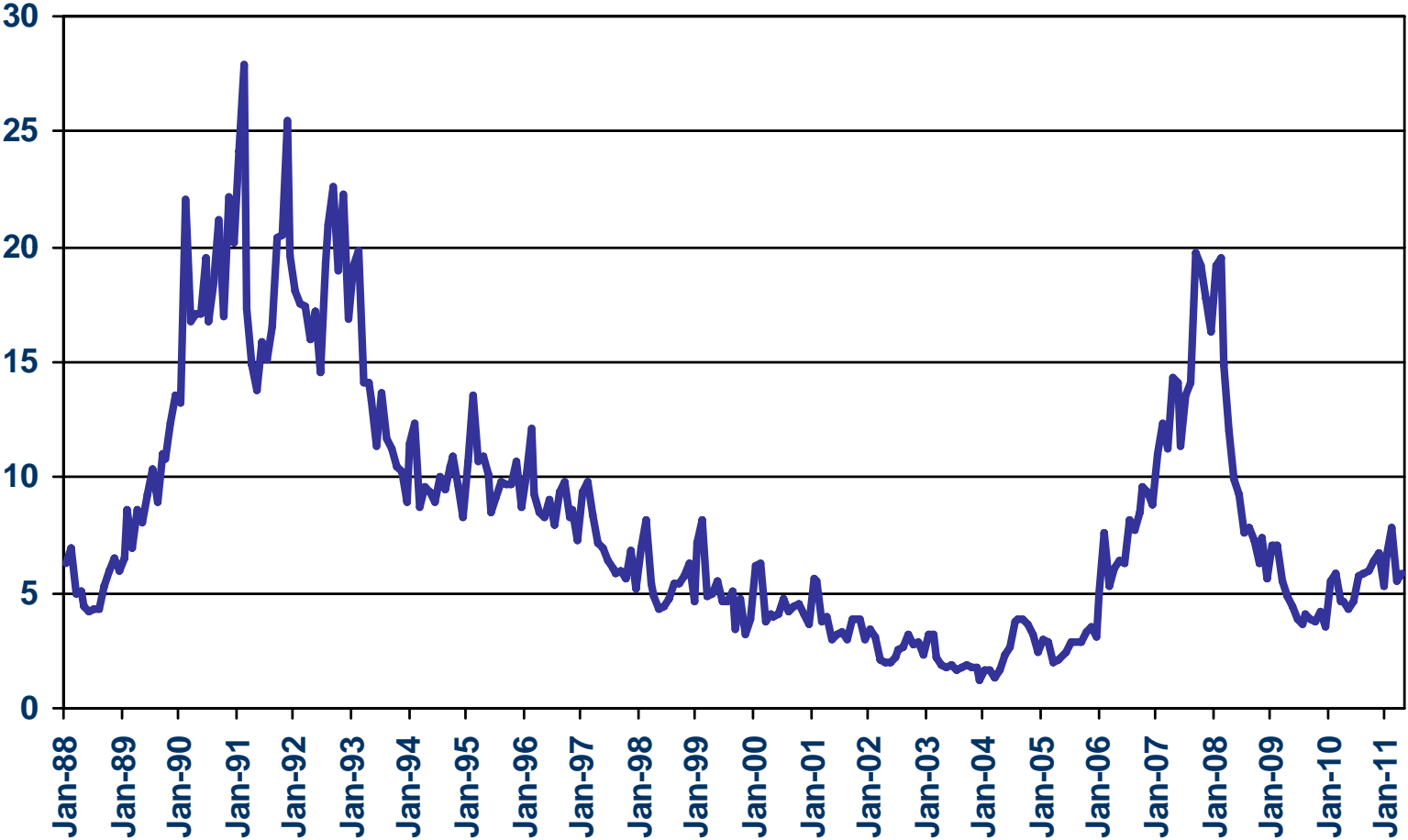

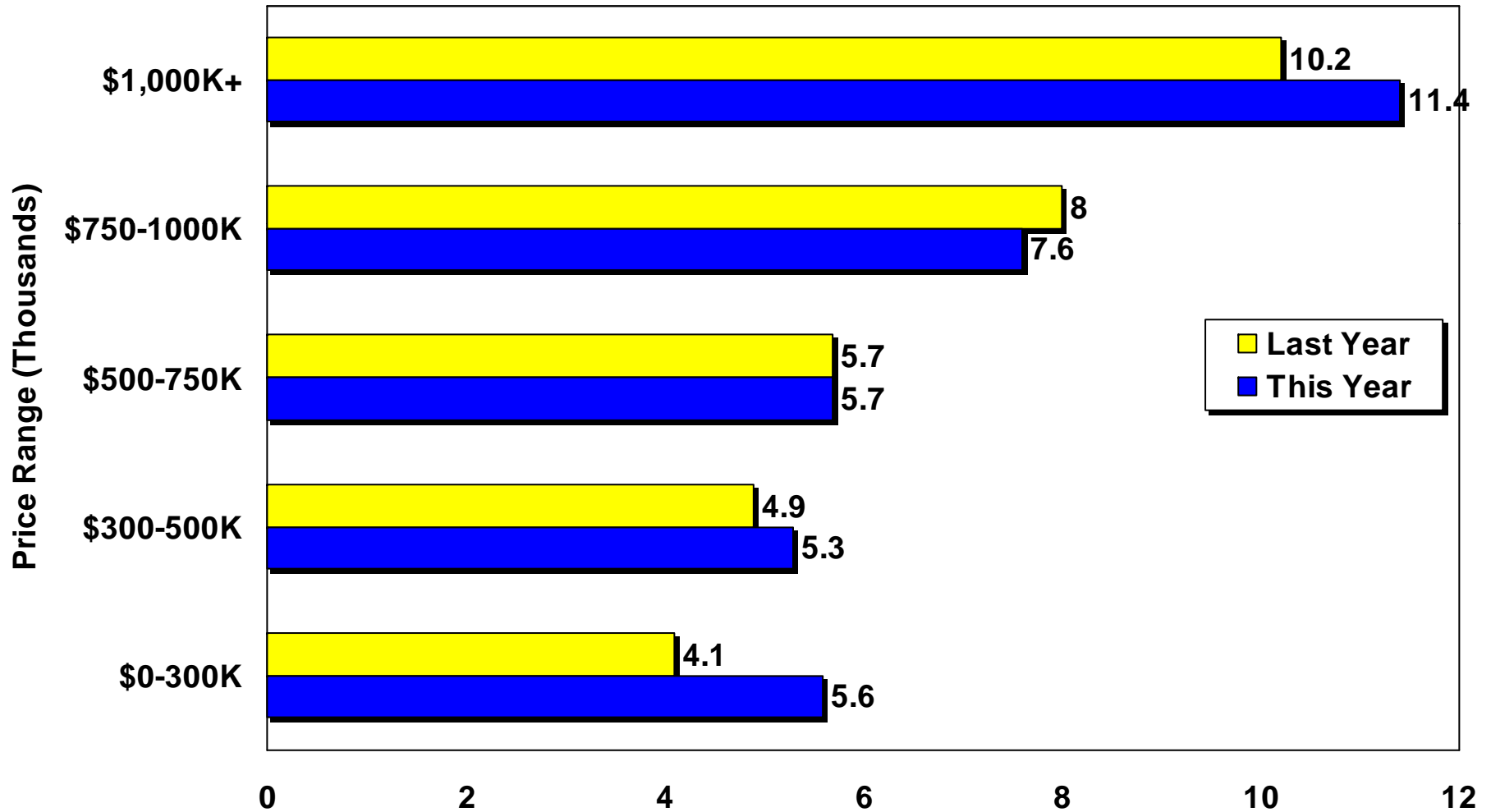

Los Angeles Existing Homes April 2010 vs. April 2011

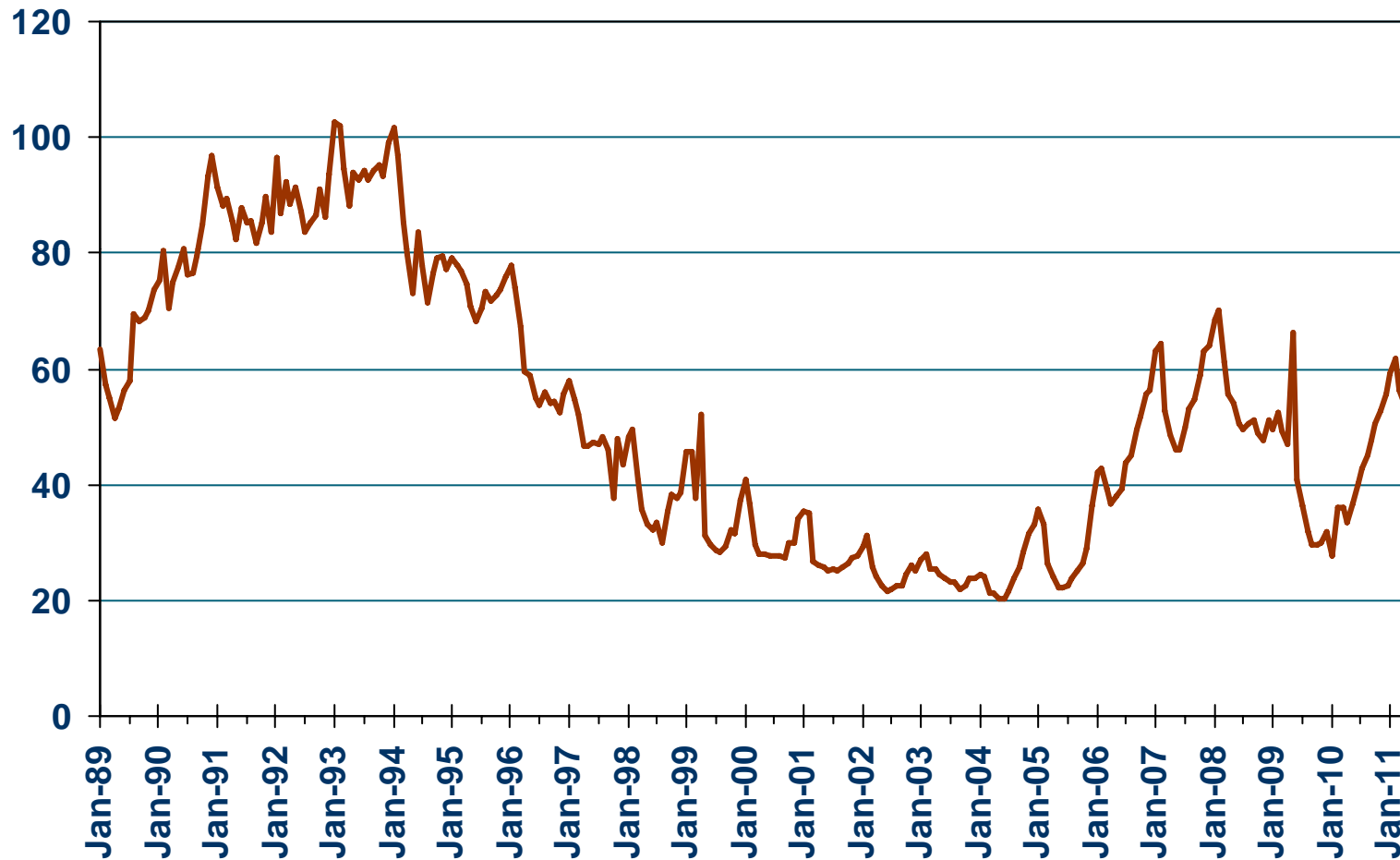

# Median Time on the Market

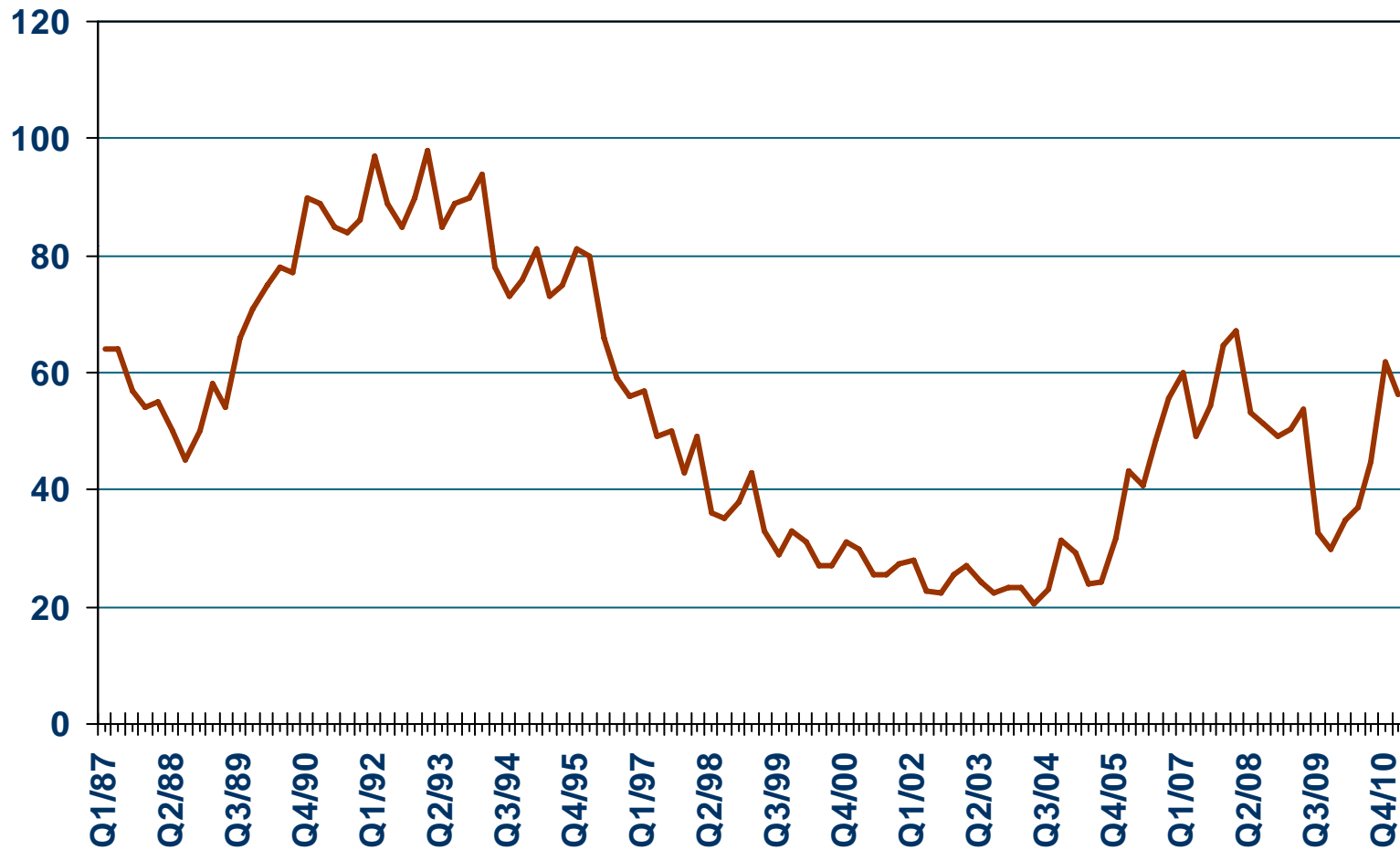
Single-Family Homes – Los Angeles County, April 2011: 53.7 Days

Single-Family Homes – Los Angeles County, 2011 Q1: 56.4Days

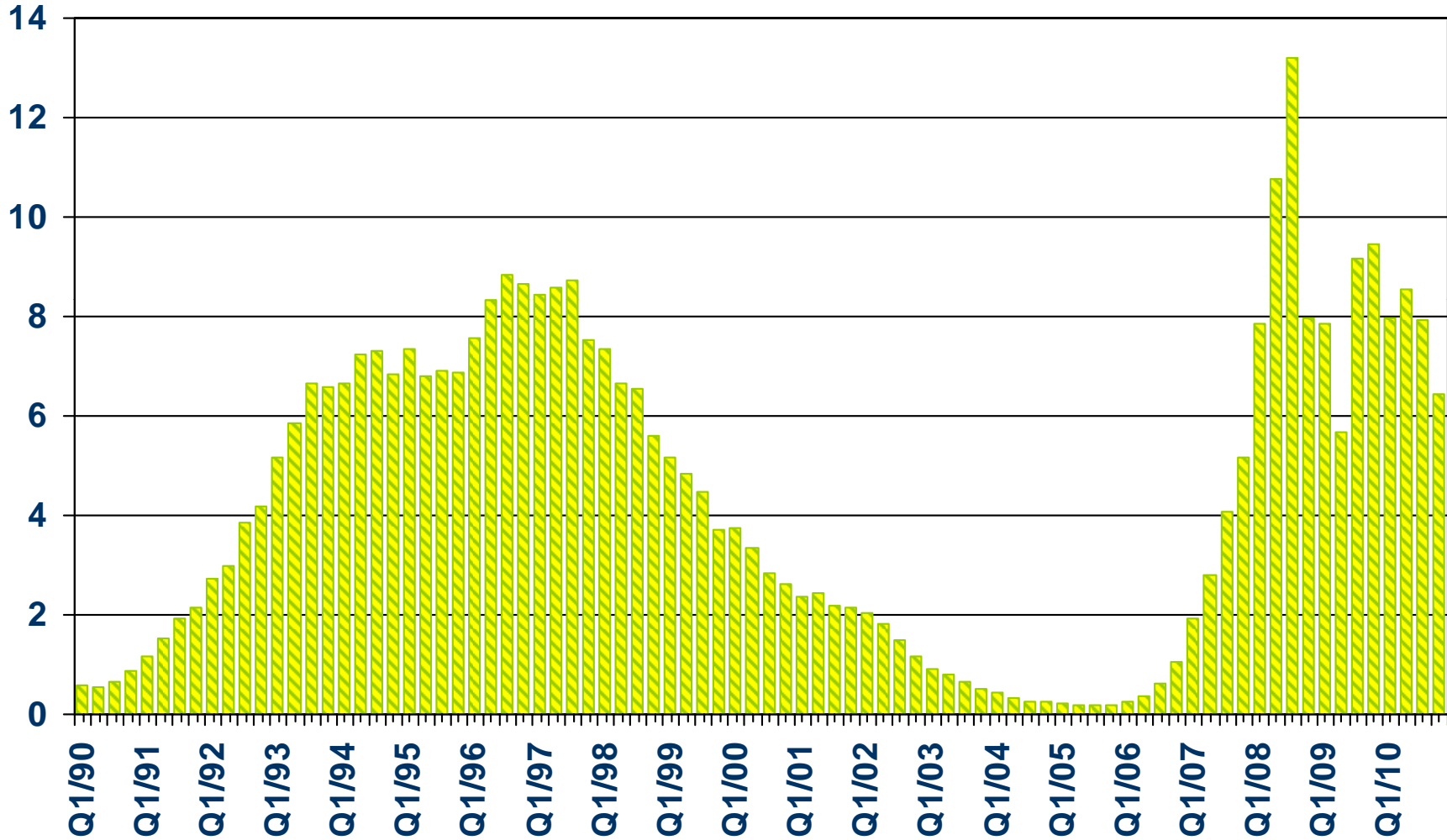

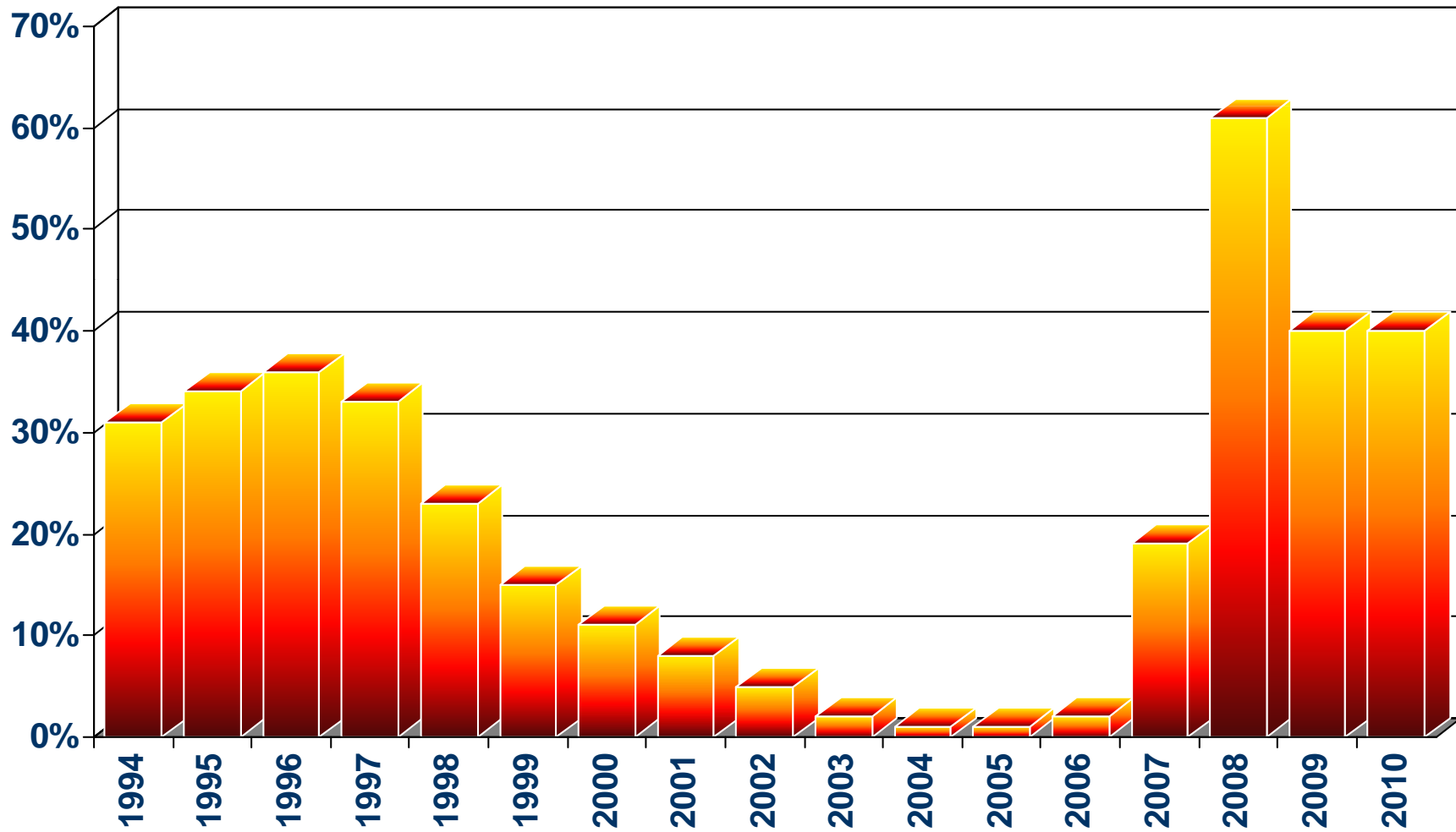

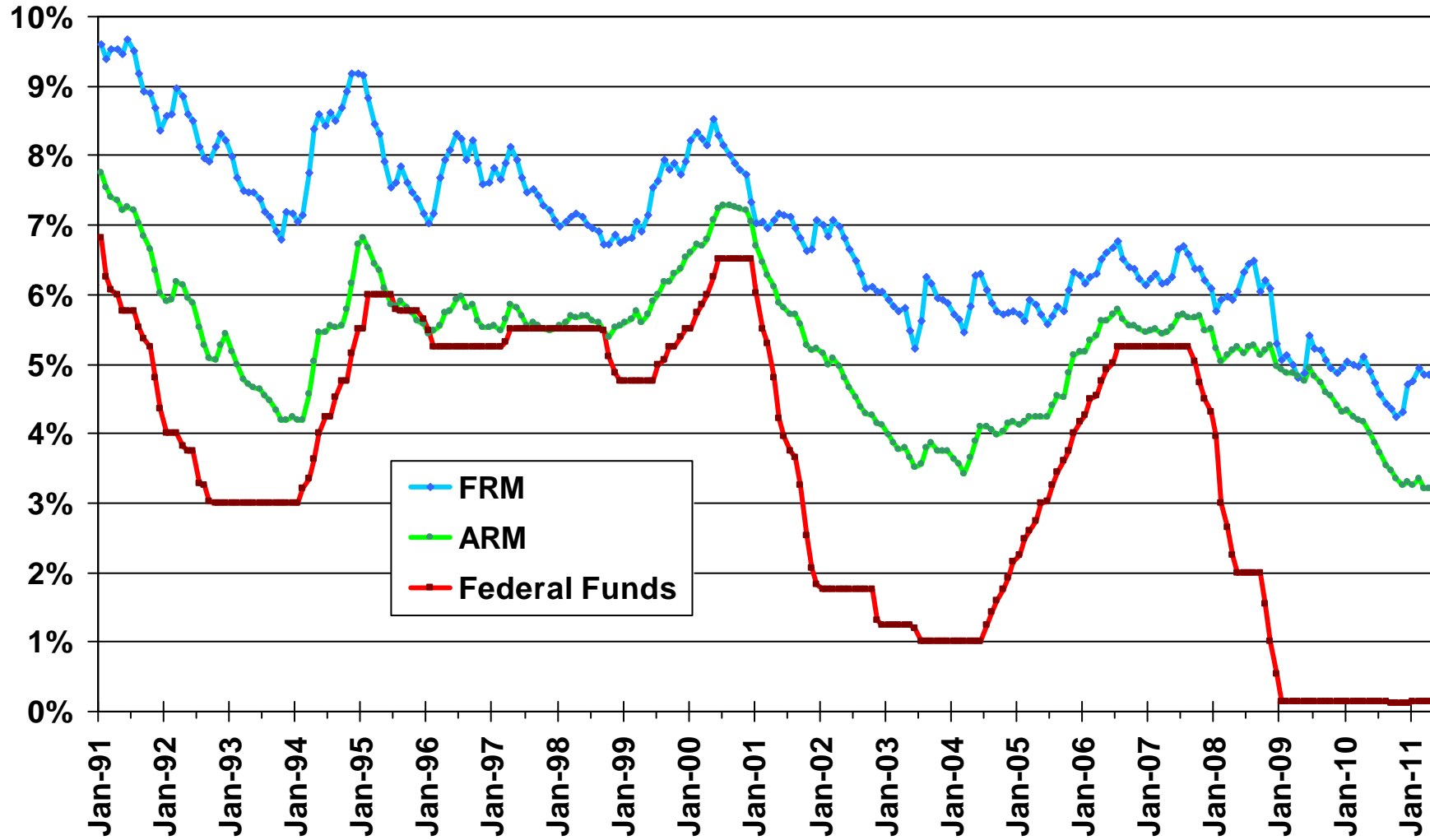
# Ratio of Foreclosures to Home Sales

# Mortgage Rates

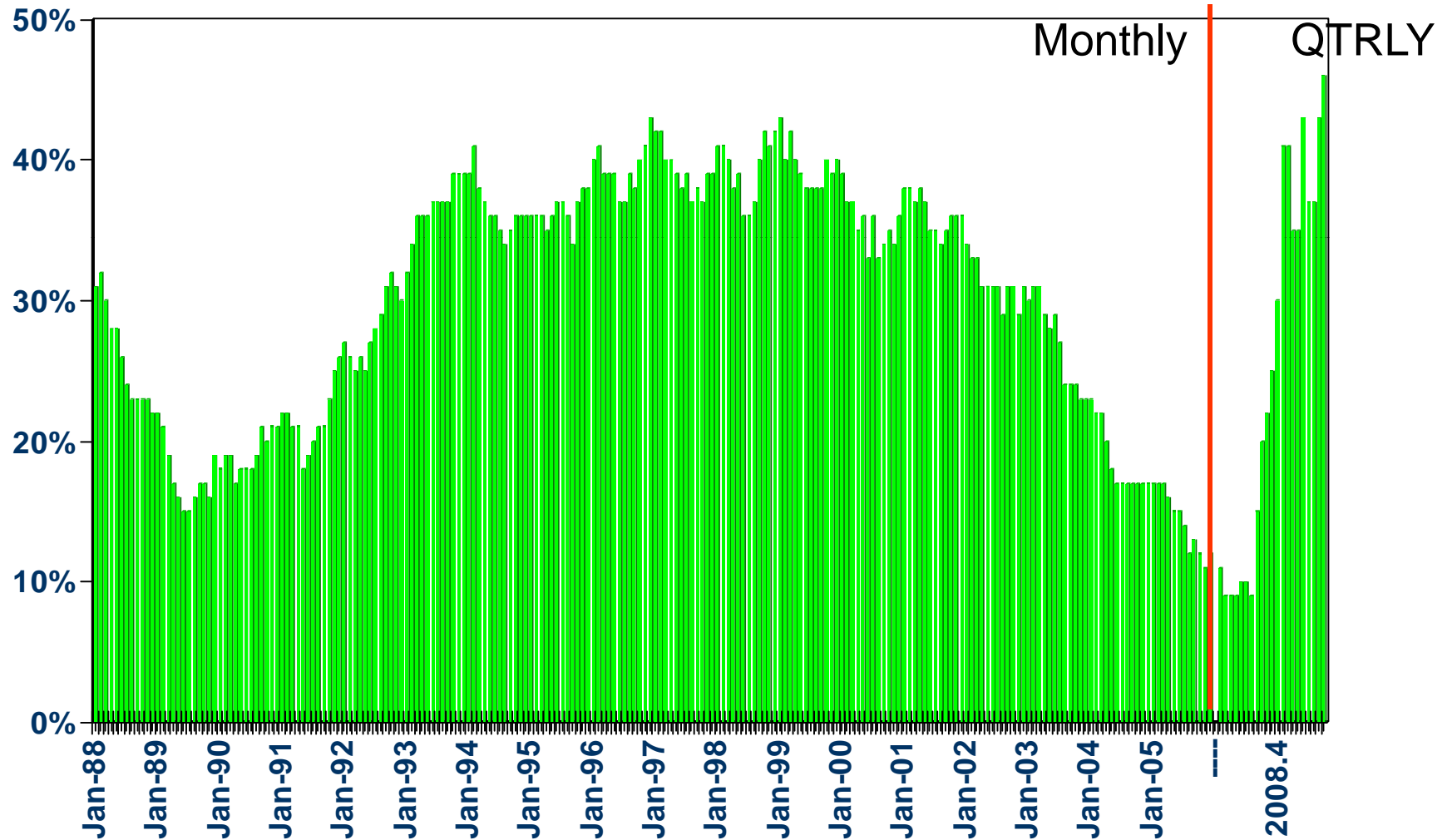

% OF HOUSEHOLDS THAT CAN BUY

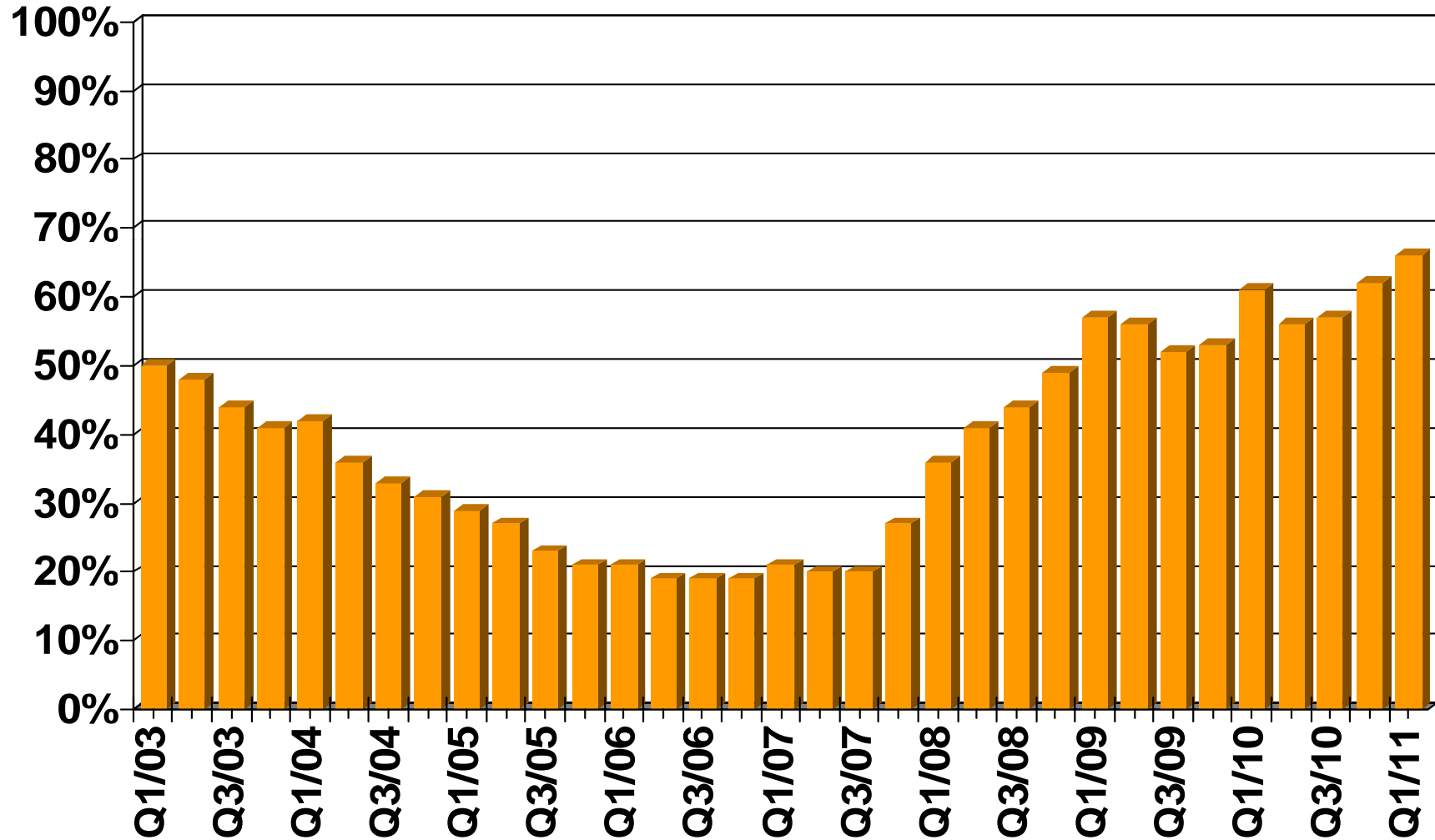

Los Angeles County, 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2011: 66%

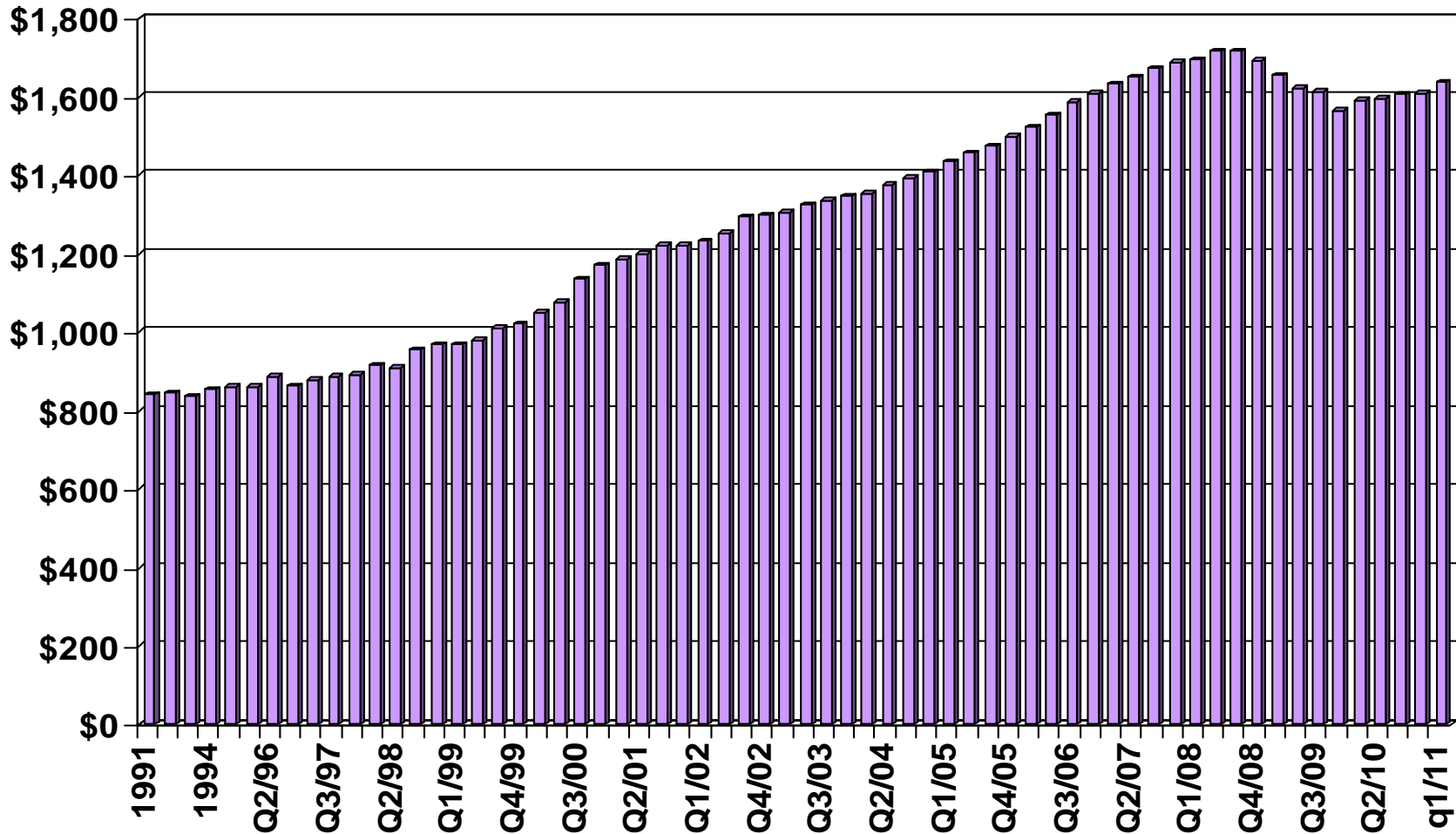

Los Angeles County, 2011 Q1: \$1,637 Up 3.0% YTY

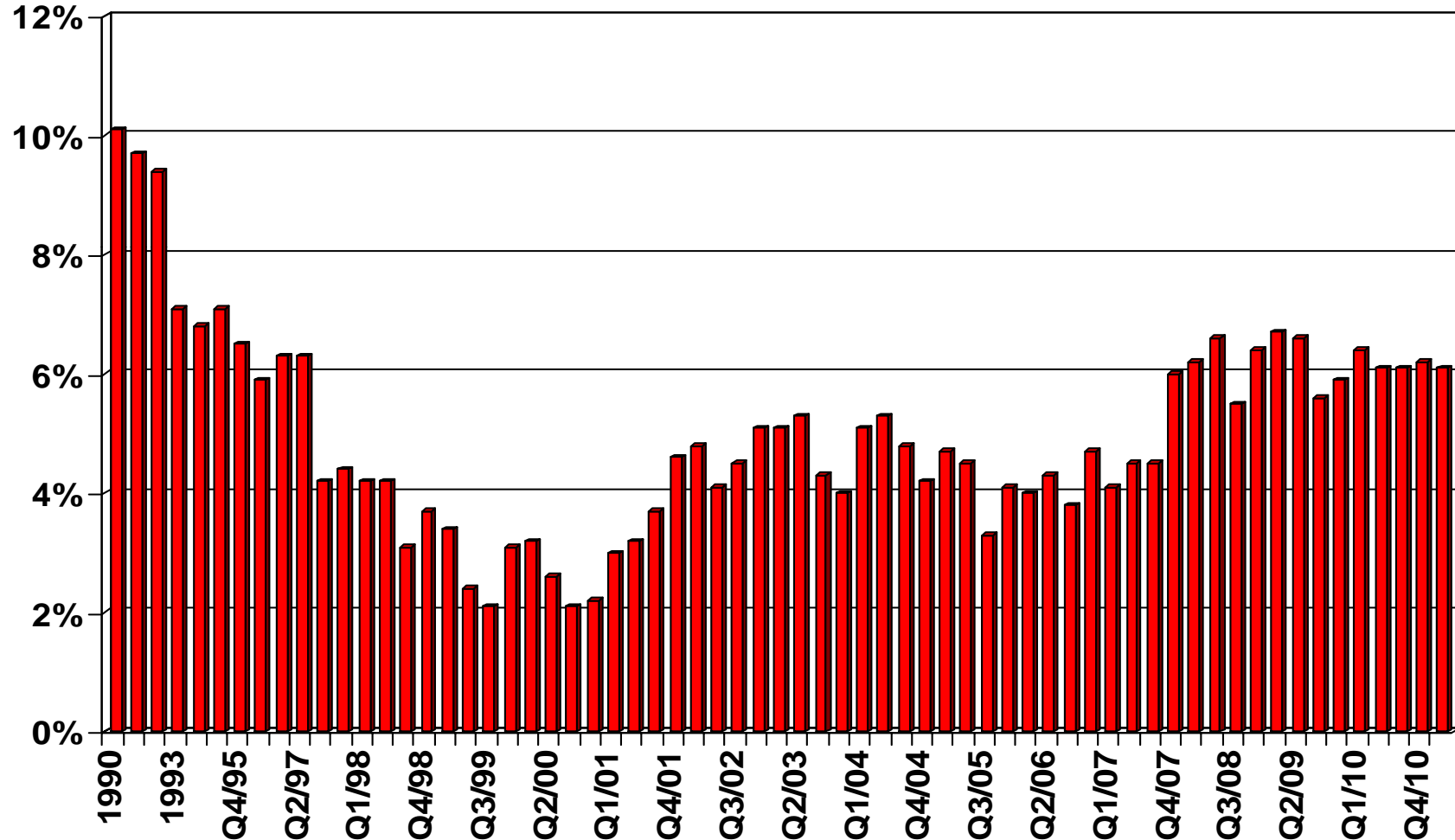

Los Angeles County, 2011 Q1: 6.1%

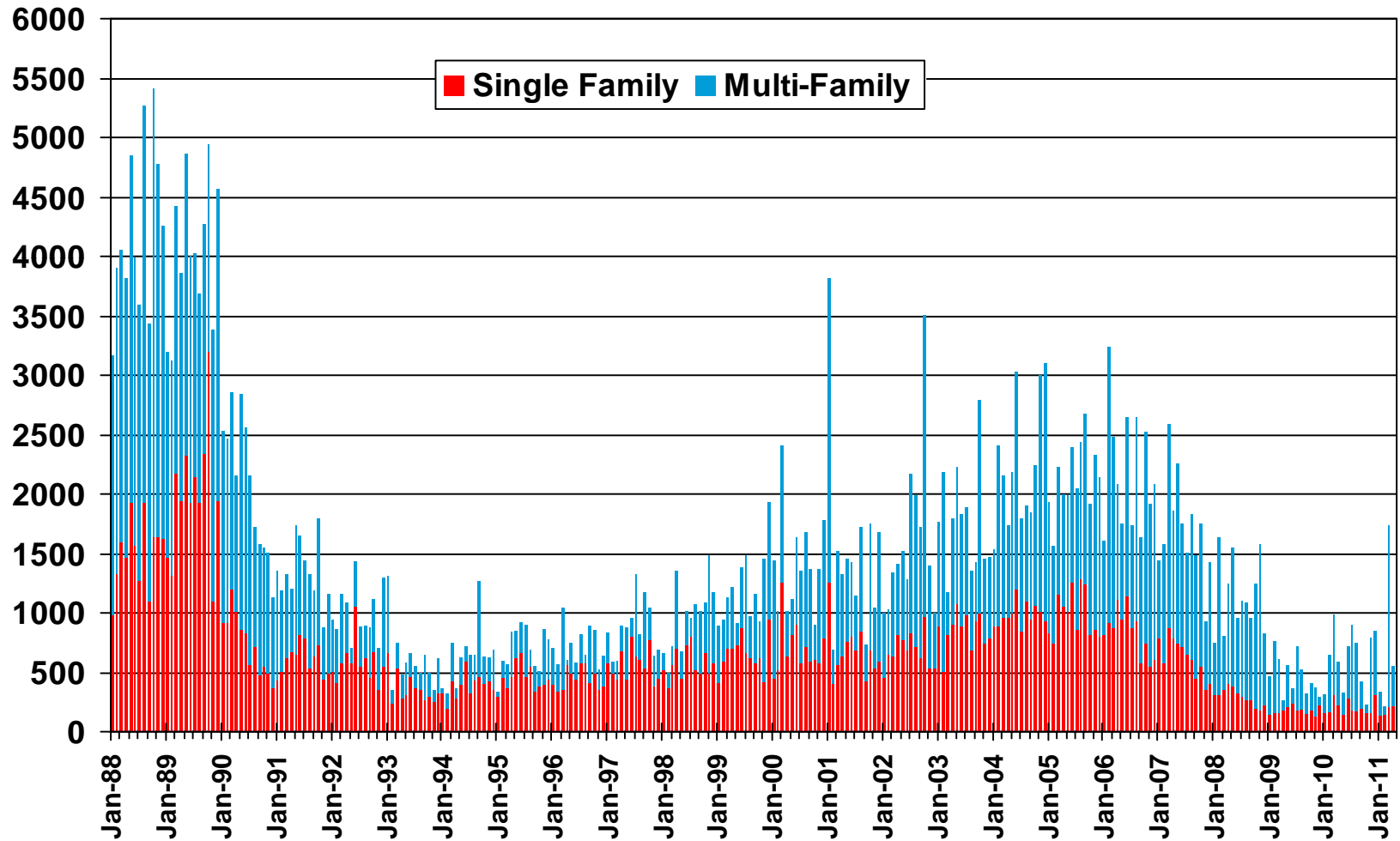

# New Housing Permits

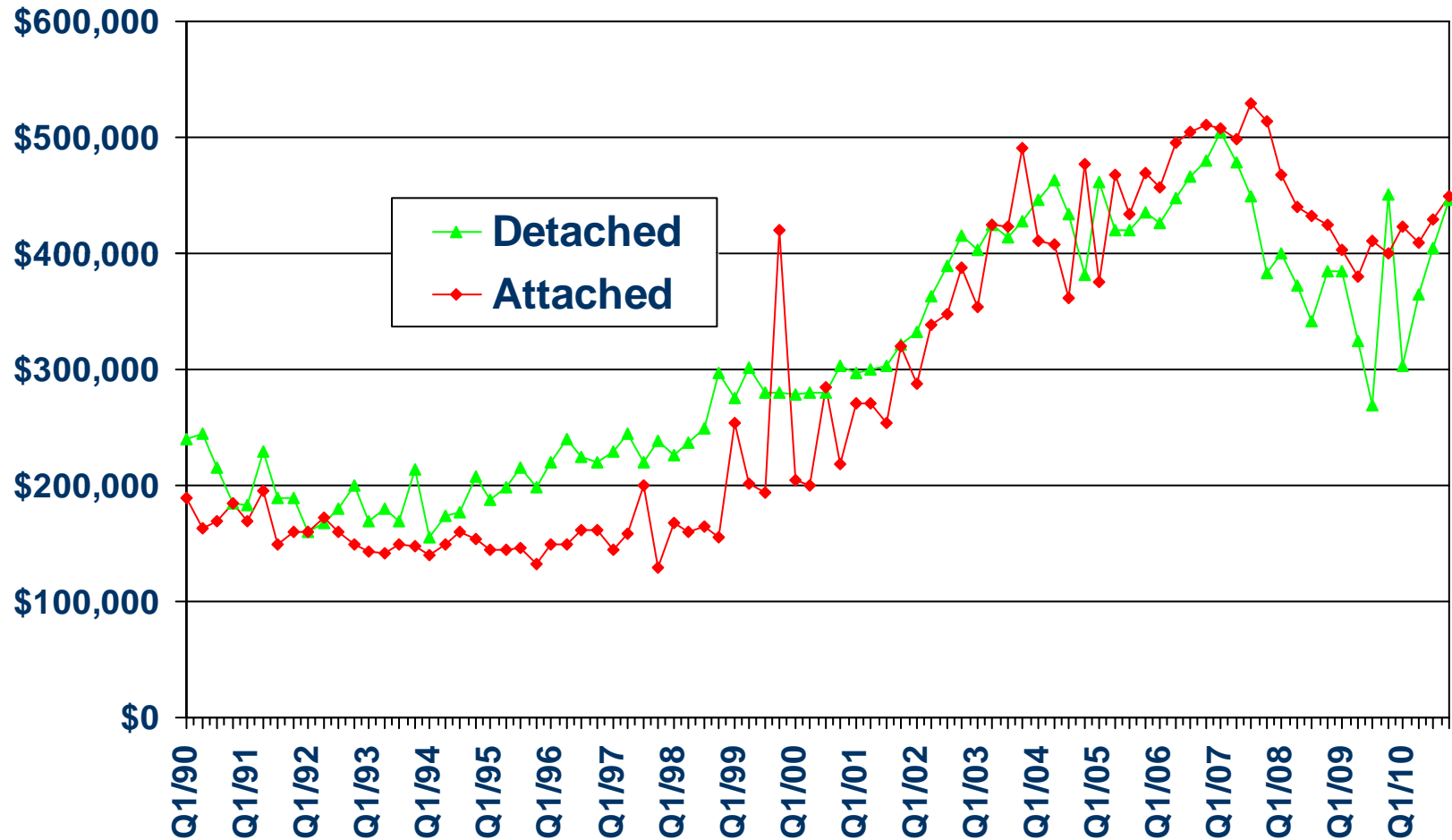
LA County, April 2011: 544 Units, Up 12.4% YTD

# Median Price for New Homes

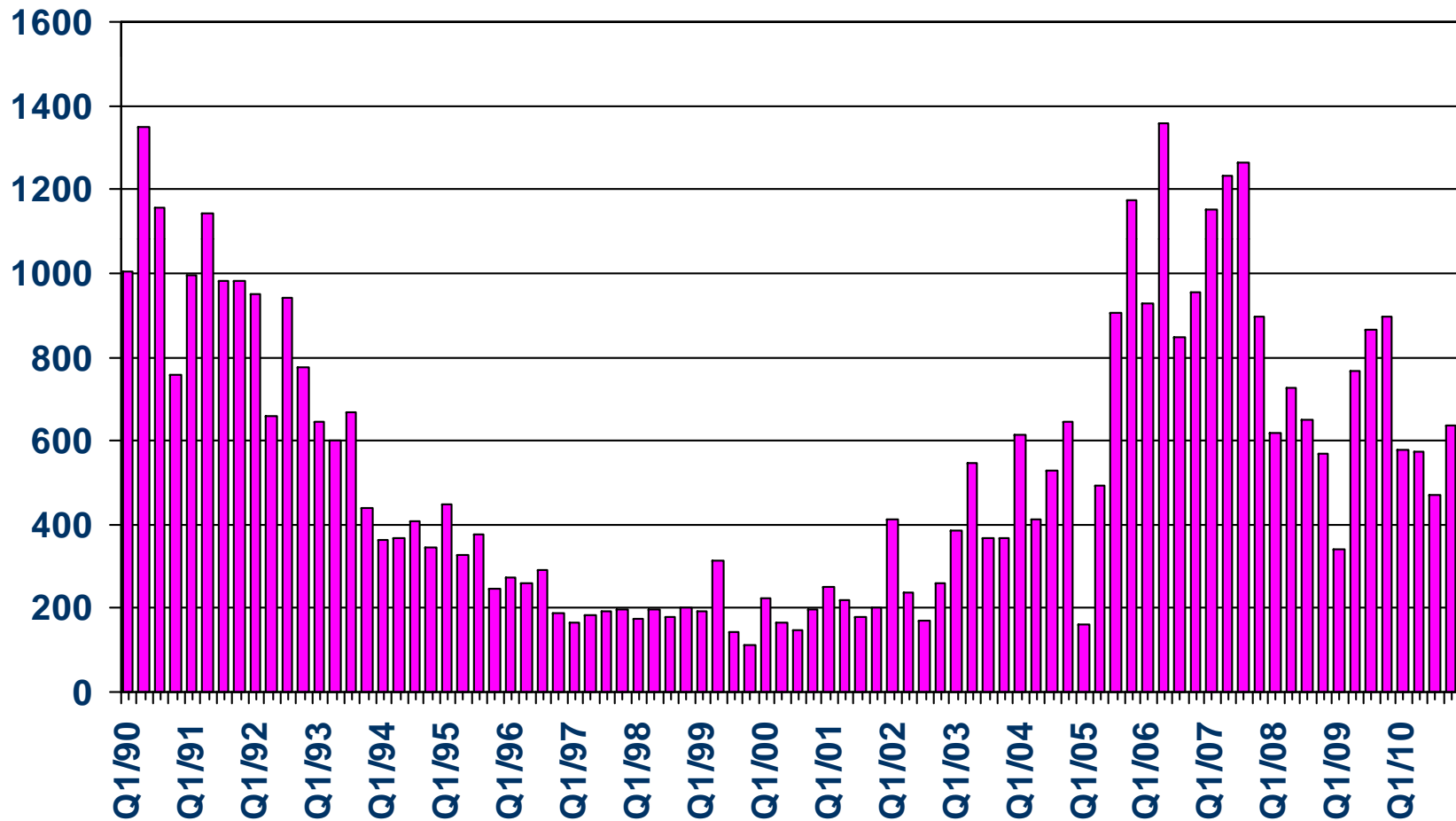
Los Angeles County 4Q10 Detached: \$445,500, Attached: \$448,500

# New Home Sales

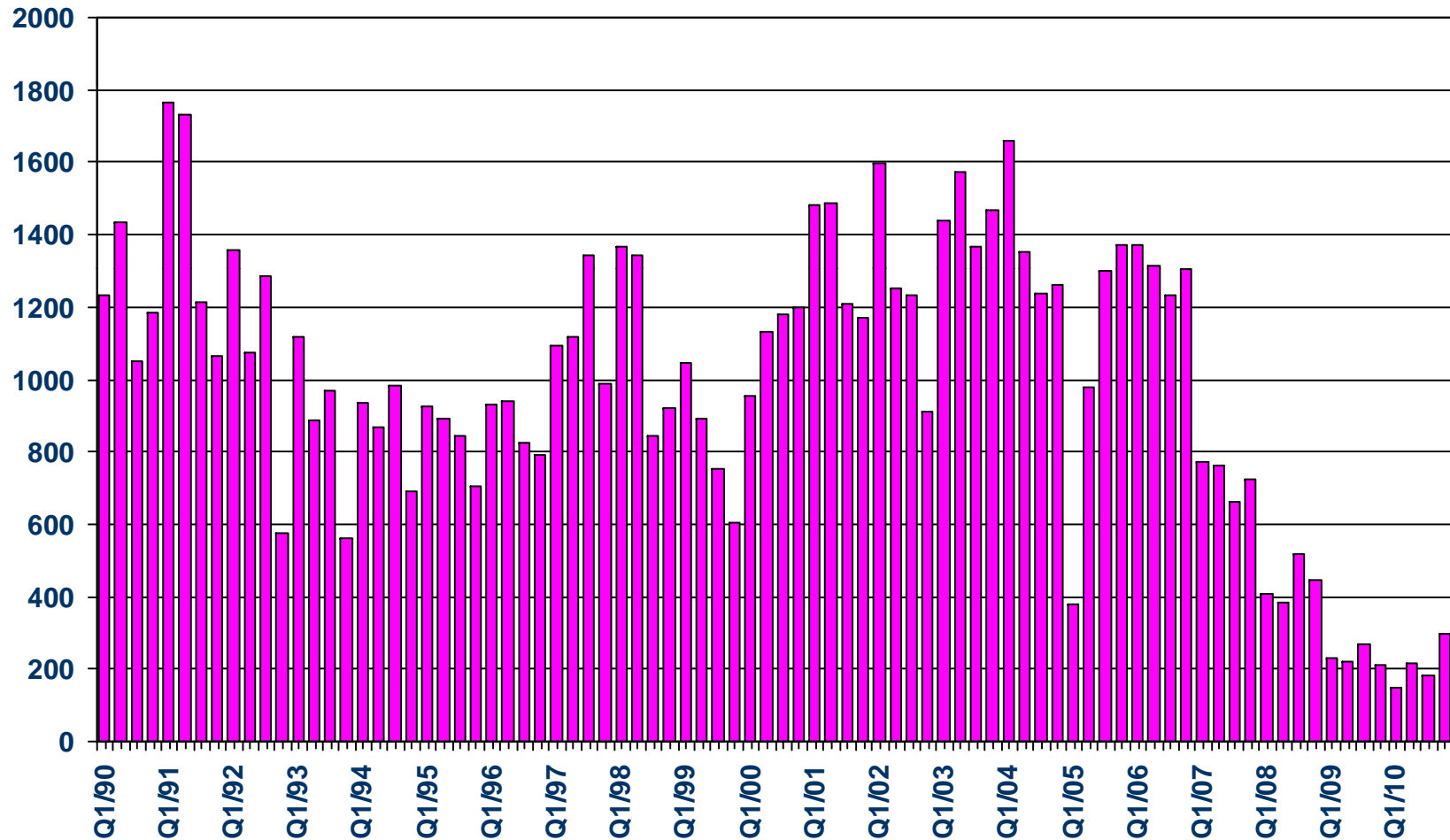
Los Angeles County (Attached), 2010 Q4 Sales: 635 Units

Los Angeles County (Detached), 2010 Q4 Sales: 299 Units

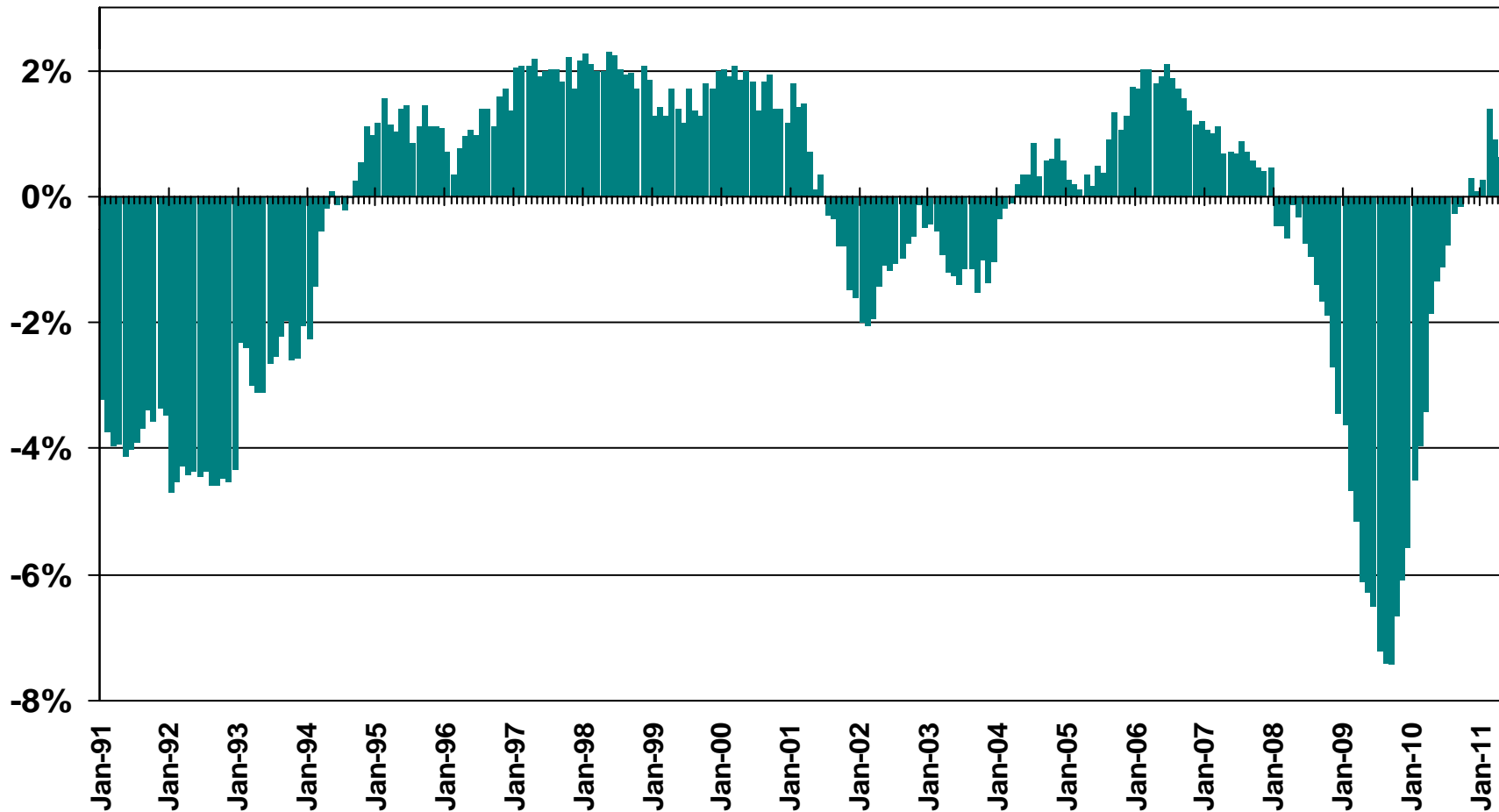

Los Angeles County, April 2011: Up 0.6% YTY

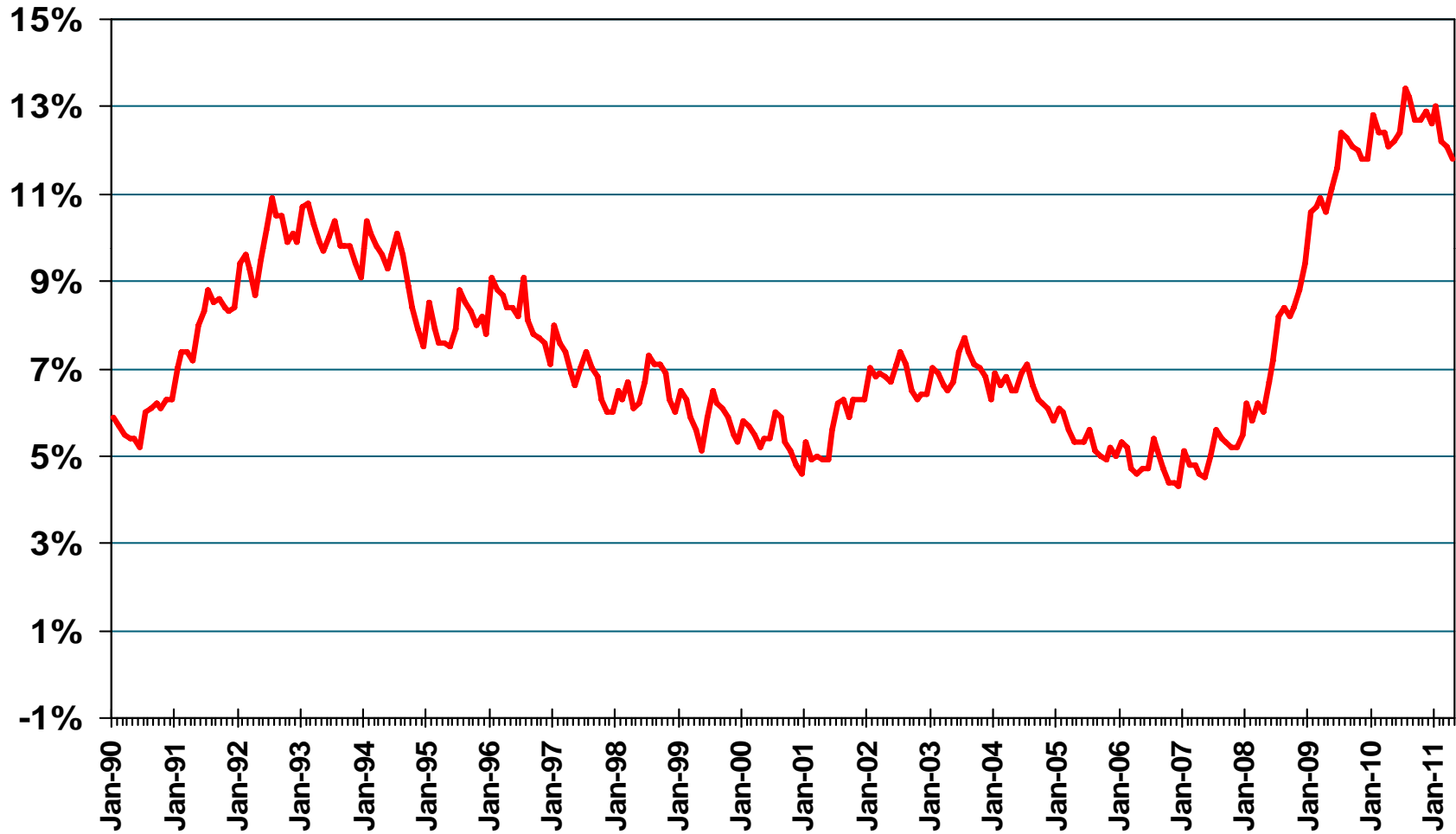
Y-T-Y PERCENT CHANGE

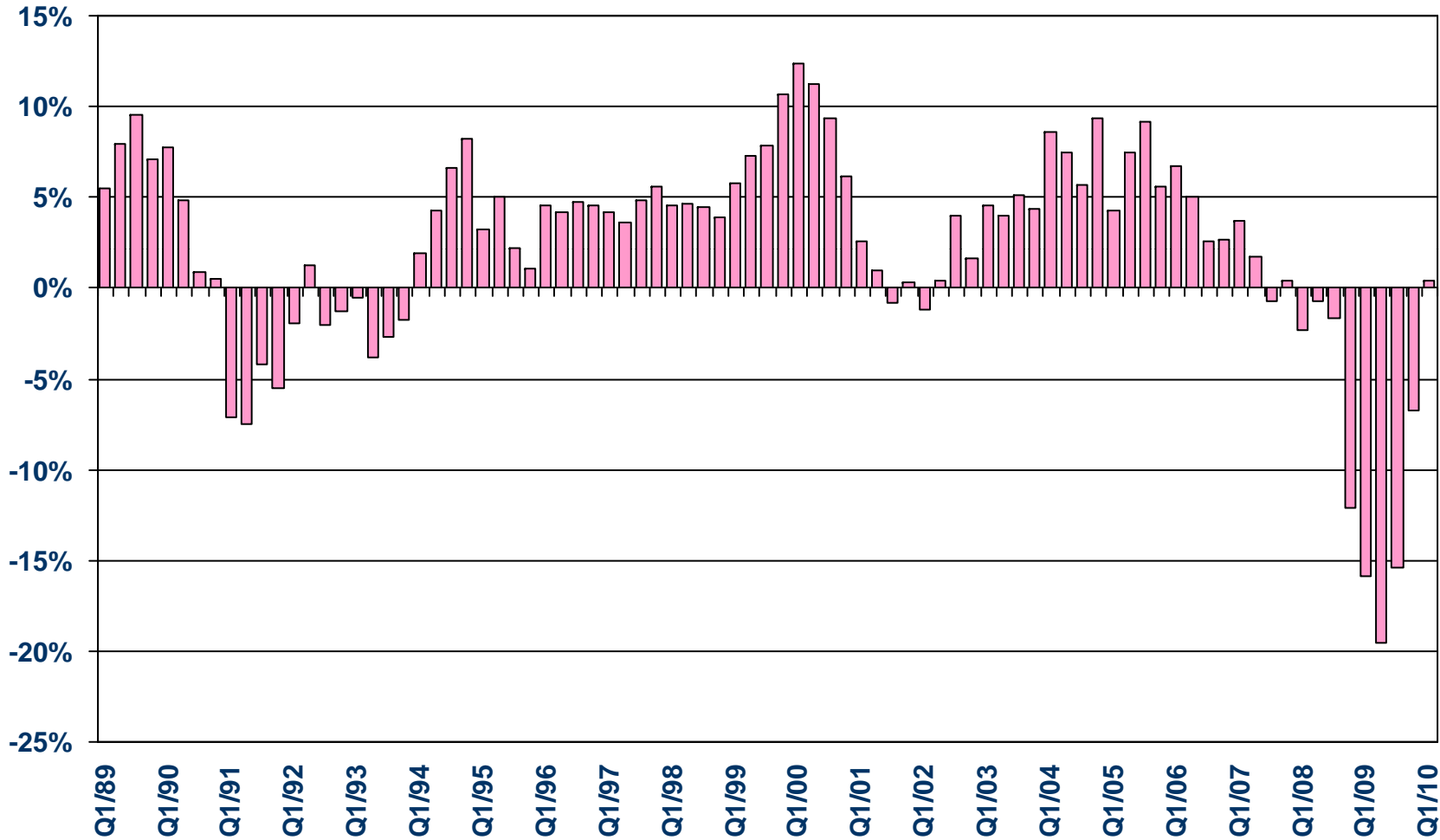

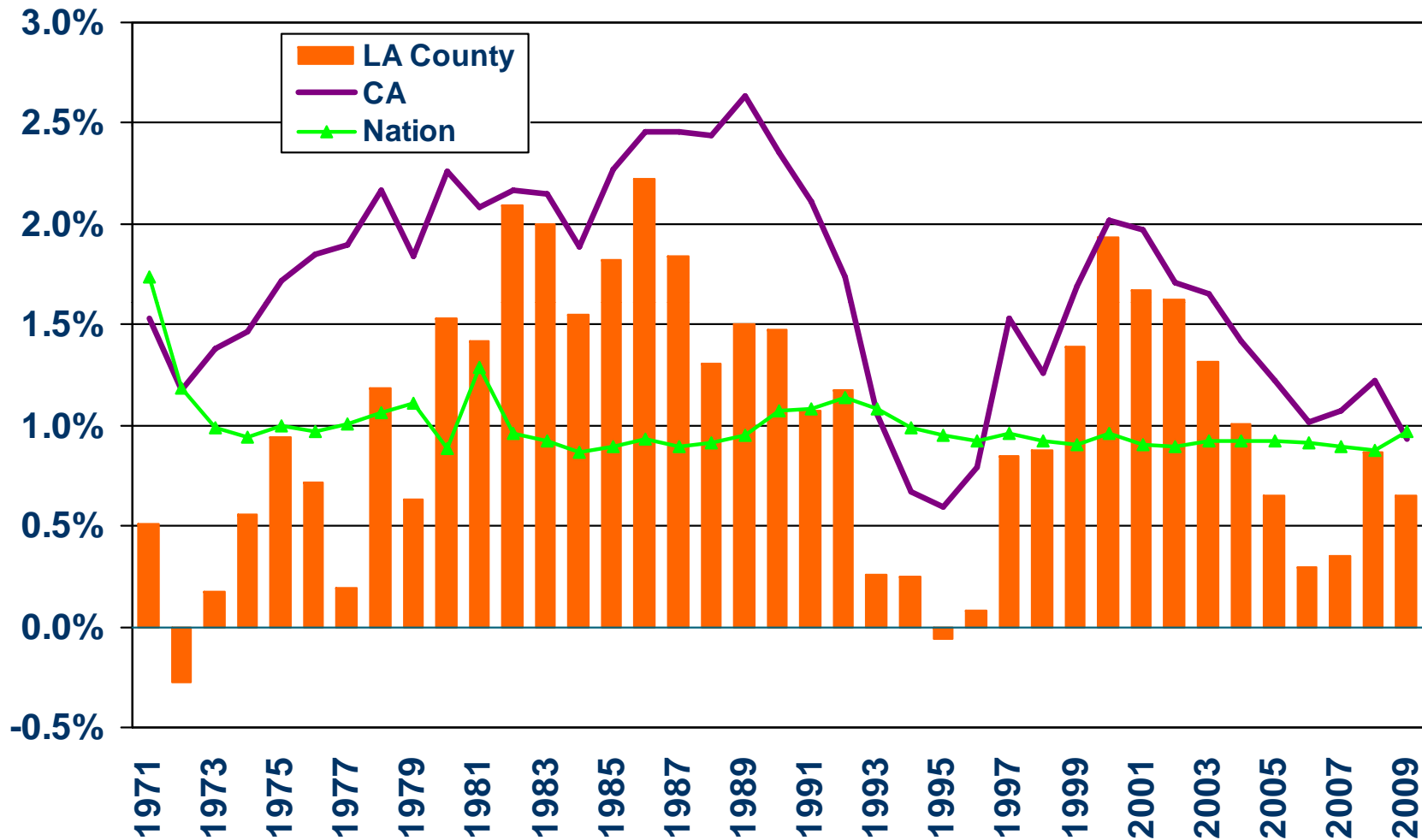
### ANNUAL PERCENT CHANGE

# Population Percent Changes

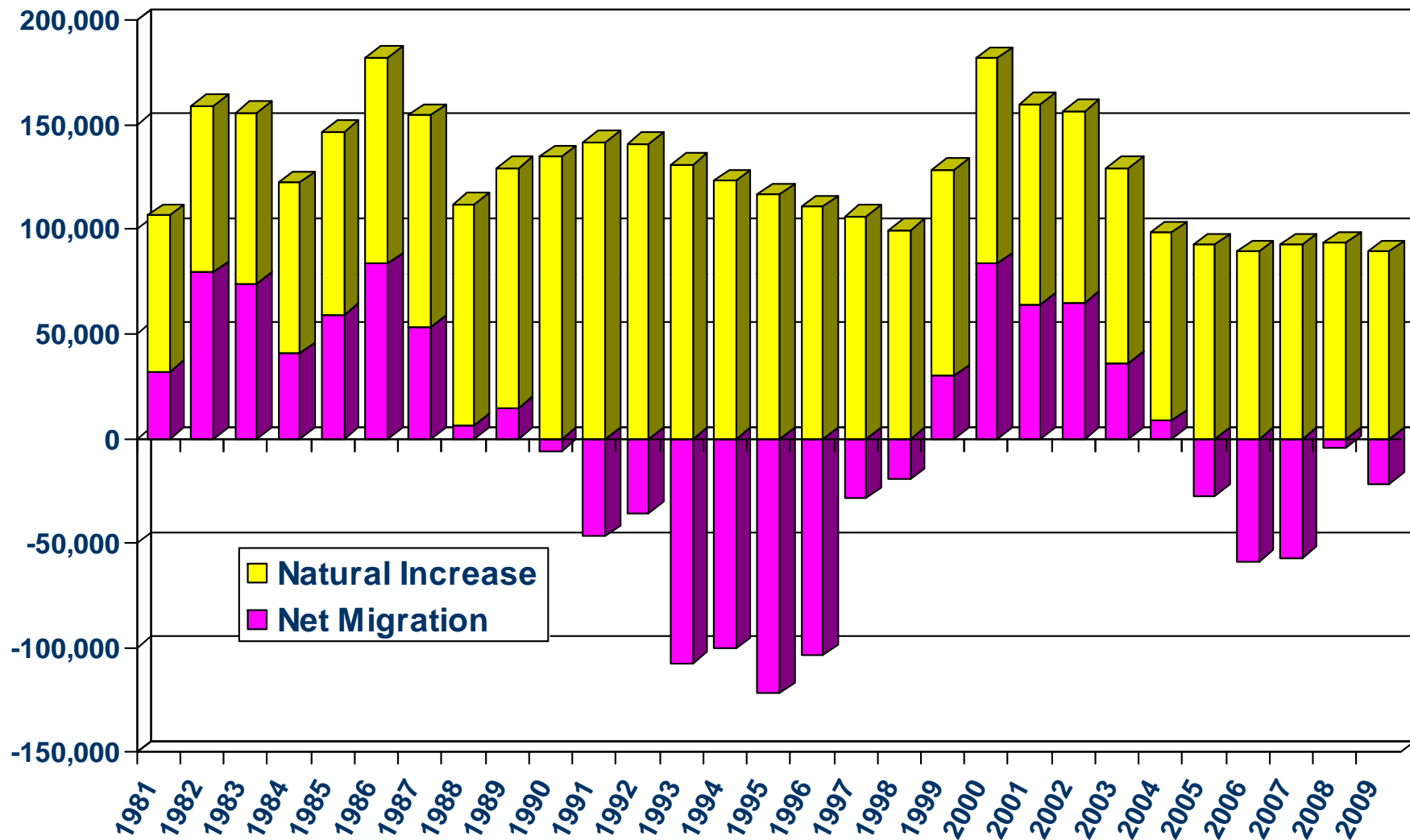
## Los Angeles County (1971-2009)

# Sources of Population Growth

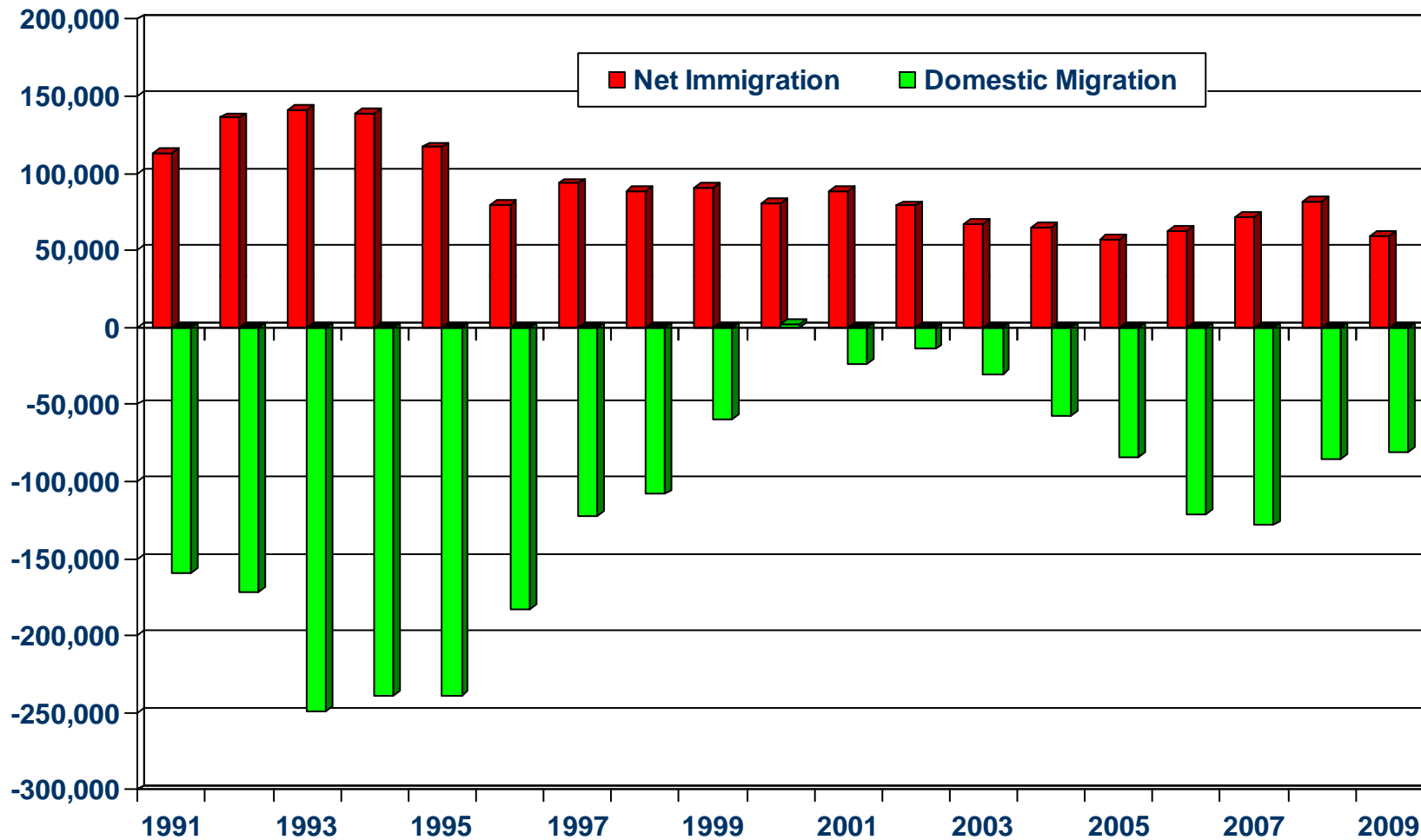

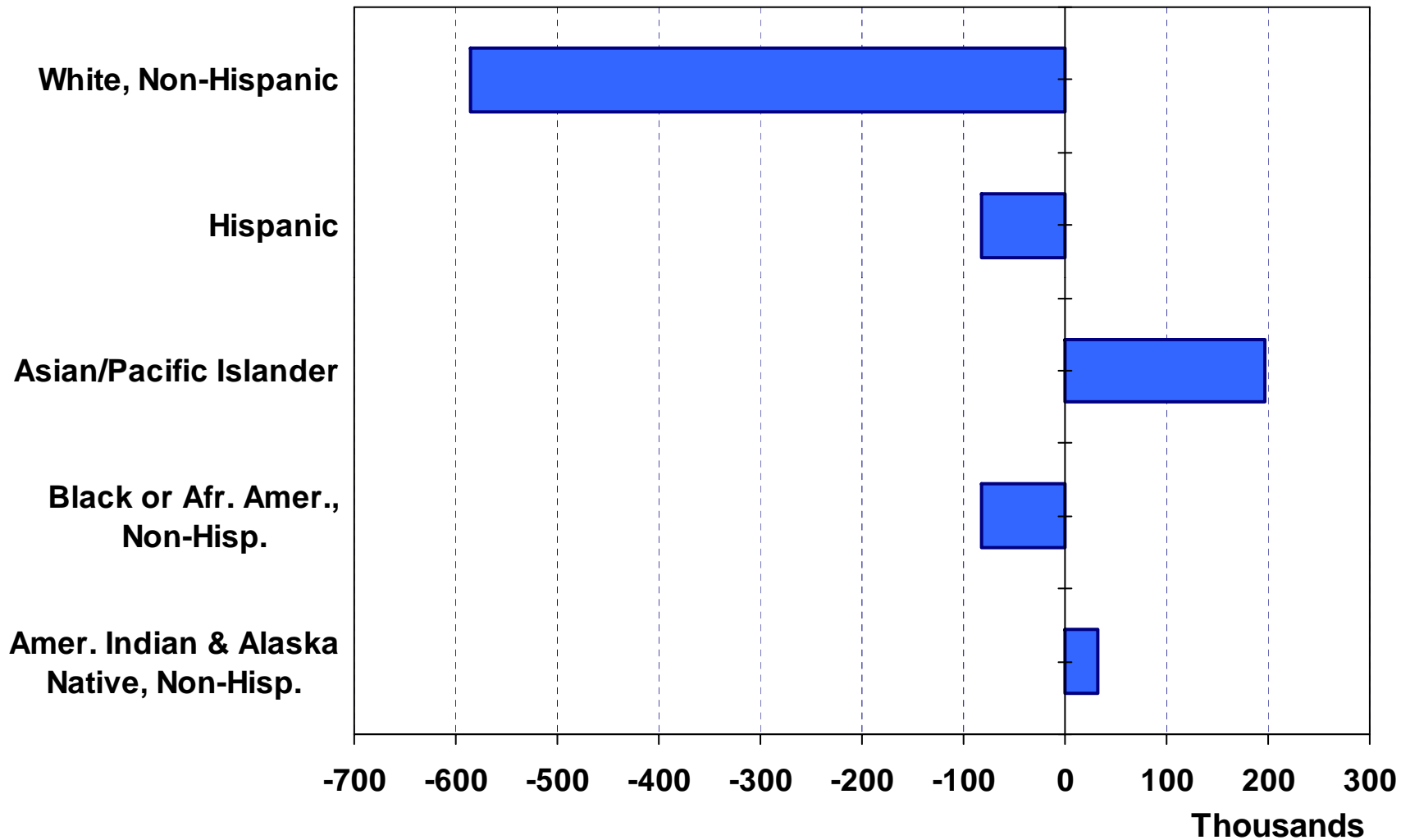

# Net Immigration by Ethnic Group

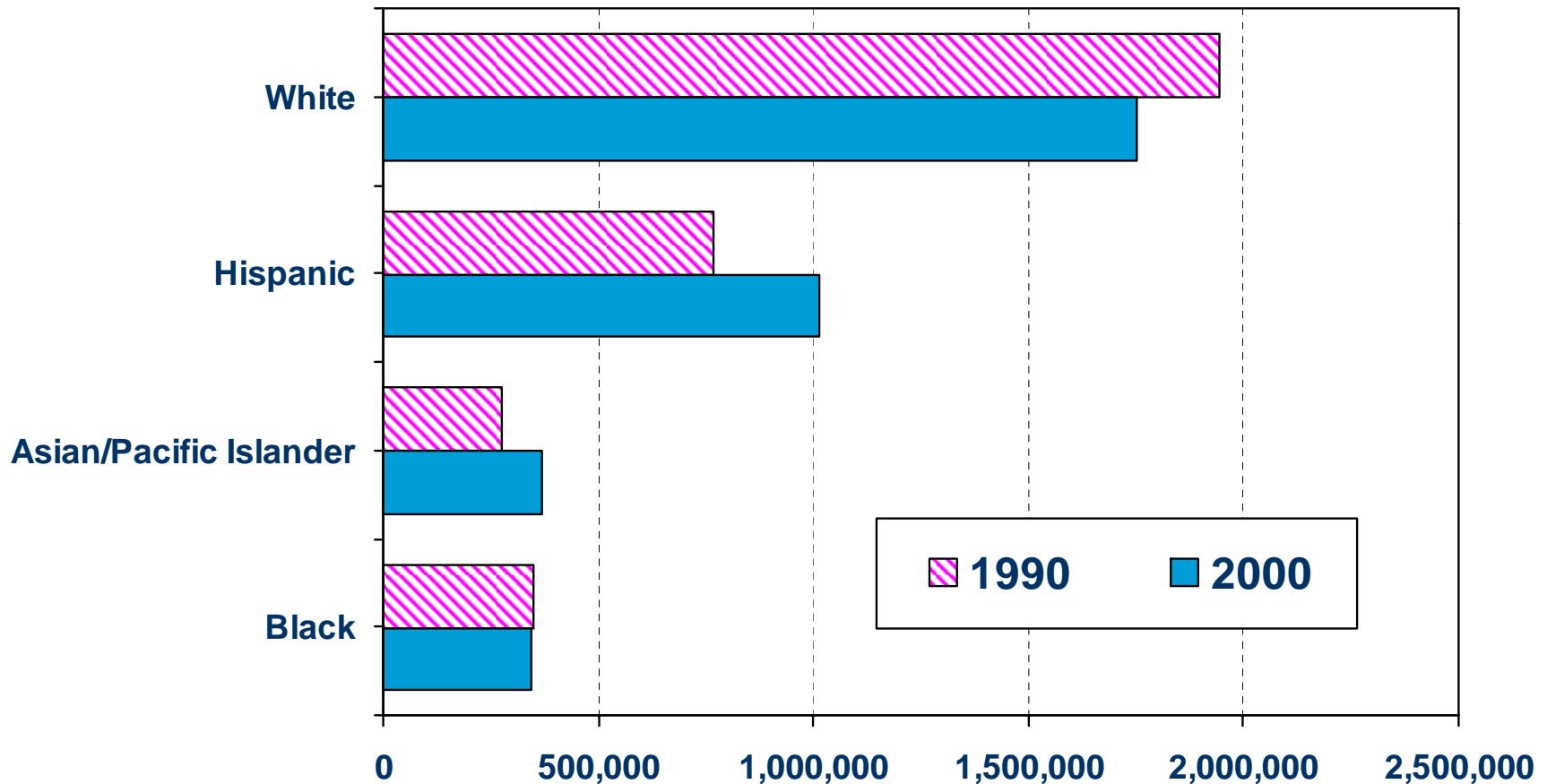
Los Angeles County (1990 Census to 2000 Census)

# Number of Households by Ethnicity

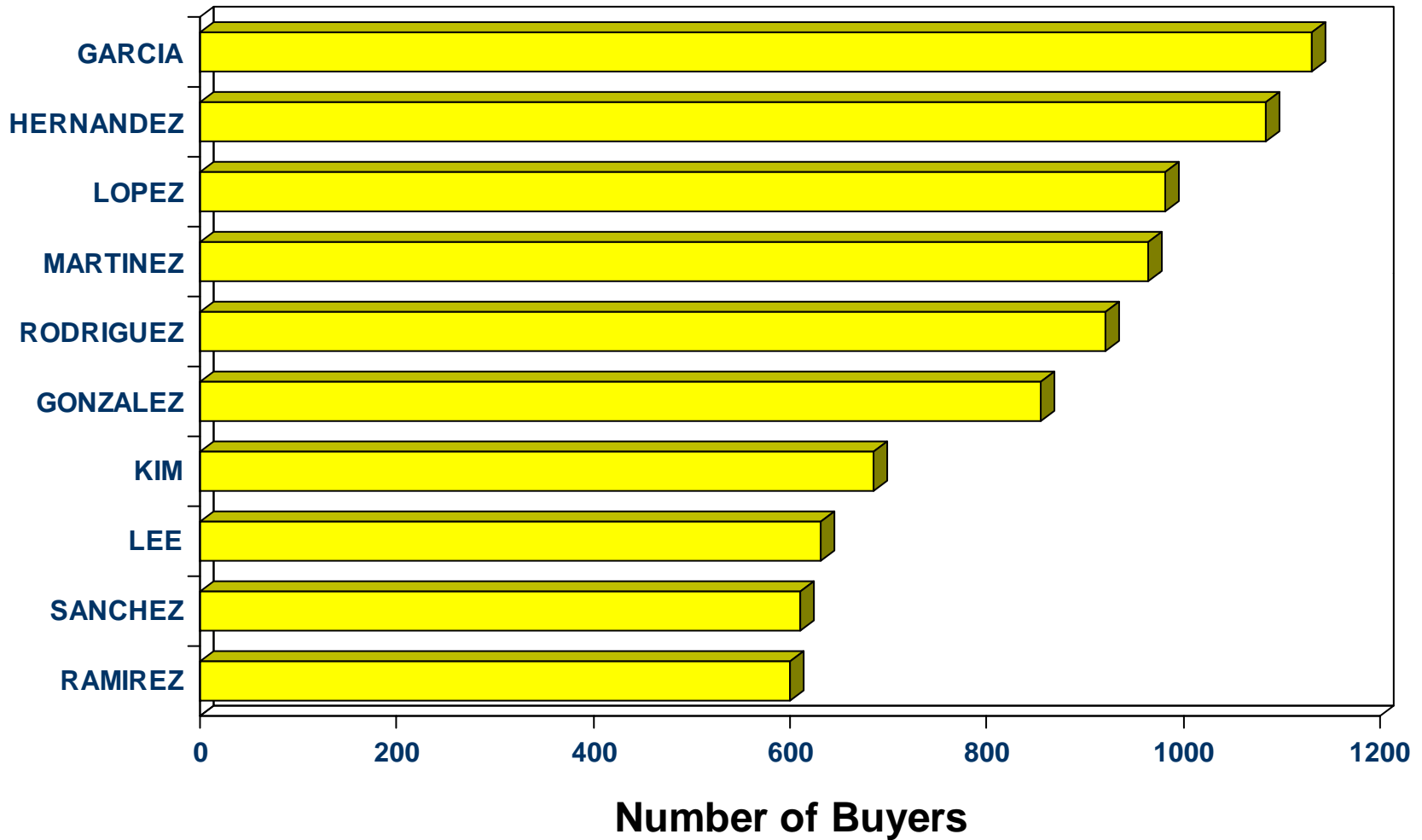
Los Angeles County (1990 Census vs. 2000 Census)

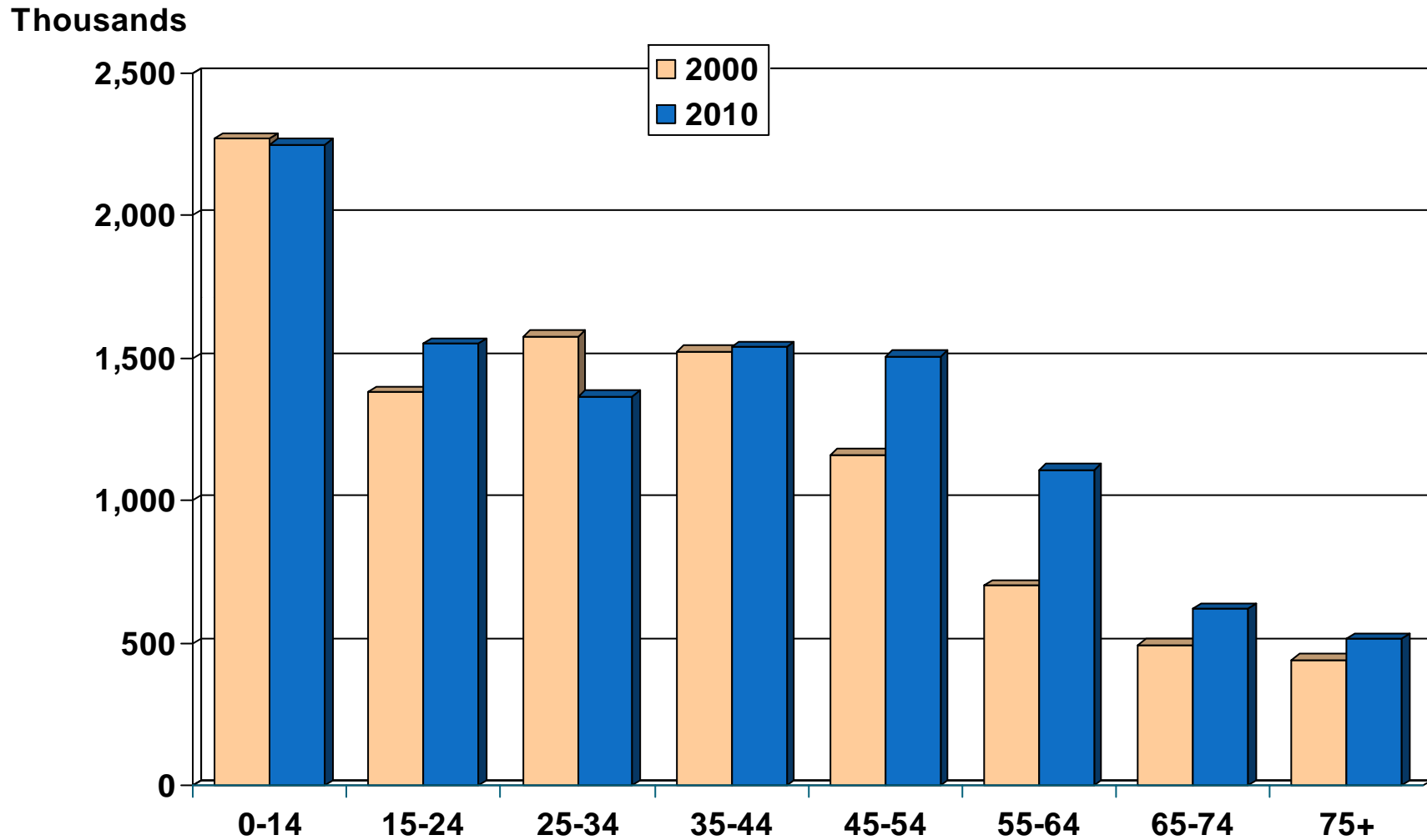

# Population by Age Group

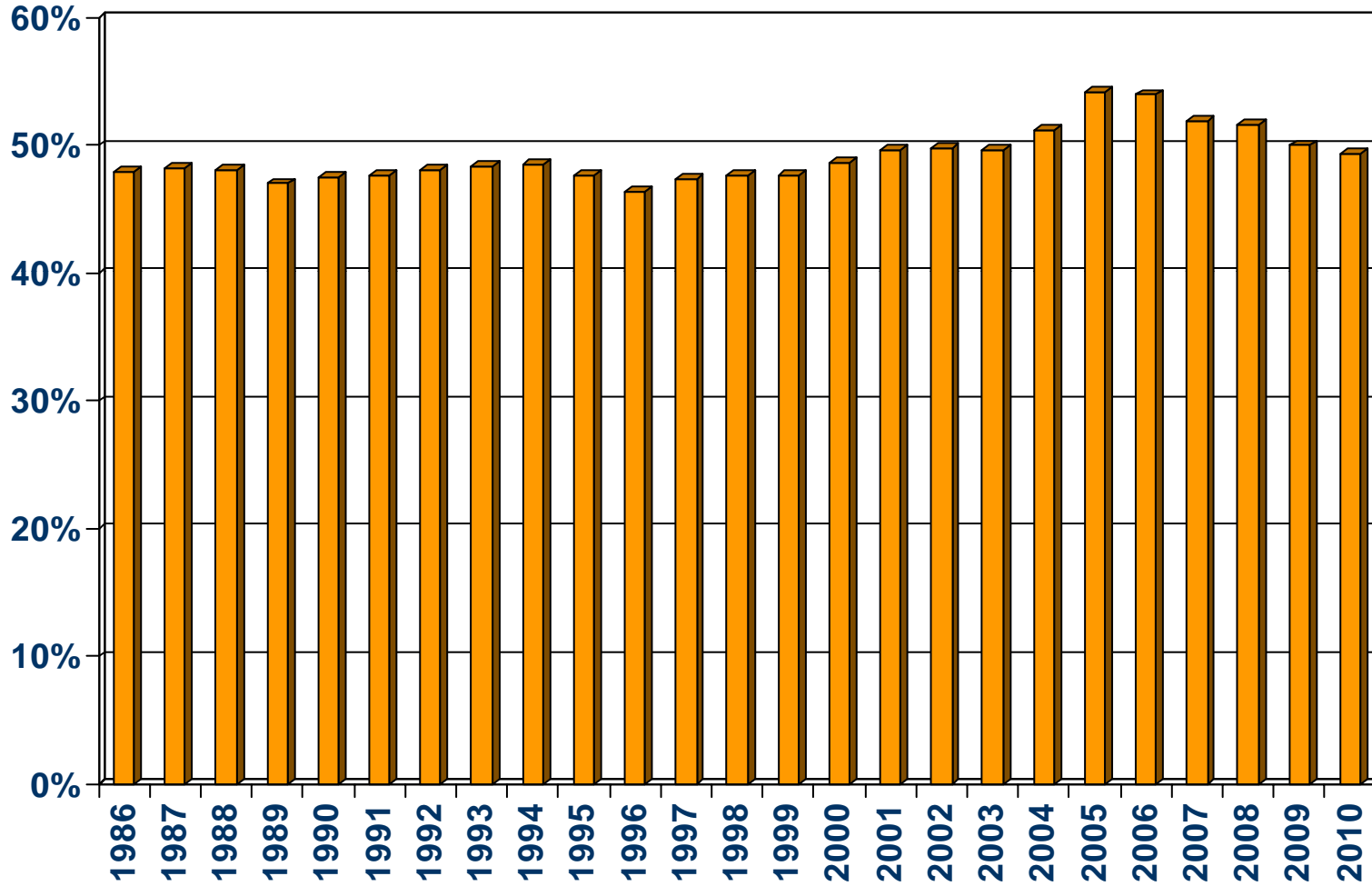

# Homeownership Rates

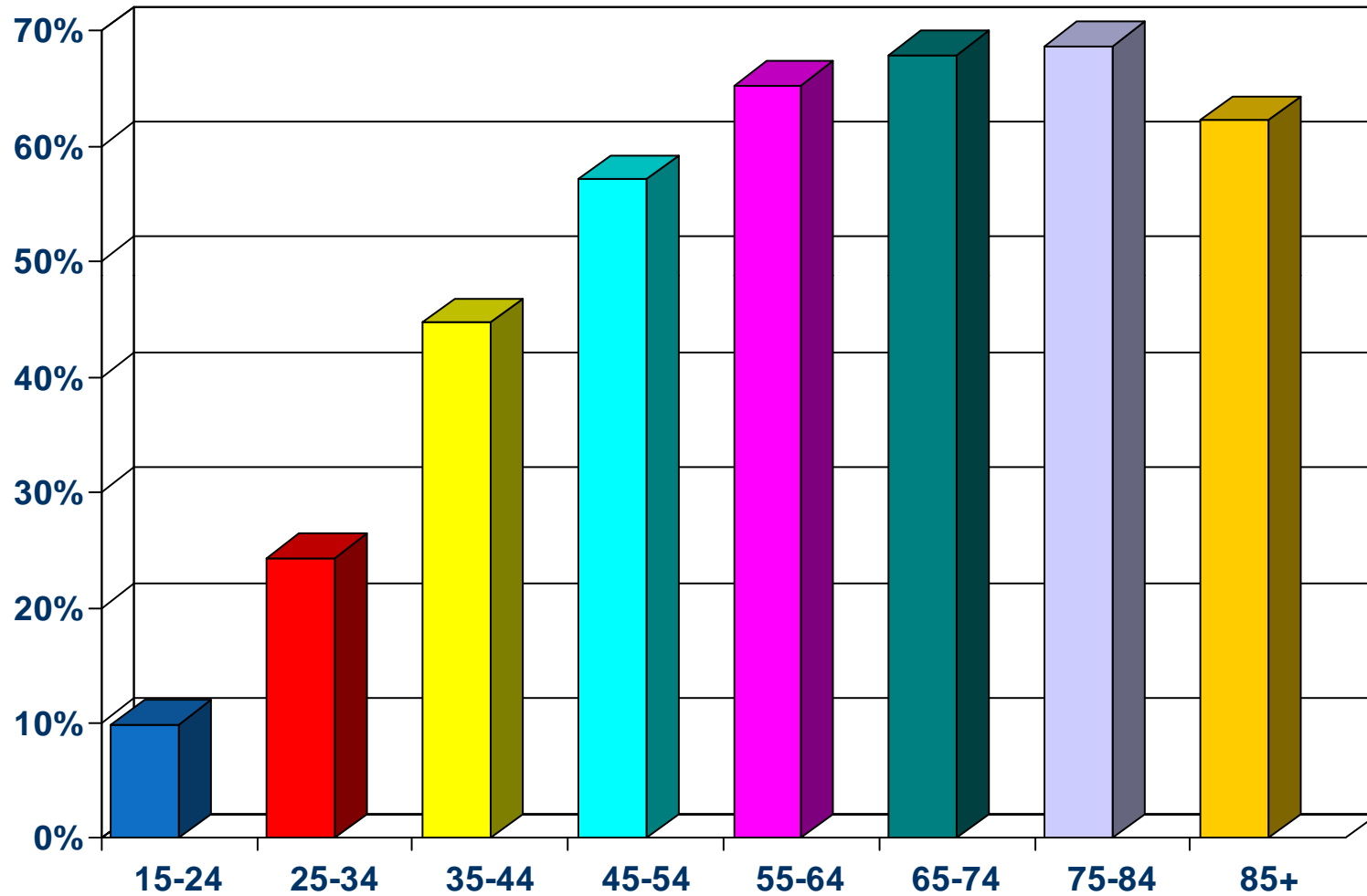
