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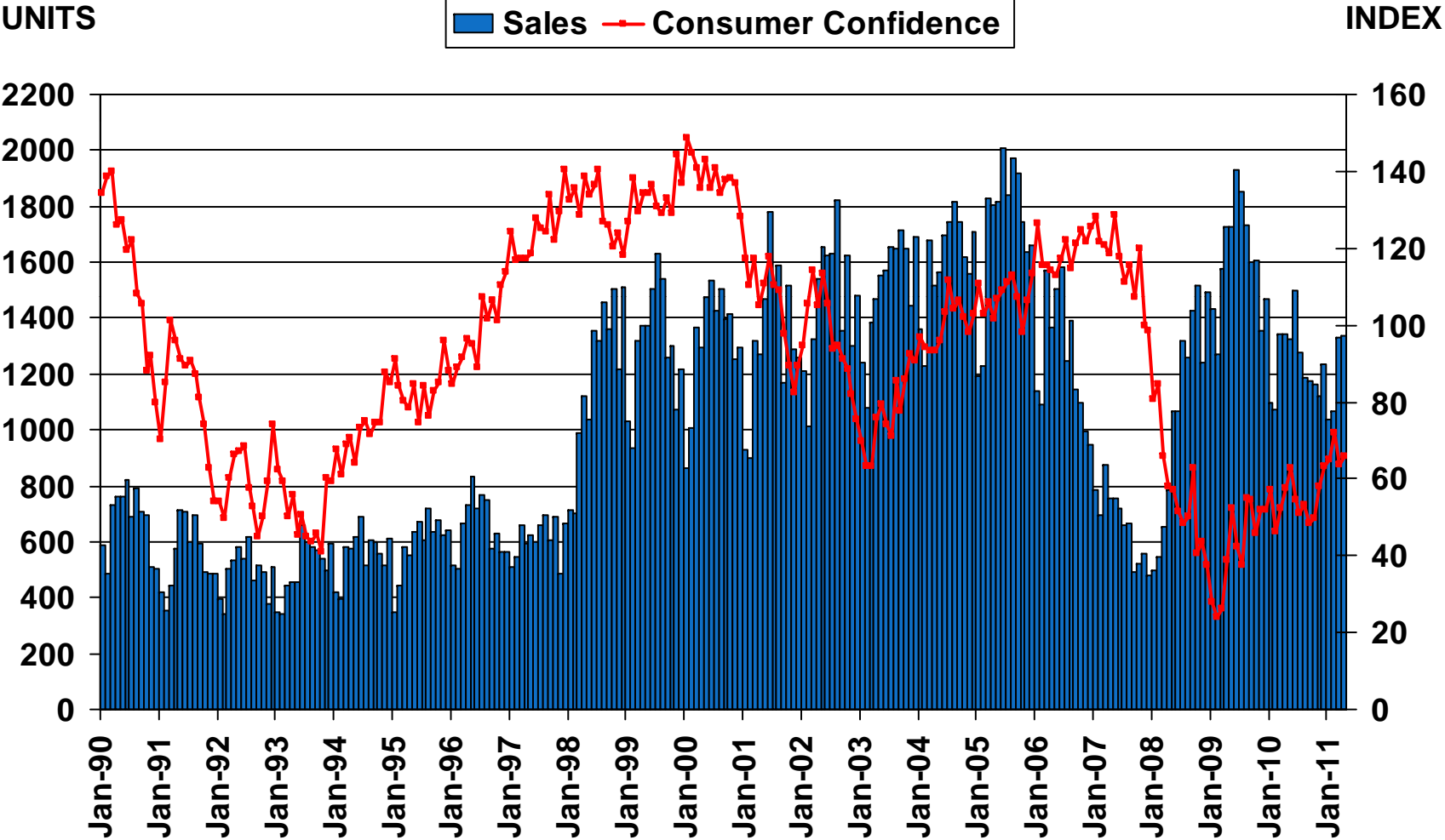

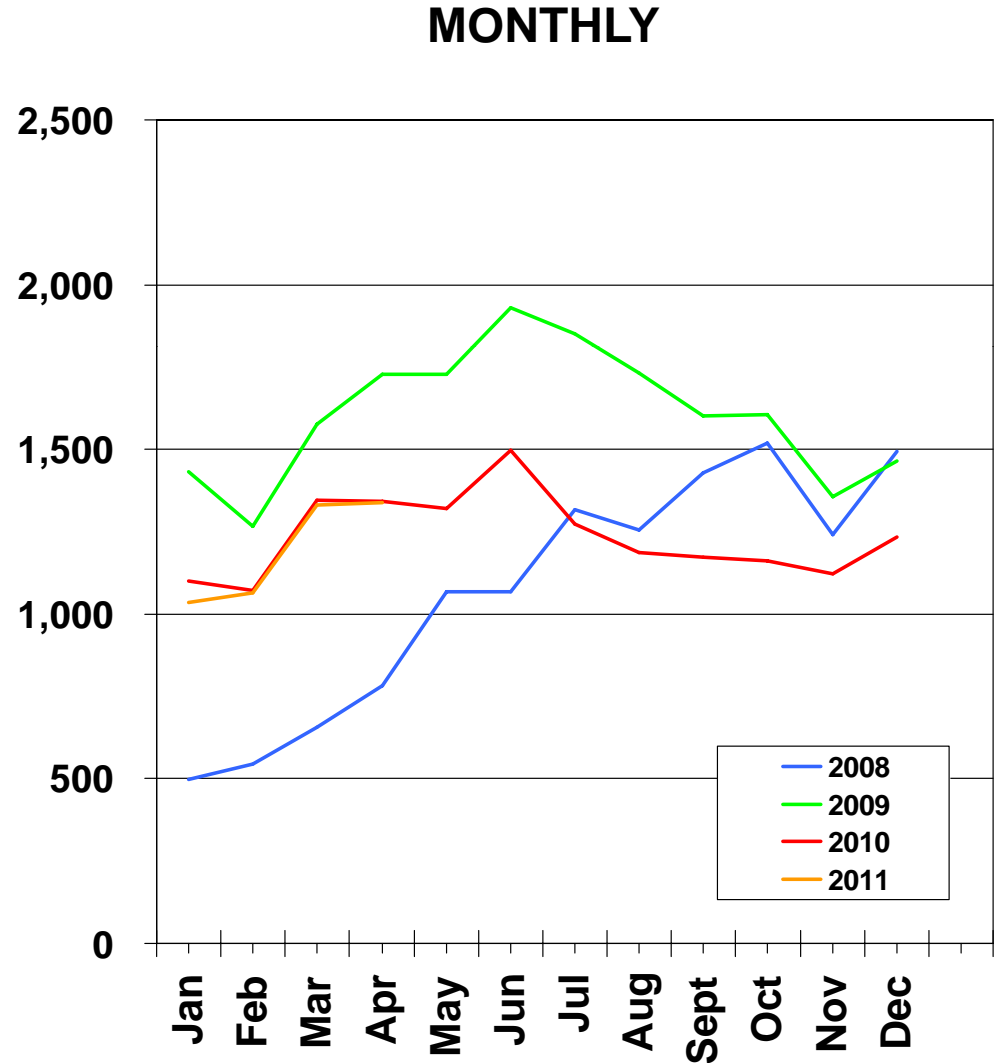
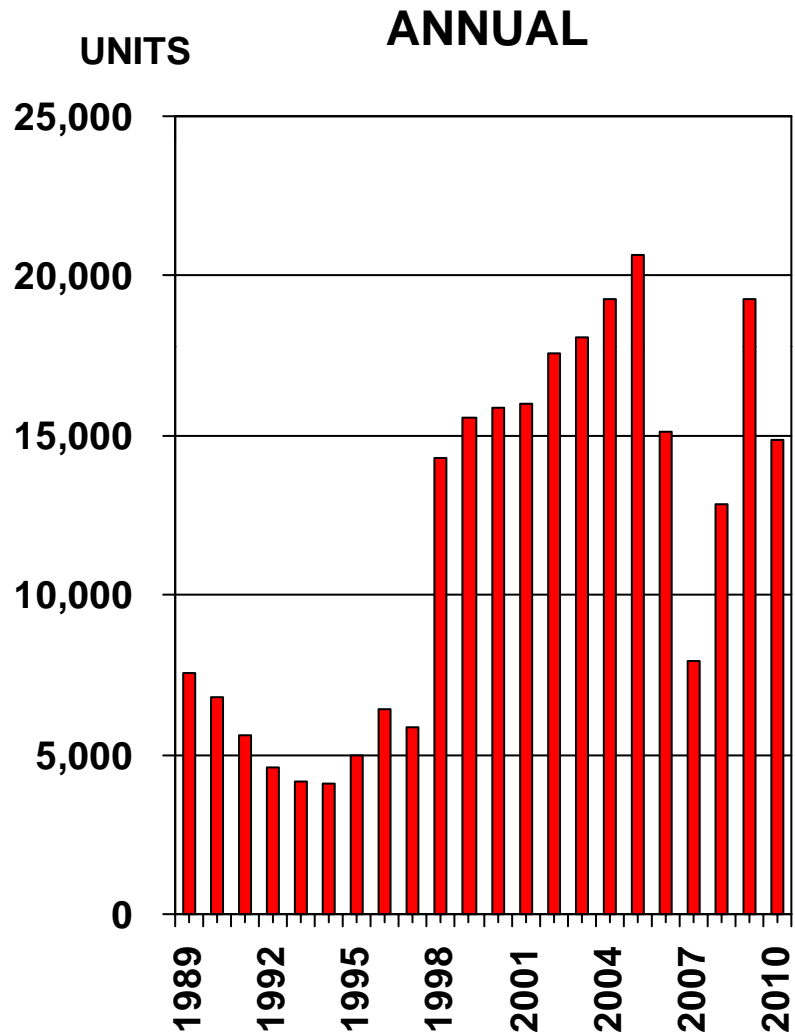

Sales of Existing Detached Homes

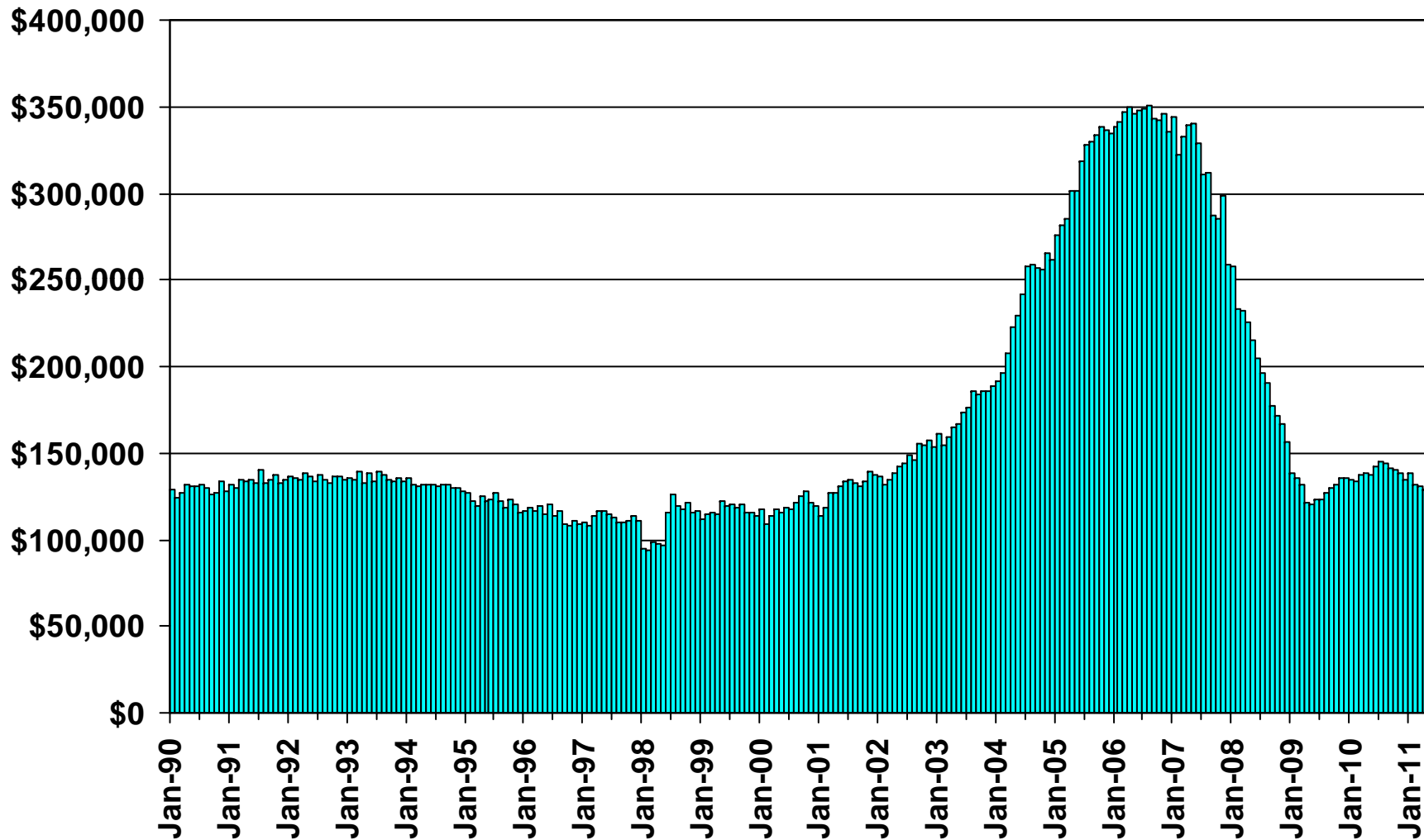
San Bernardino County, 2010: 14,830 Units, Down 23.0% YTY

San Bernardino County, April 2011: \$128,900, Down 6.7% YTY

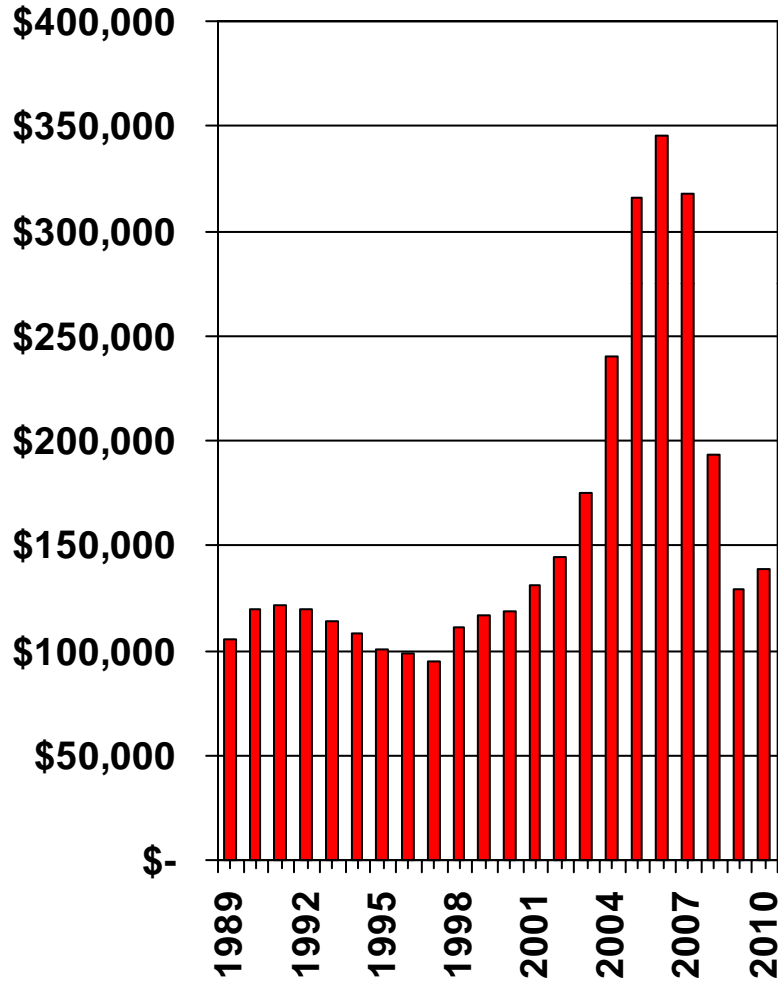

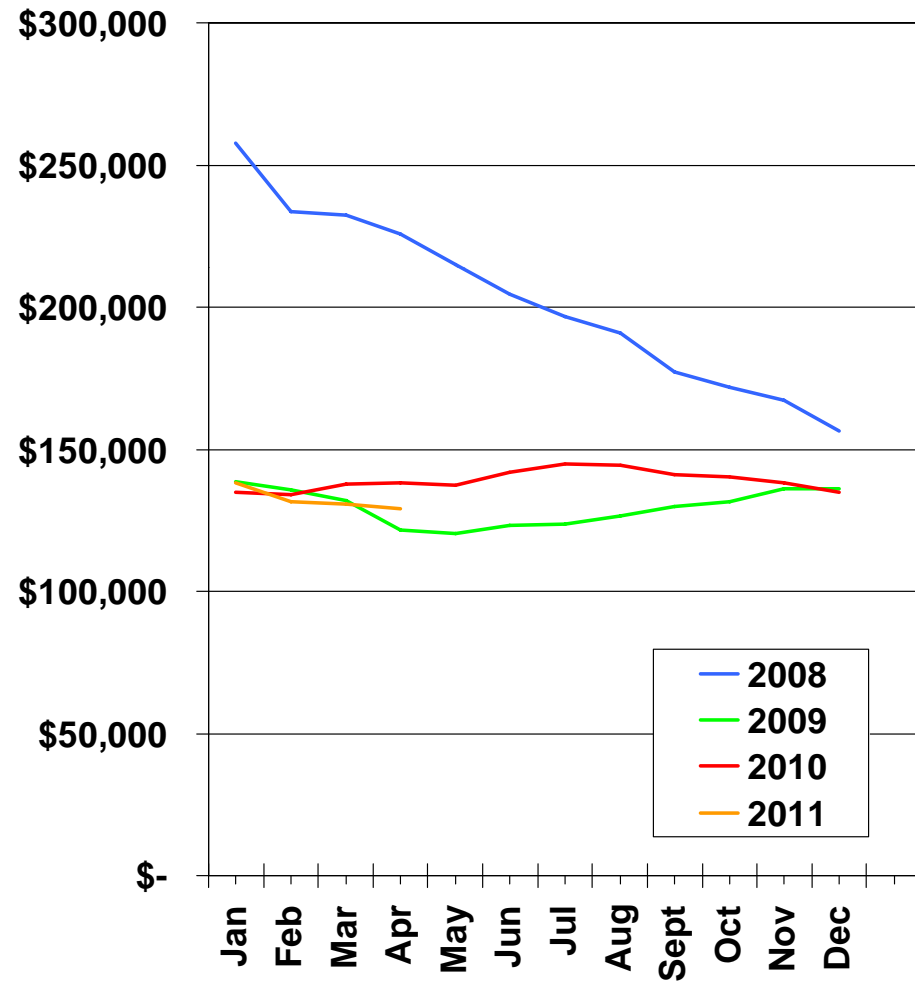
Median Price Annual Comparison

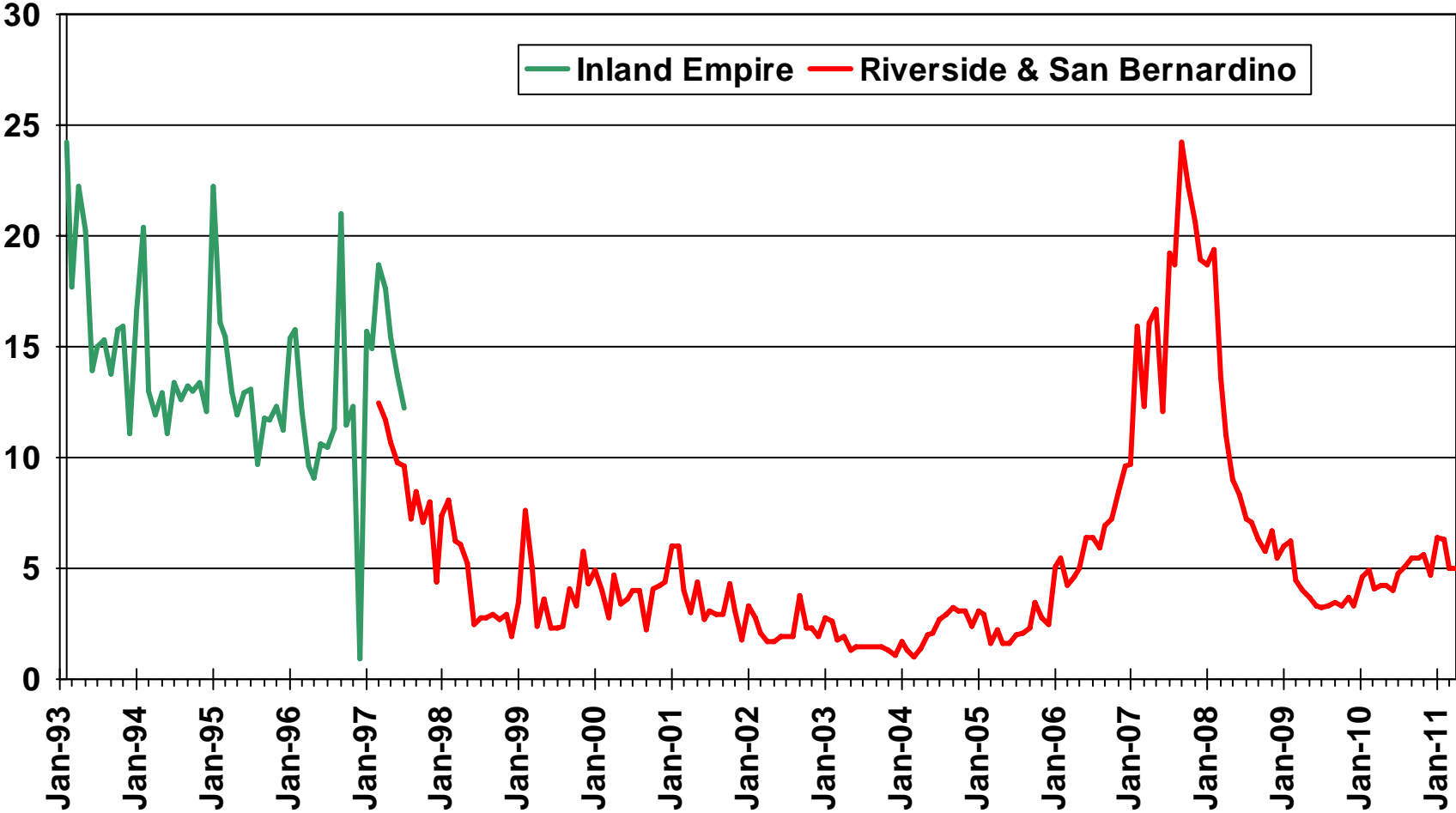

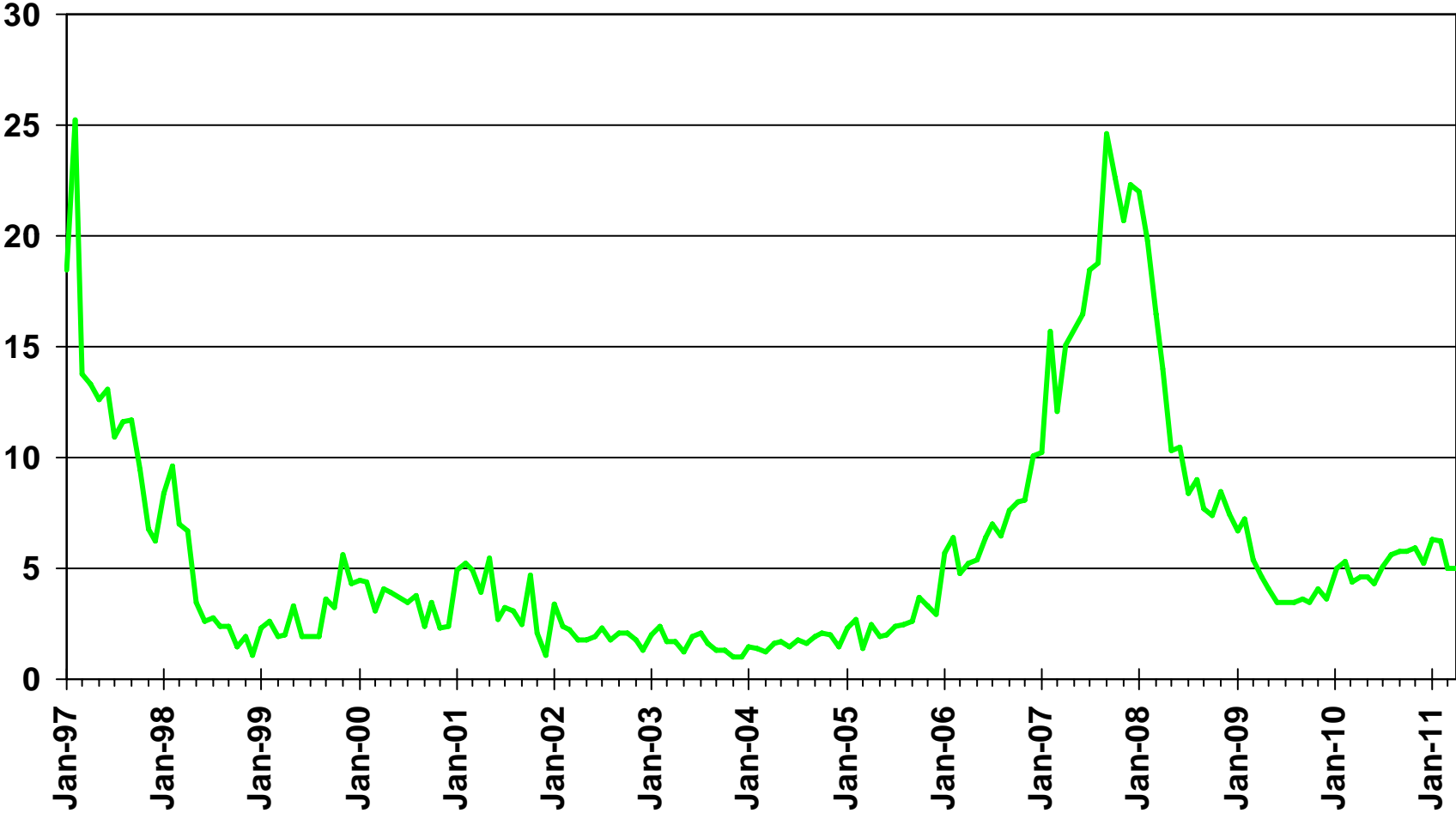

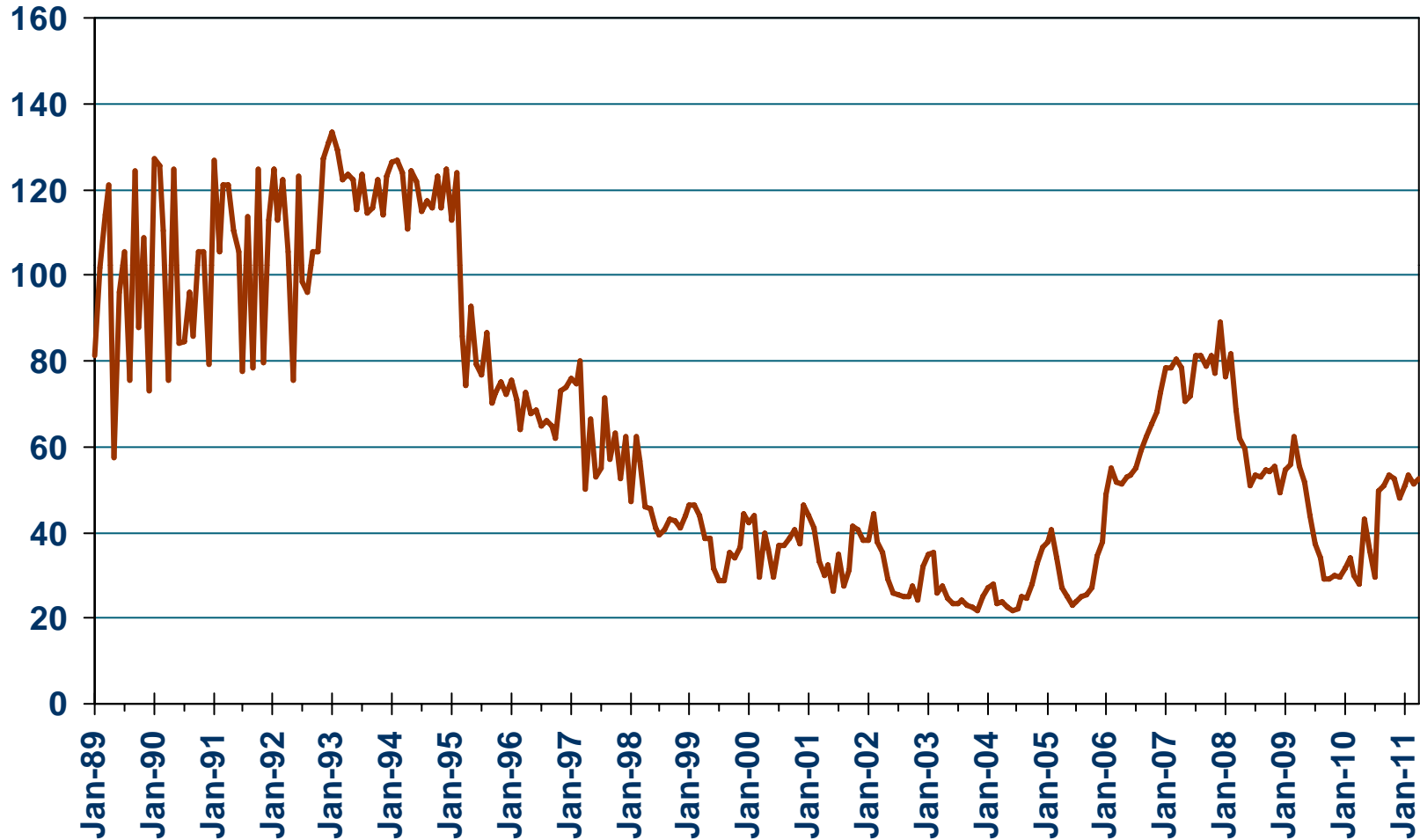

Median Time on the Market

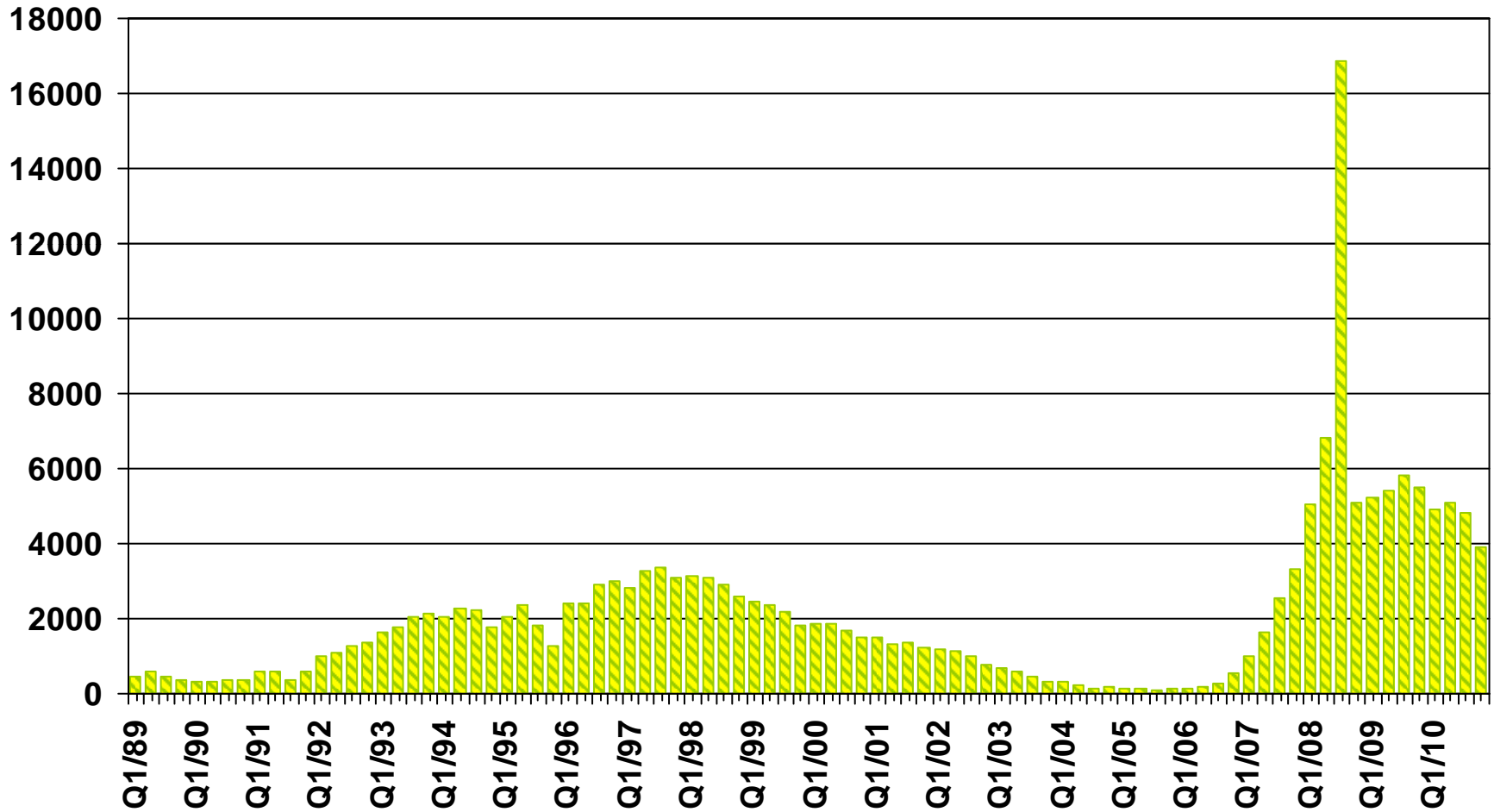
Single-Family Homes – San Bernardino, April 2011: 52.6 Days

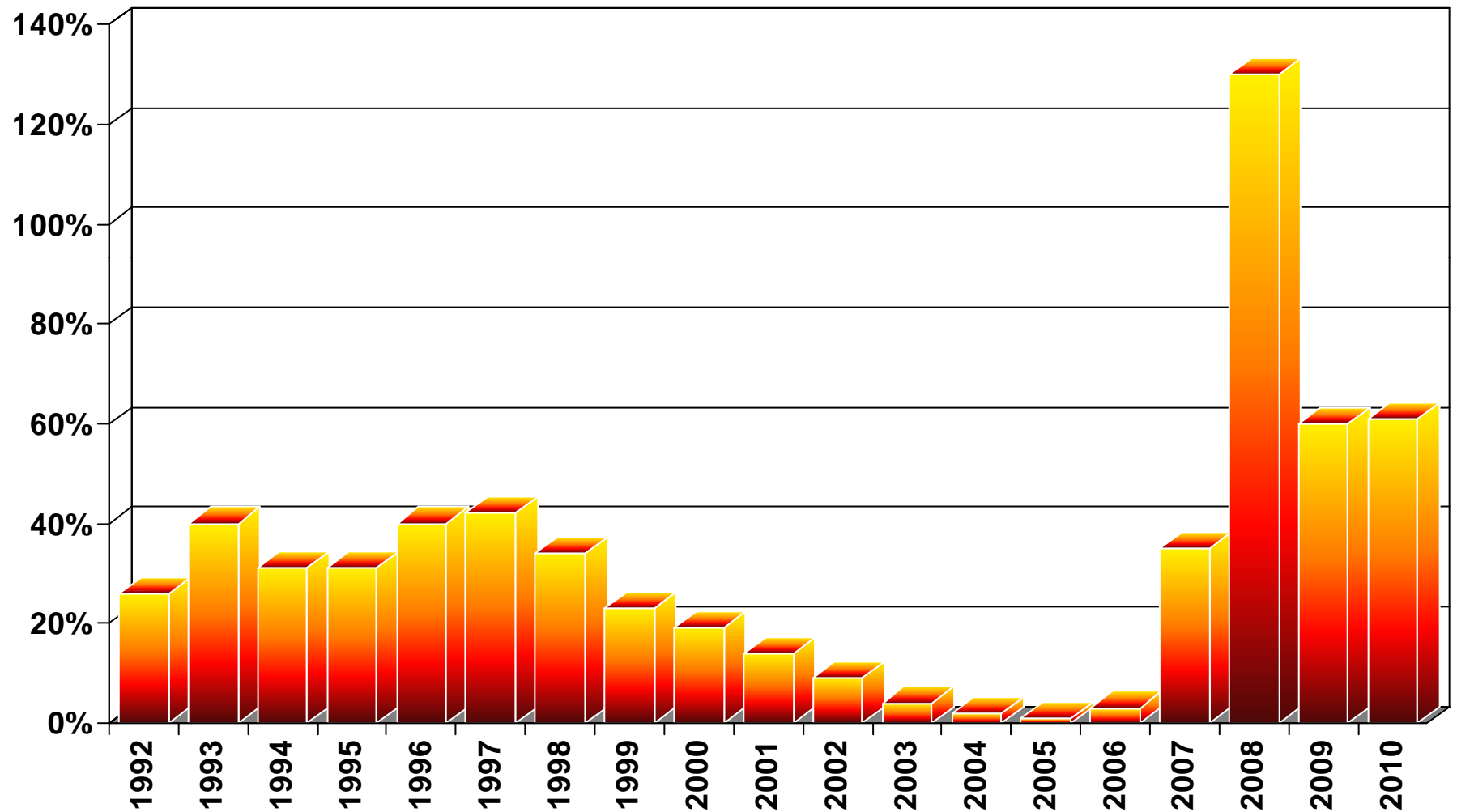

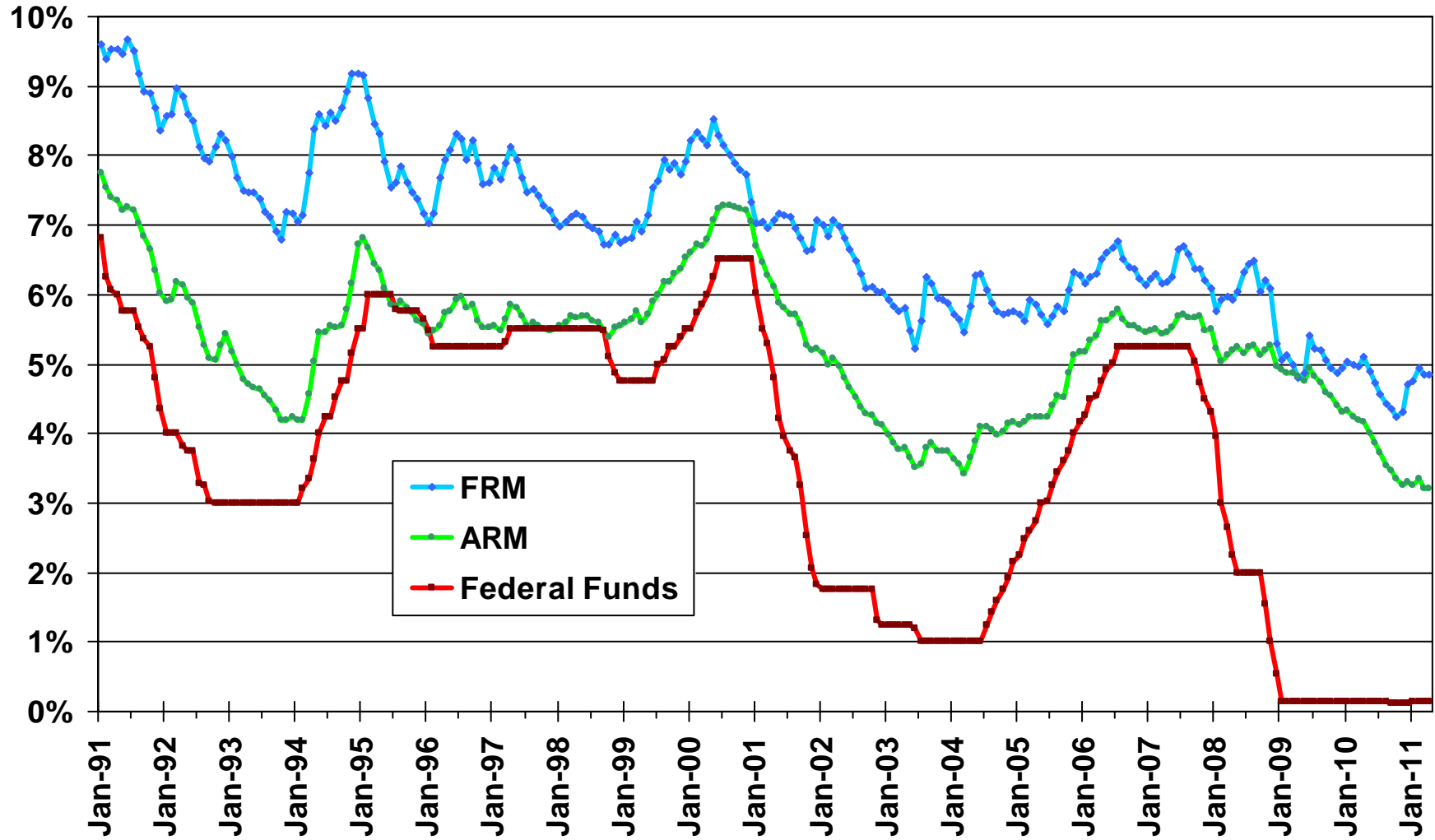
Ratio of Foreclosures to Home Sales

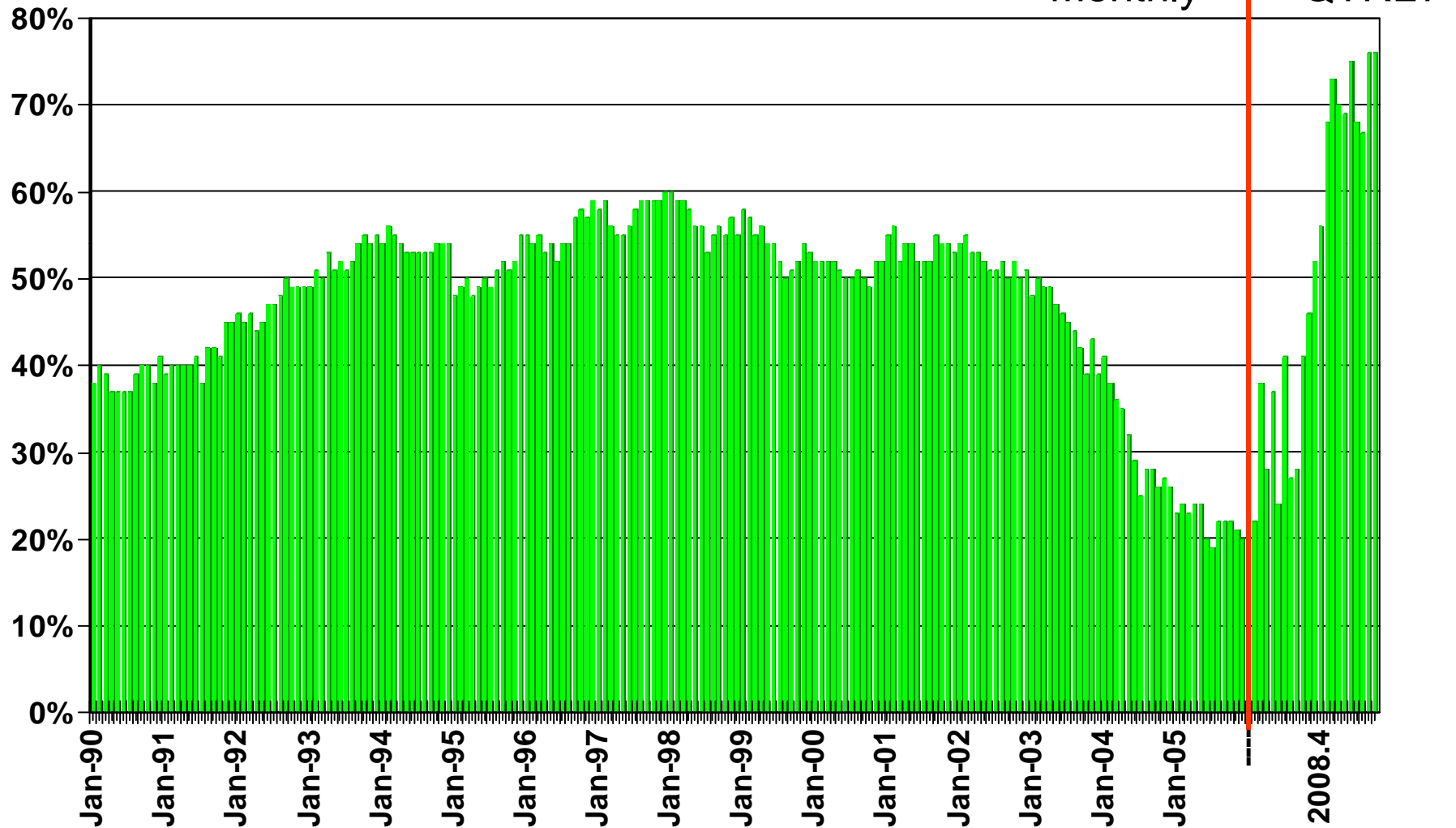

San Bernardino County, 1st Quarter 2011: 76%

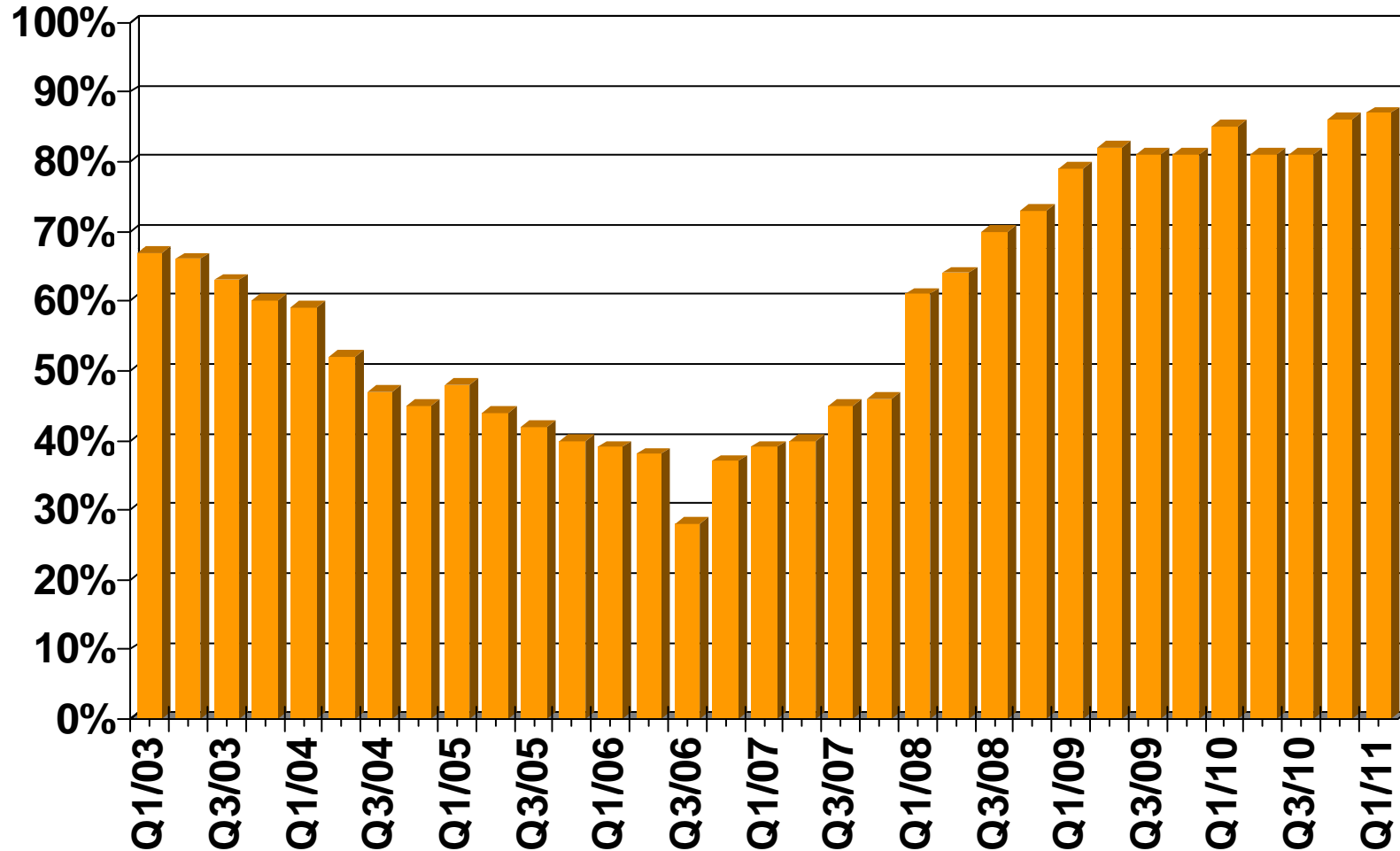
% OF HOUSEHOLDS THAT CAN BUY

San Bernardino County, 1st Quarter 2011: 87%

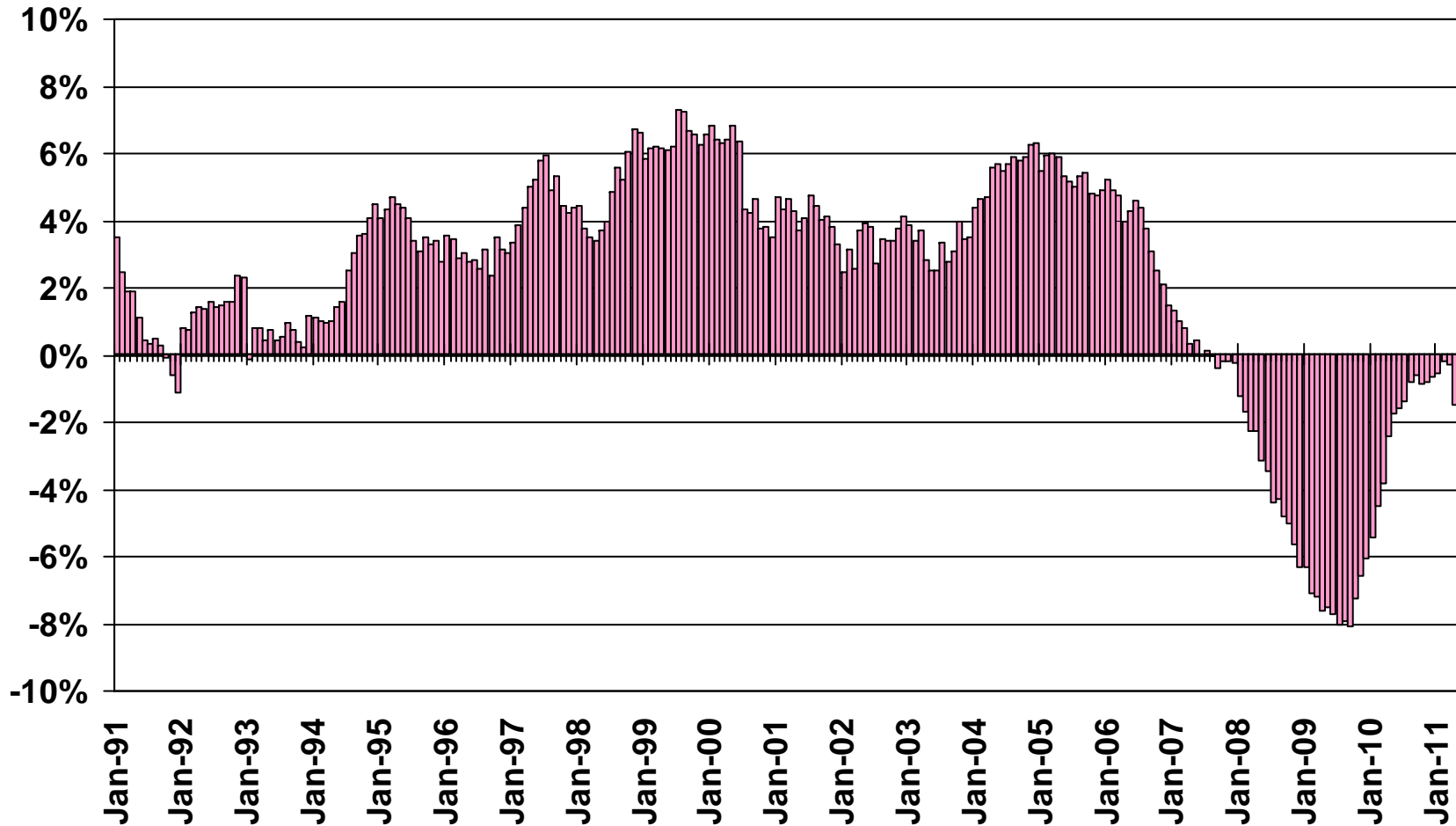

Riverside/San Bernardino Metropolitan Area, April 2011: Down 1.5% YTY

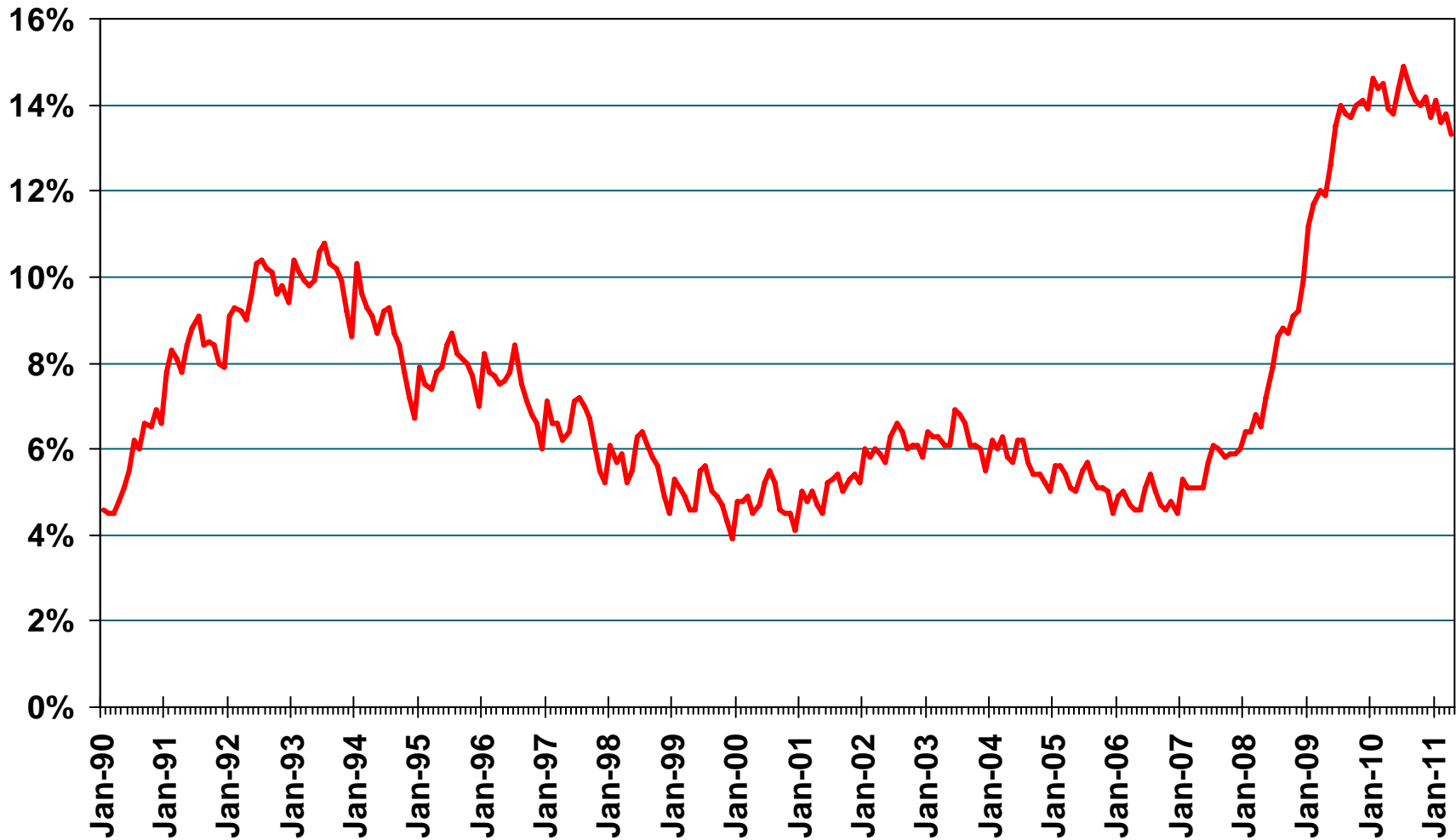
Y-T-Y PERCENT CHANGE

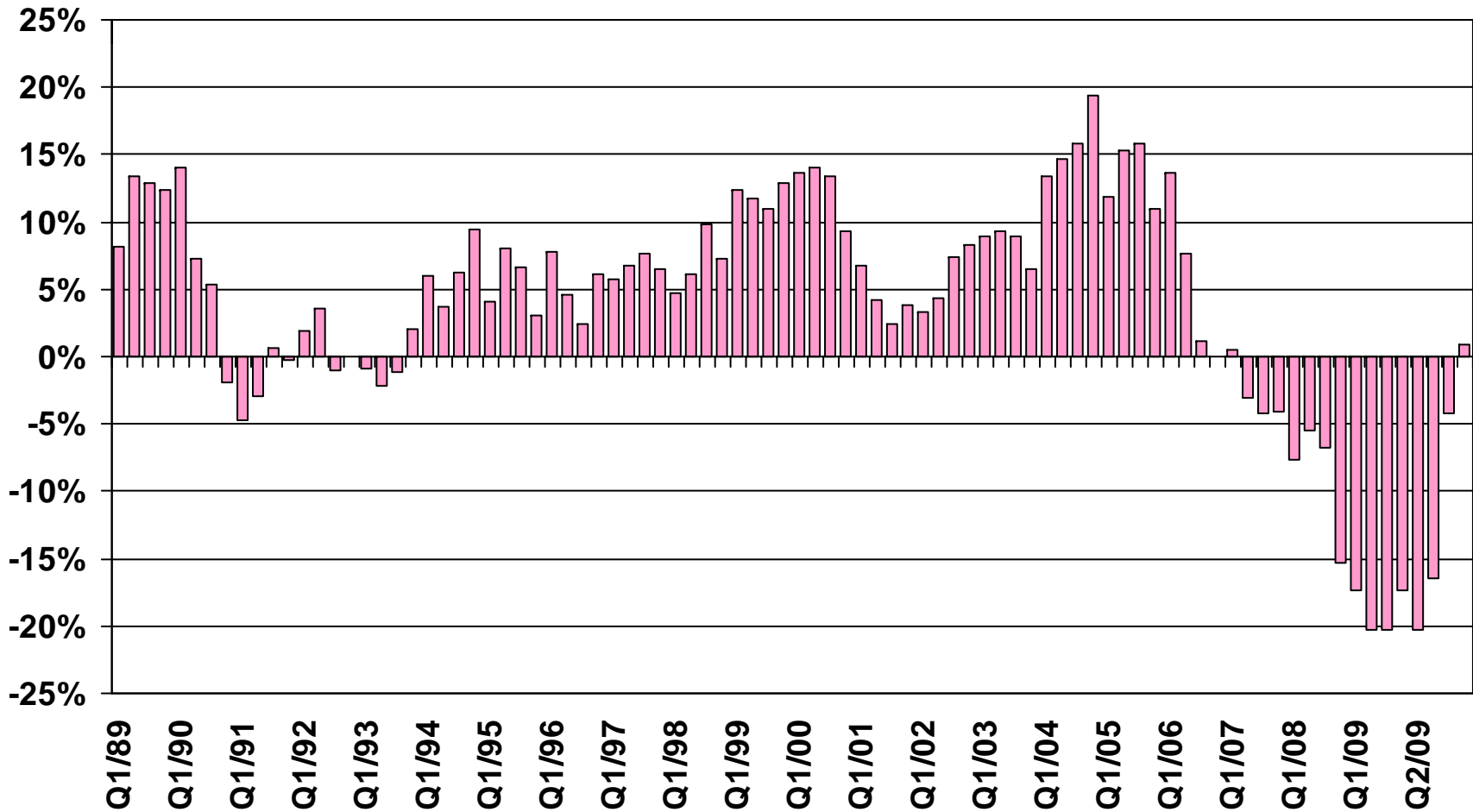

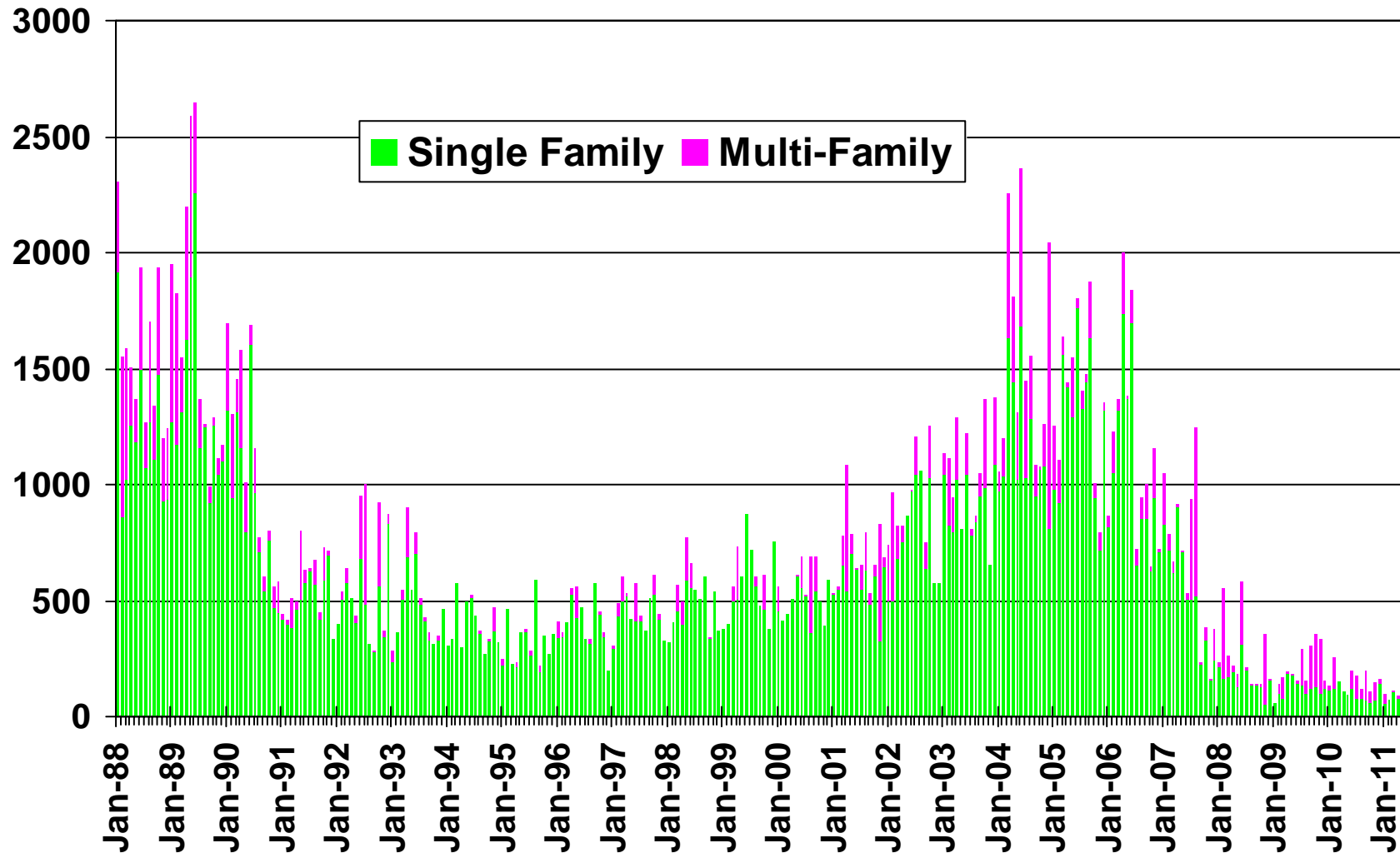
ANNUAL PERCENT CHANGE

New Housing Permits

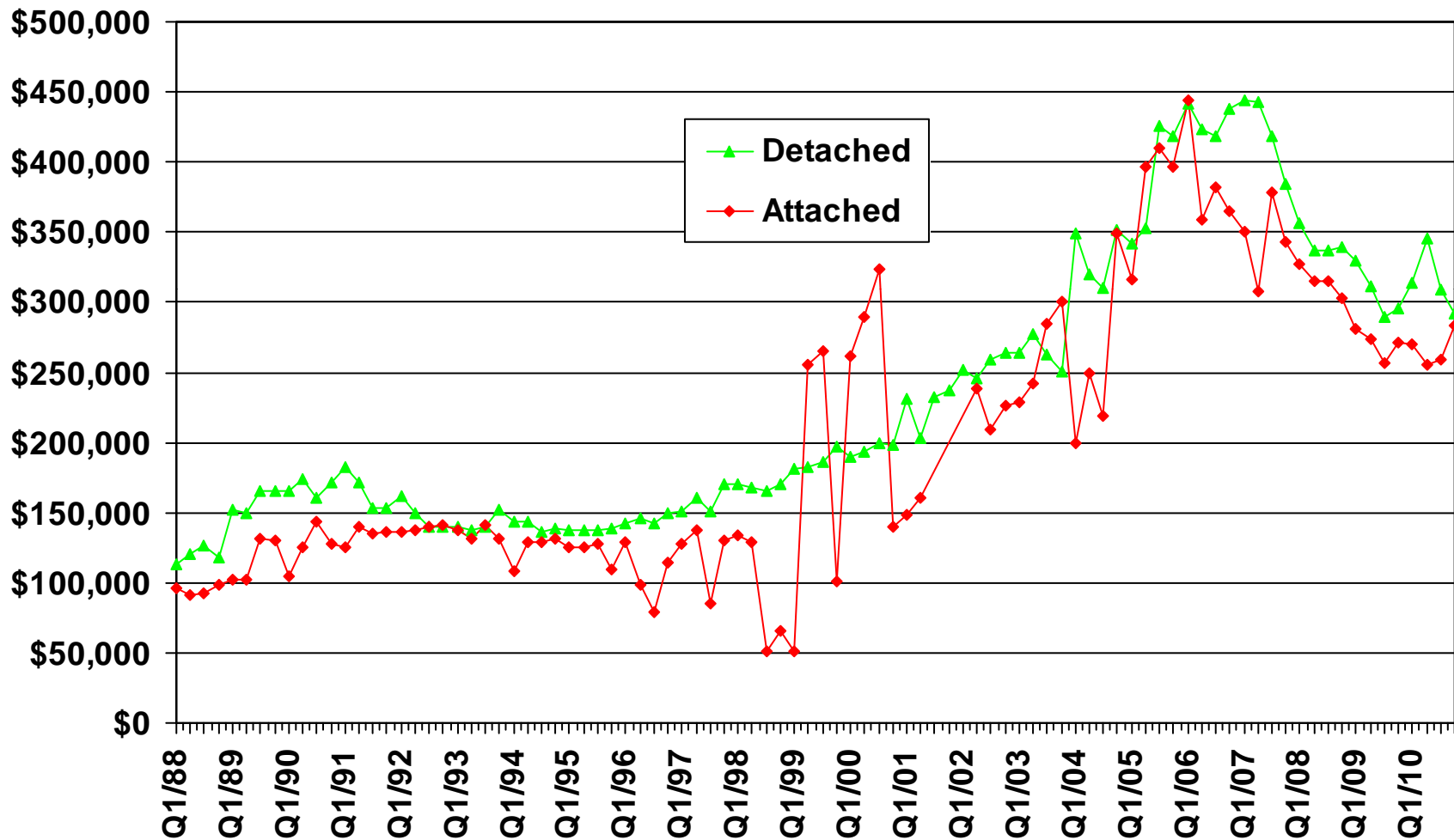
San Bernardino County, April 2011: 92 Units, Down 42.4% YTD

Median Price for New Homes

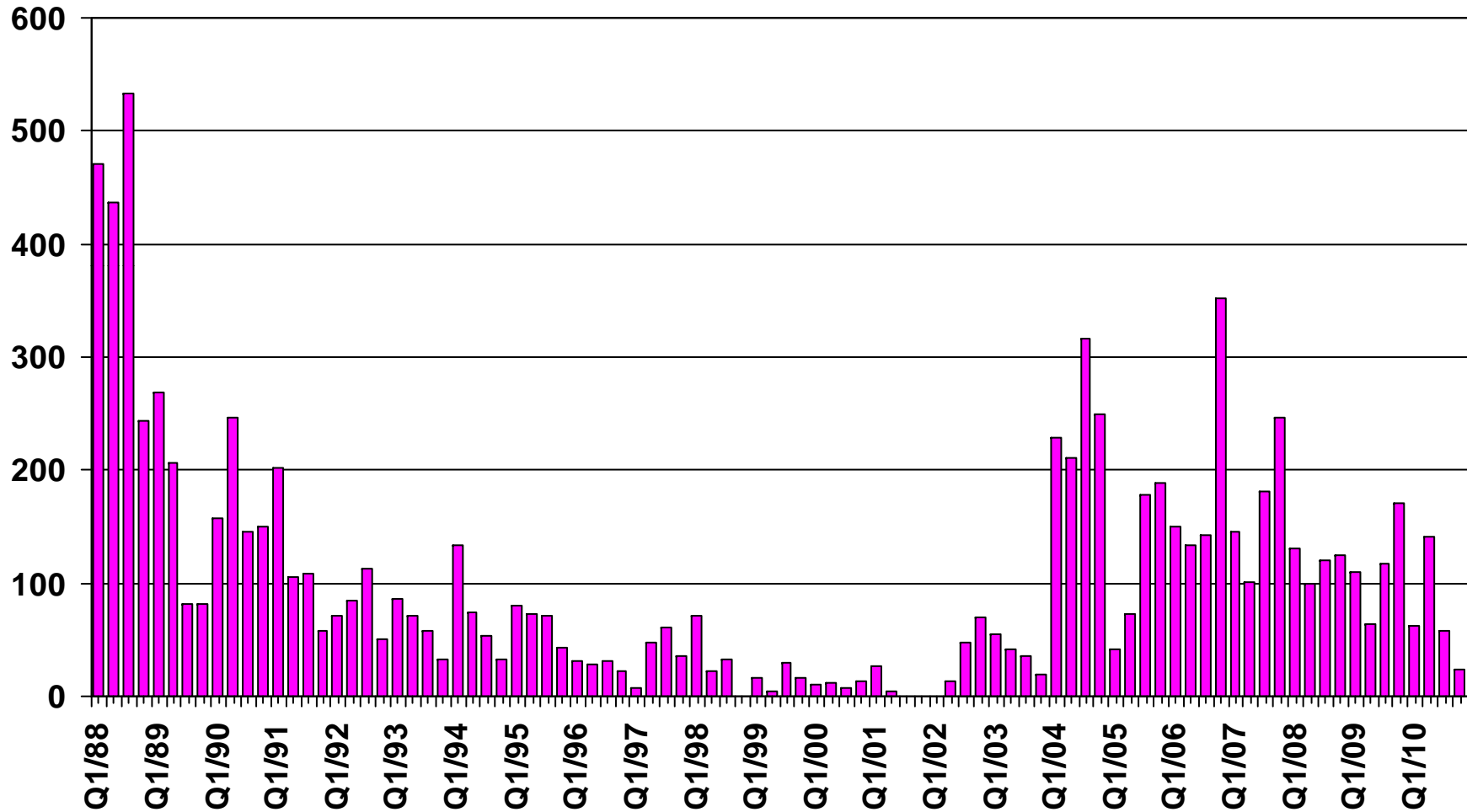

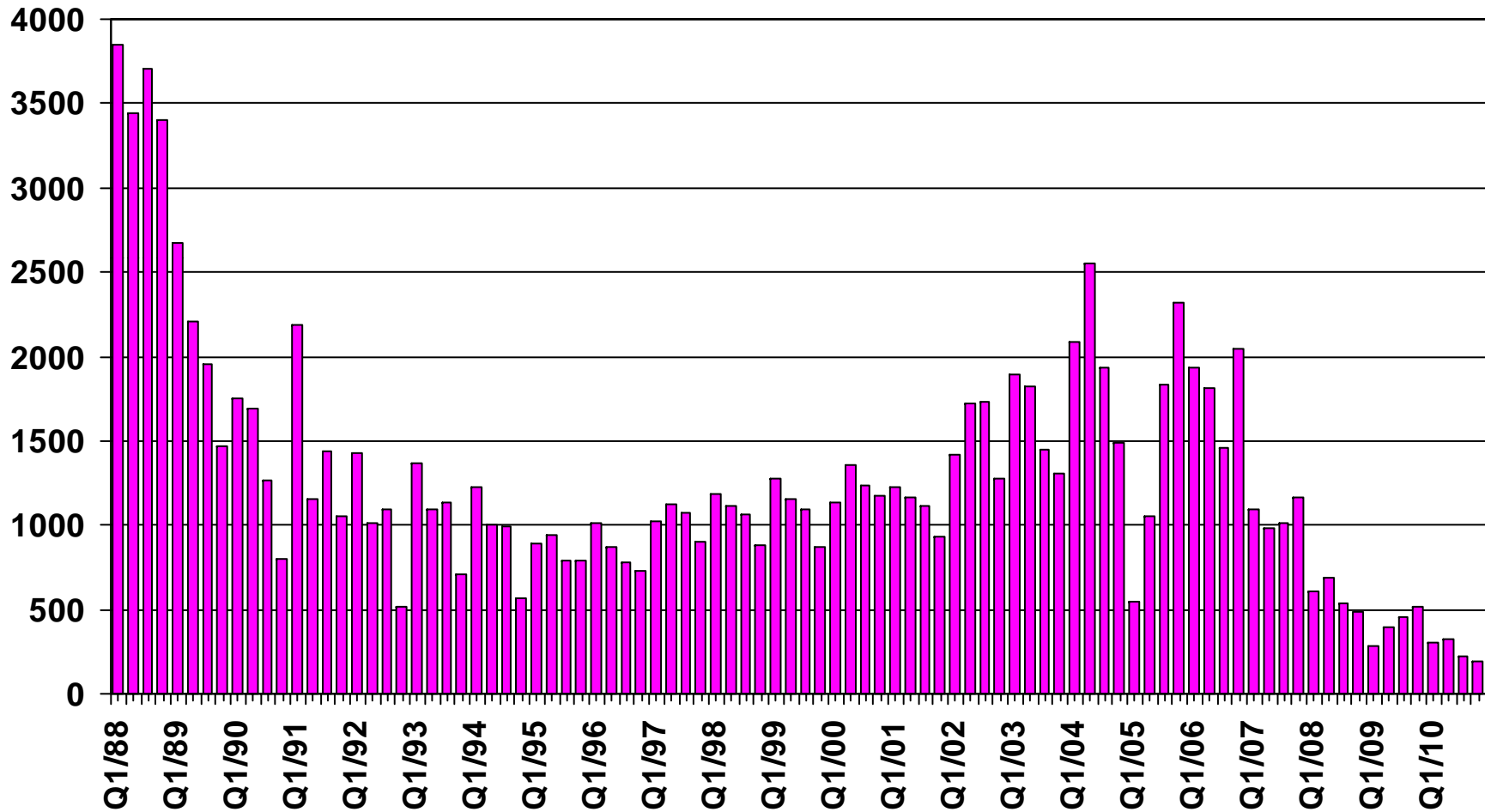
San Bernardino County (Attached), 2010 Q4 Sales: 24Units

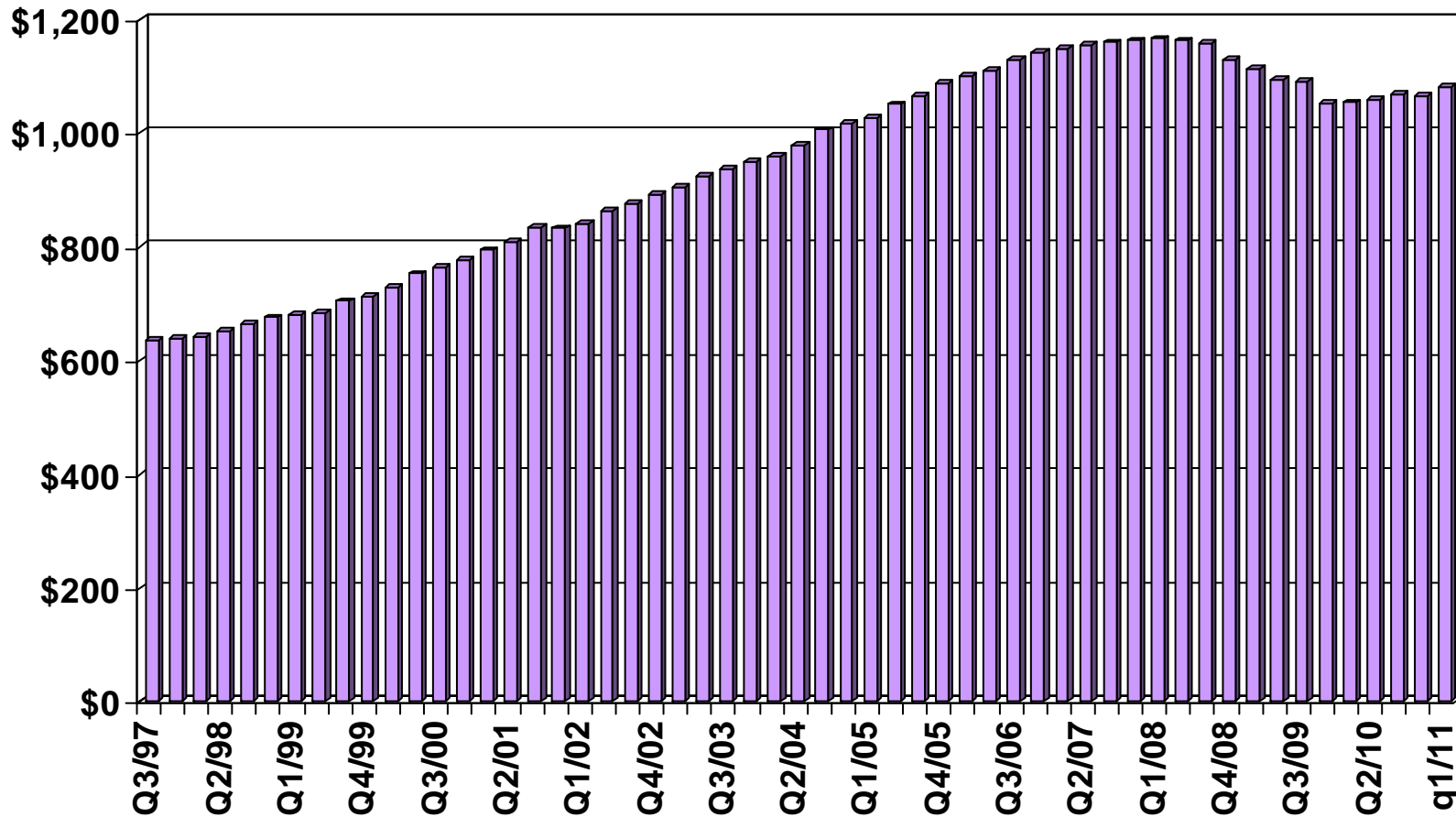
San Bernardino County (Detached), 2010 Q4 Sales: 190 Units

Inland Empire, 2011 Q1: \$1,080 Up 2.6% YTY

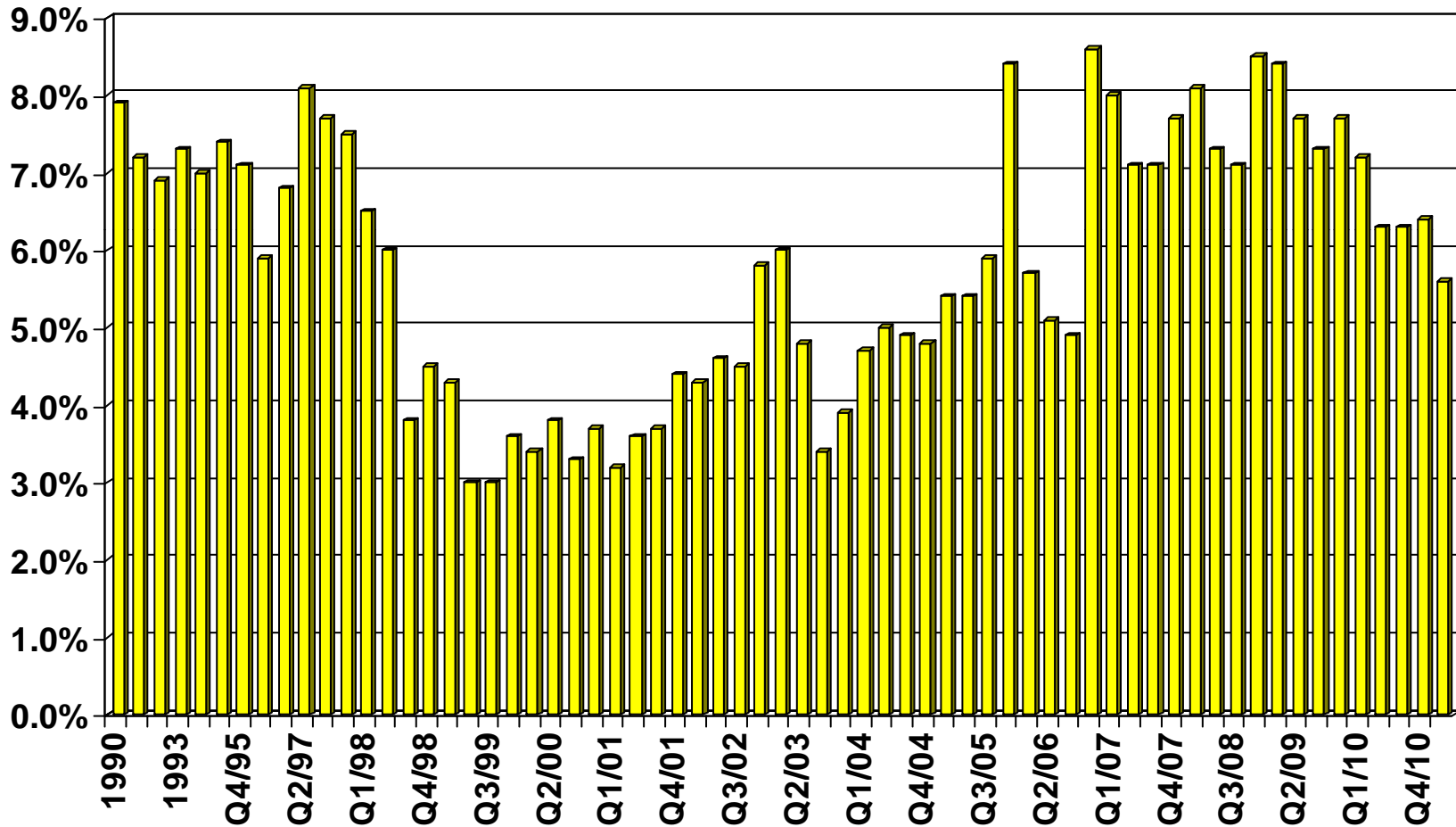

Inland Empire, 2011 Q1: 5.6%

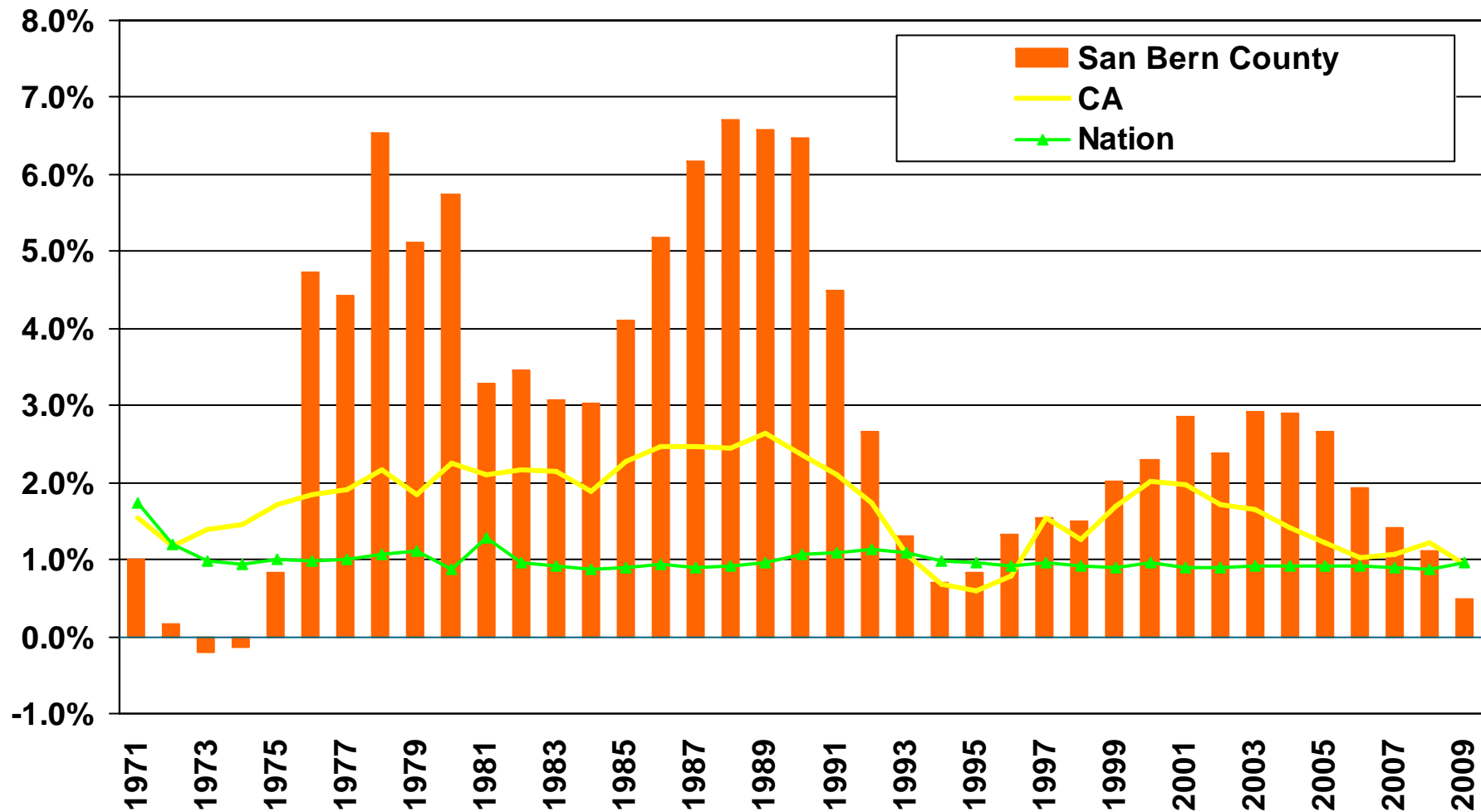

San Bernardino County (1971-2009)

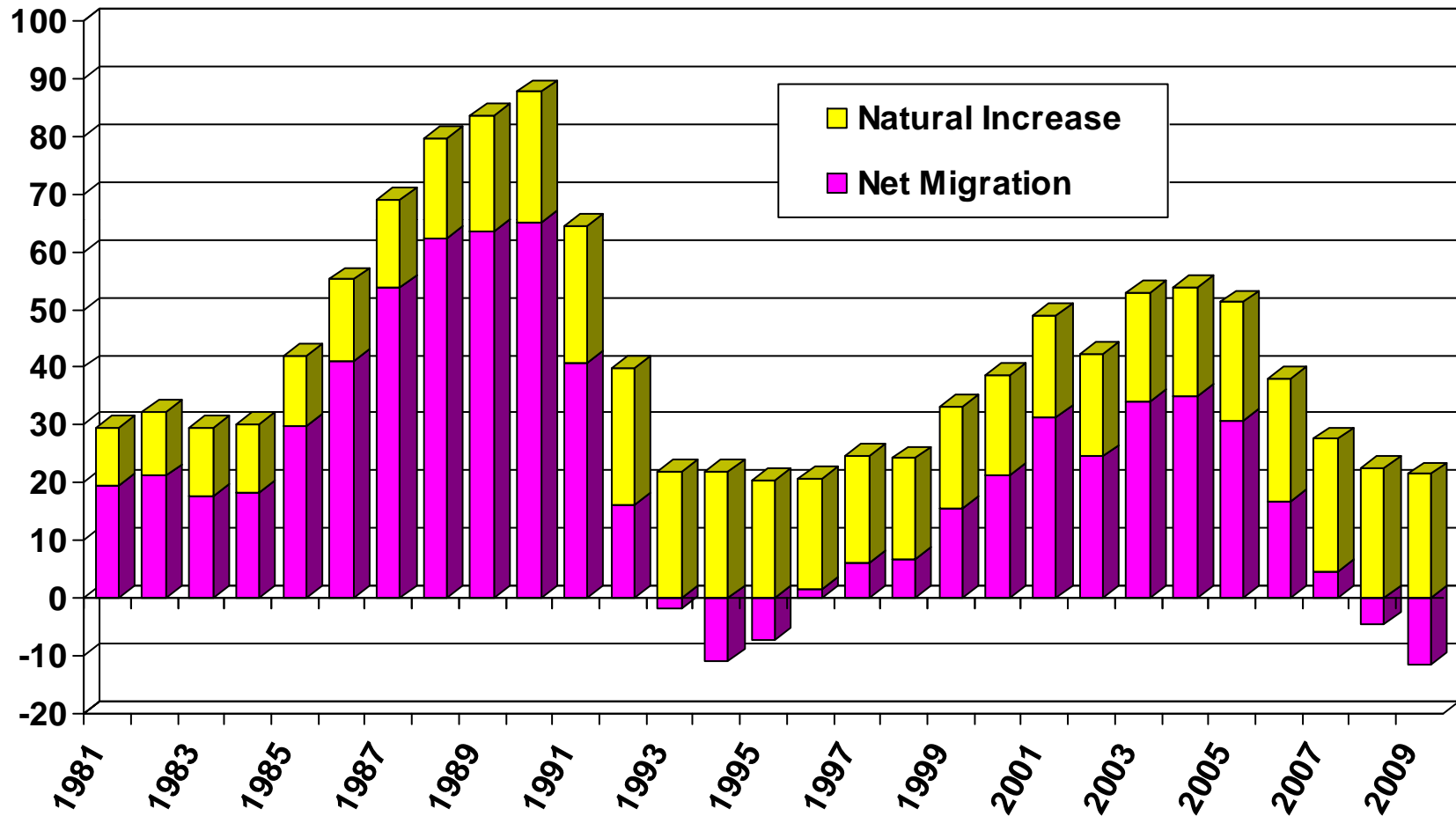

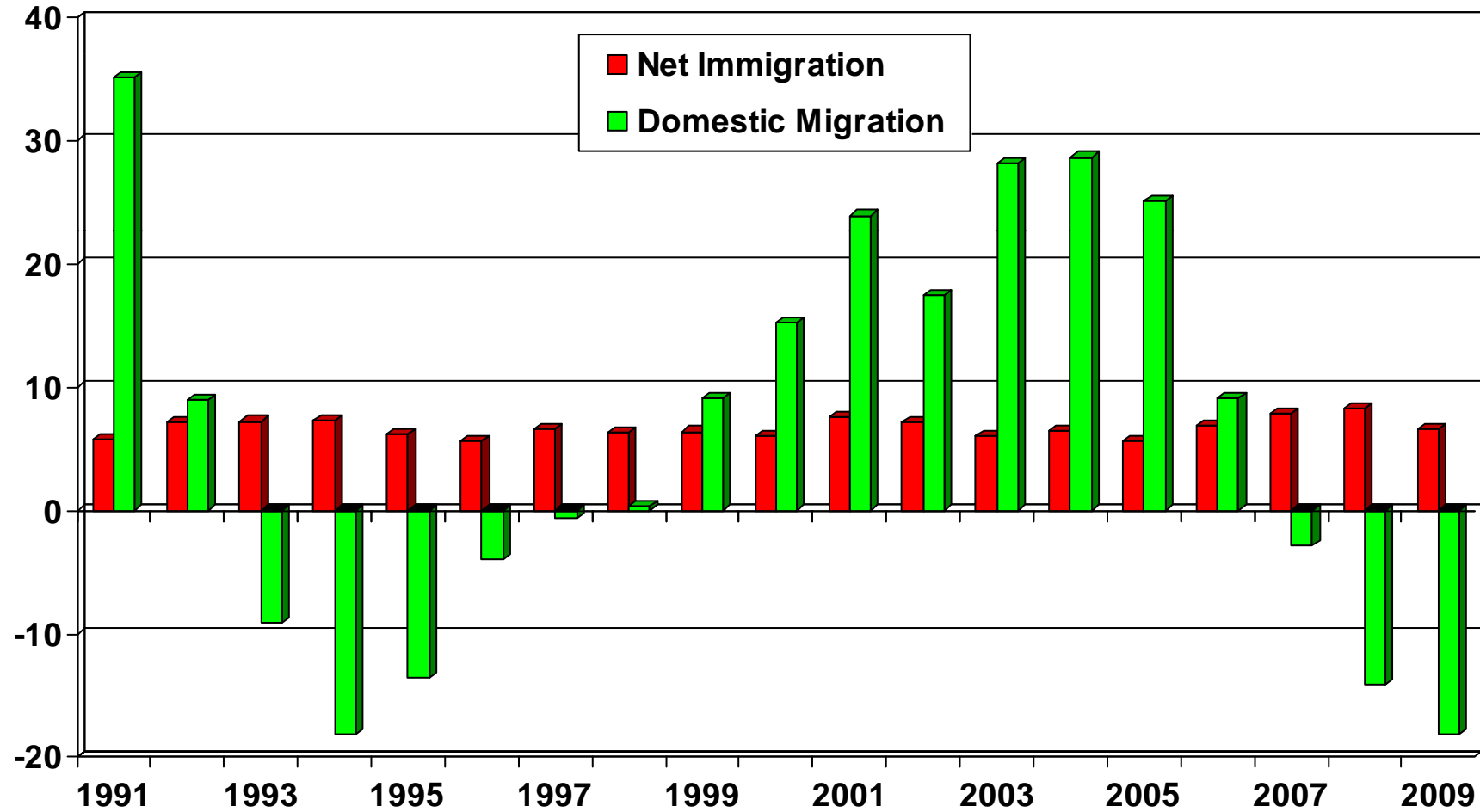

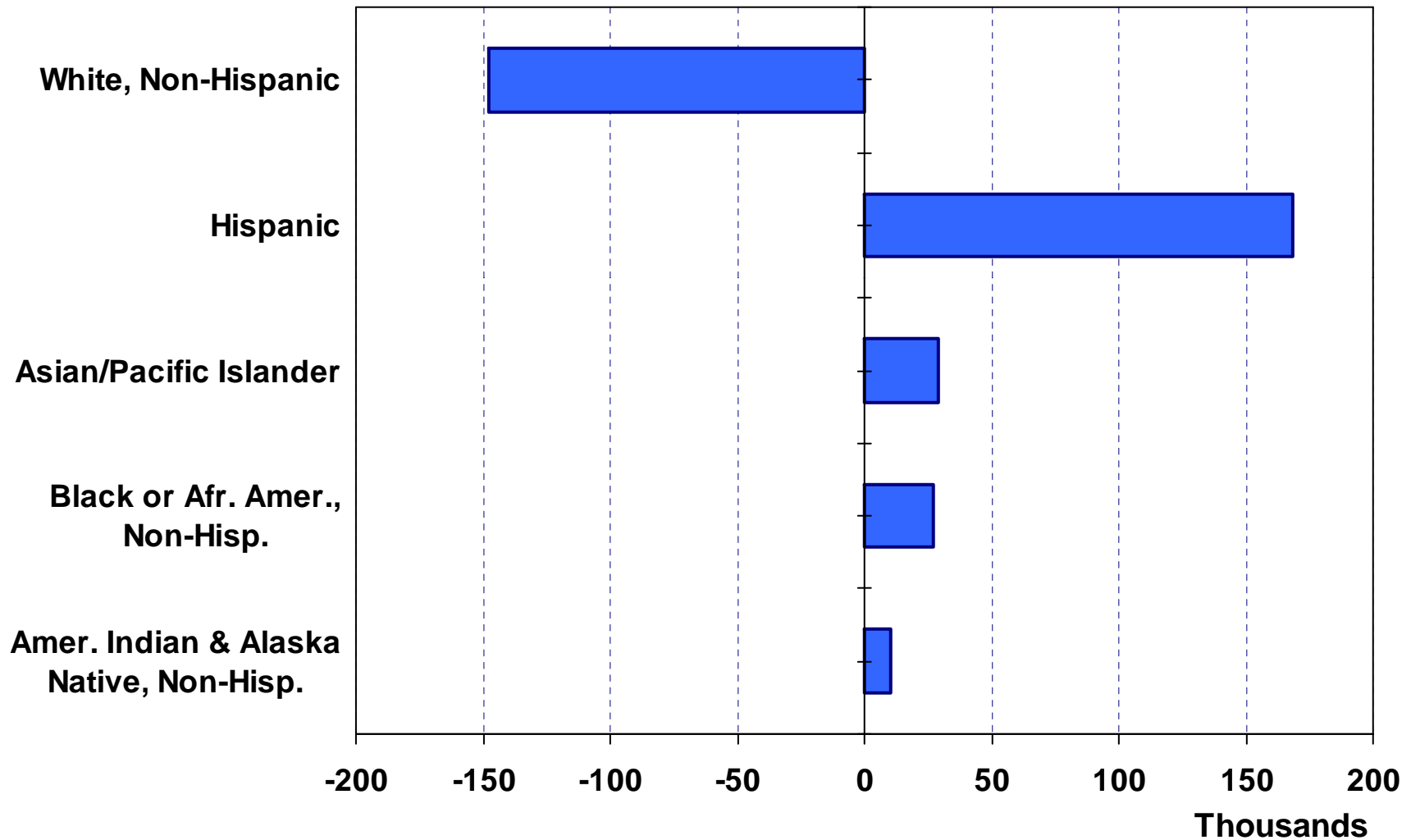

Net Immigration by Ethnic Group

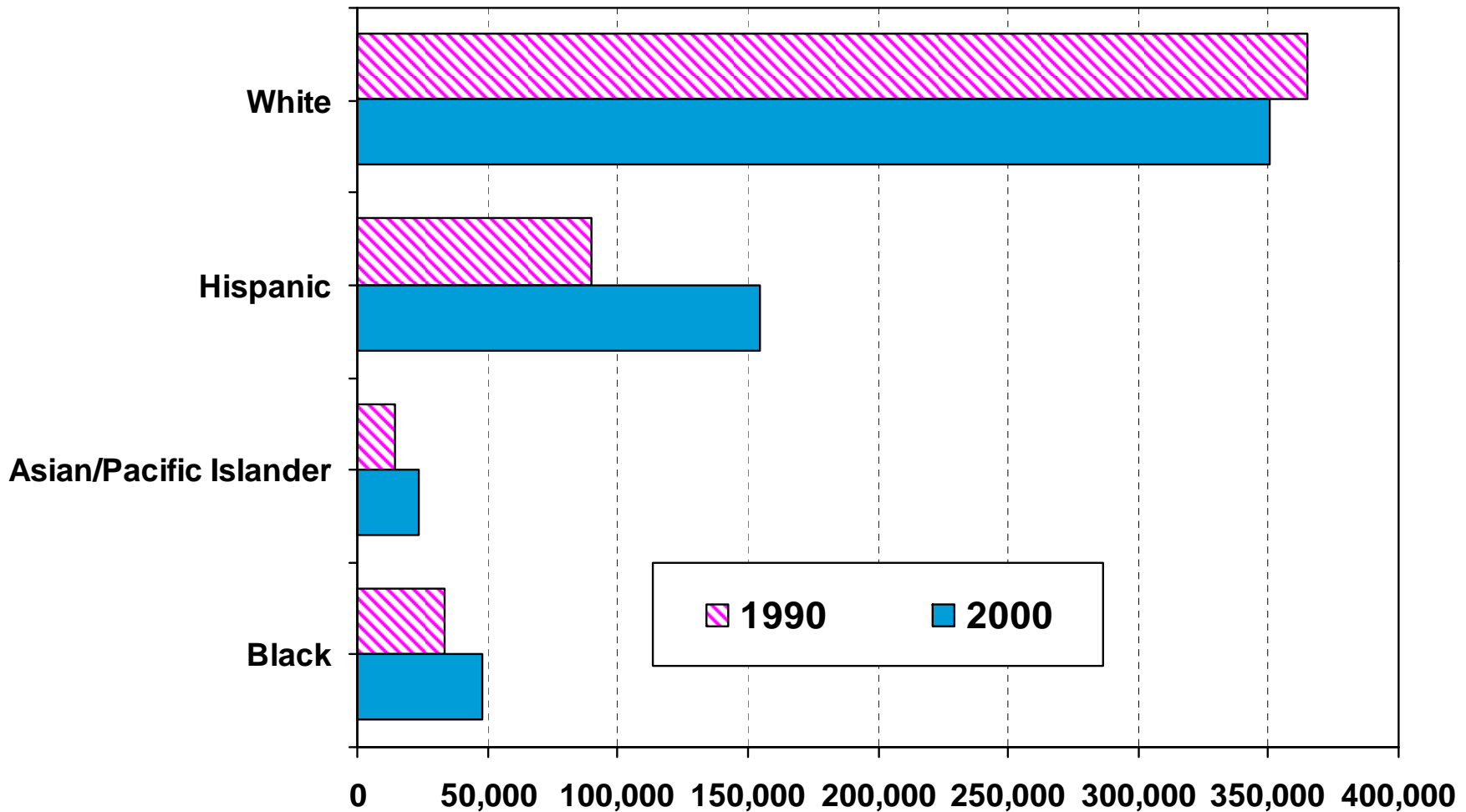
San Bernardino County (1990 Census to 2000 Census)

Number of Households by Ethnicity

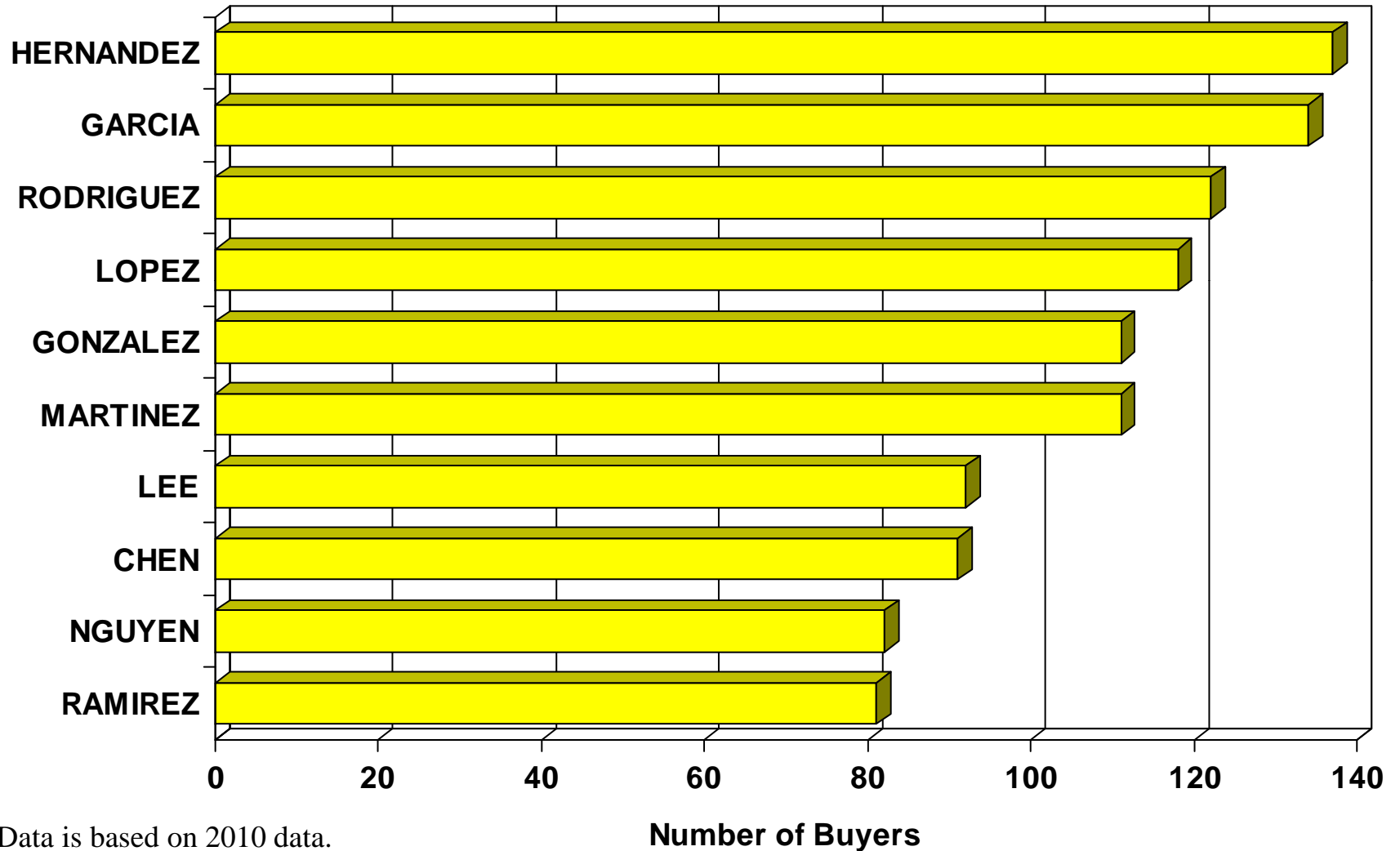
San Bernardino County (1990 Census vs. 2000 Census)

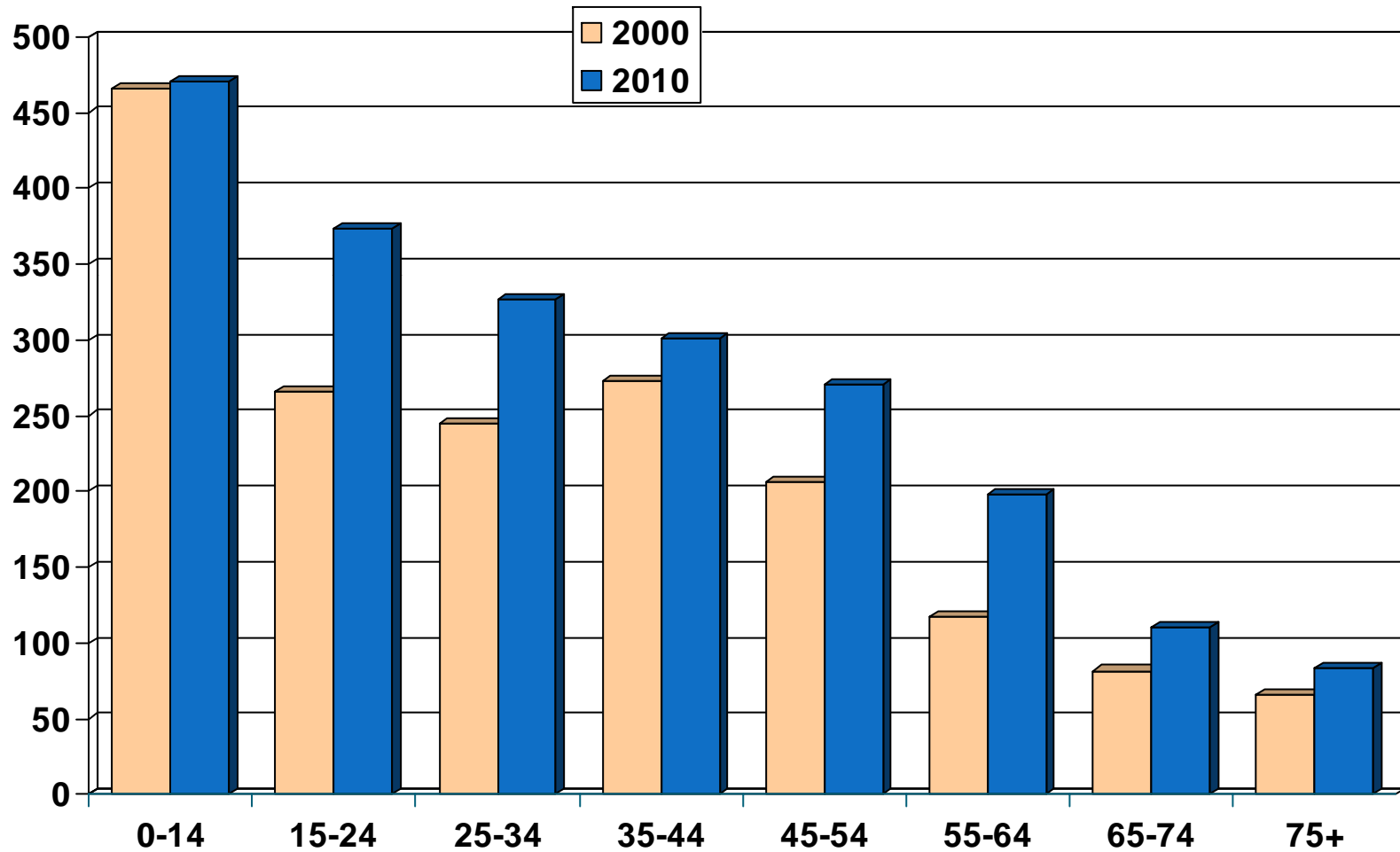

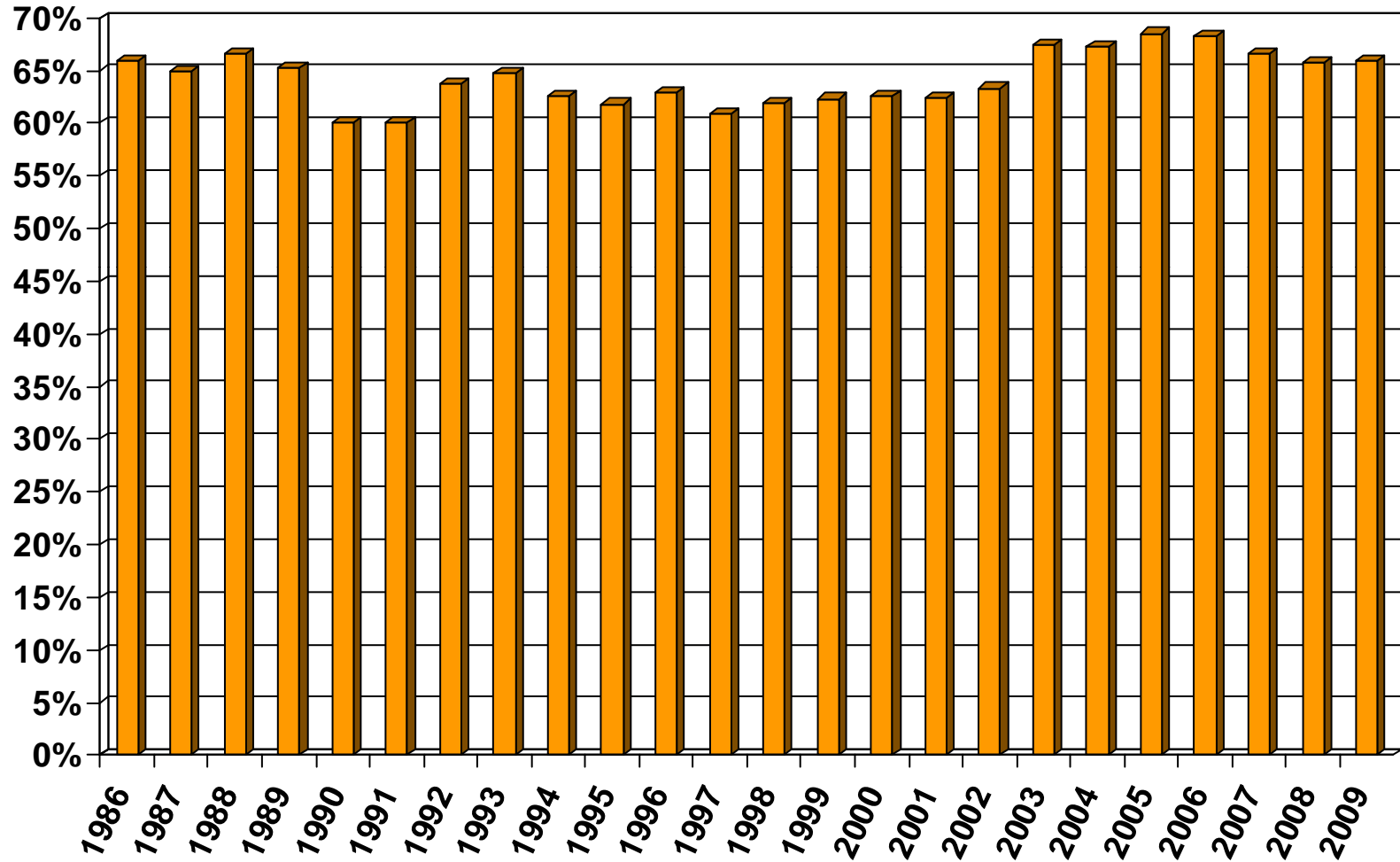

Homeownership Rates

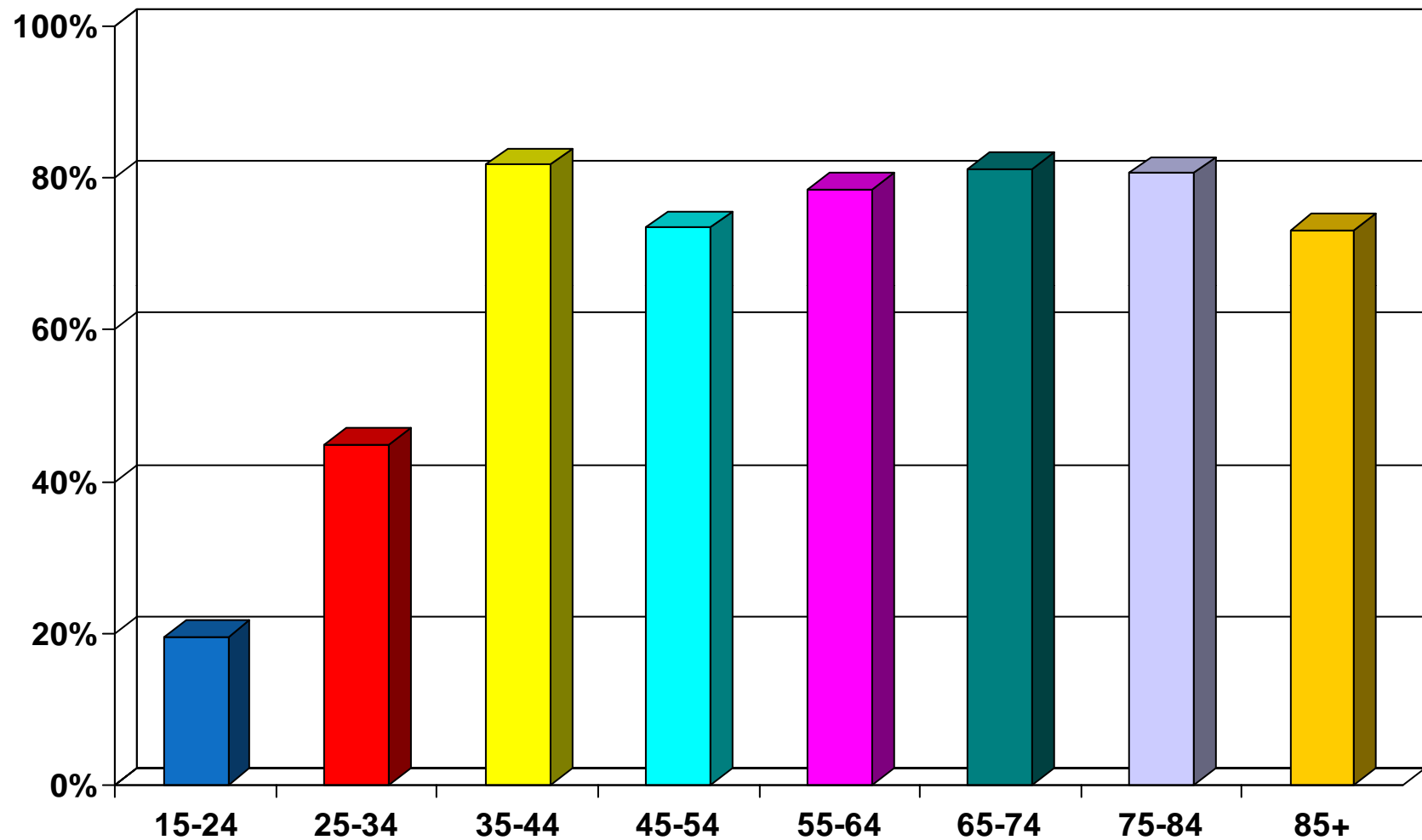
Riverside-San Bernardino Metropolitan Area, 2009: 65.9%
